
#### Whinges!

#### Changes to Expat Voting Rules for Brits on the Cards.

British PM David Cameron has made no secret of the fact that he Her body glistens in the light considers the "expat vote" to be a critical part of his upcoming election campaign. It should therefore come as no surprise that the Conservative government are seeking to make changes to the current voting rules for expats. The changes will enable more British expats than ever before to vote on matters of national importance, and these additional votes could be enough to help swing an election in the Conservatives direction later in the year.

The current rules enable expats living abroad to vote on political matters, though this right is withdrawn when the individual has lived overseas for 15 years or more. Whether or not this is right is up for discussion, though frankly in the past the UK's expat population seem to have received little attention from politicians.

One reason for this is just how few expats actually bother to vote - even when they're allowed to. Less than 30,000 overseas votes are normally received and so this less-motivated group have largely been ignored.

Now, though, Tory MP Geoffrey Clifton-Brown is championing the cause, insisting that "the 15 year rule" is anachronistic and denies many legitimate voters a chance to have their input on how Britain and her territories should be governed.

Experts seem rather cynical over whether the legislation will pass. For one, the proposal is at a very early stage and will require considerable discussion and consultation before being voted into law. For another the government will be dissolved in May in readiness for the upcoming general election and it seems it is unlikely the legislation will be approved by then. It may all be a case of "too little, too late" for overseas voters.

That said, if and when the legislation is approved, it could activate a sizeable army of voters. At present, the size of the expat population missing out on voting is estimated to be around 1 million people. Even just a small proportion of these people voting could help to sway an election. If approved, Mr Clifton-Brown hopes that his initiative will add a minimum of 100,000 additional votes at future elections.

Furthermore, experts suggest that the party who manage to activate these voters should expect a large portion of the resultant votes. Expats who are keen to have their say in British politics but have been excluded in the past thanks to the 15 year rule are encouraged to contact their party of choice and encourage them to support the forthcoming vote.

A study by researchers from the University of Grenoble found that men who preferred spicier foods also tended to have higher testosterone levels than men with milder tastes. In the study, published in the journal Physiology & Behaviour, 114 men from age 18 to 44 were polled on whether or not they liked spicy foods, and were later served a dish of mashed potatoes which they were allowed to season with however much hot sauce and salt they wanted.

The researchers found that men with higher testosterone levels tended to use more hot sauce and indicated a greater preference for it. There was no relationship between testosterone and the amount of salt used. High testosterone levels in men have long been linked to dominant and competitive traits.


It's hard to draw conclusions about the hot sauce-testosterone connection. The link could be biological, if spicy food raises testosterone levels. A 2013 study found that mice exposed to capsaicin, the chemical that makes food hot, had higher testosterone levels than a control group. Or it could be environmental. In cultures that associate spicy foods with masculinity, alpha males might feel pressure to go heavy on hot sauce. Another possible explanation is the condiment's colour: A 2013 study found that men who preferred red, the colour of the sauce used in this study, tended to have higher testosterone than those who liked blue. Mind you, who would eat a blue sauce anyway? Surely it would look foul.

There have been many occasions when the Spanish police forces have shown remarkable diligence and professionalism and their commitment to catching the bad guys is often admirable.

In May 2008, a young British girl arrived in Magaluf, Majorca and started working in a local bar. She could not supply the police with any concrete details on her rapist other than he was dark skinned and had short curly hair.

Two years later in 2010 another British girl was raped in Magaluf. This led the investigators to look for a multiple rapist who used considerable violence on his victims.

The Guardia Civil named the investigation 'Angila' (Eel) as the suspect was so elusive and slippery. They knew the suspect lived between the Canary Islands and Mallorca, that he worked in a bar, and could be

North African or Pakistani.

Specialists in Madrid organised an identikit sketch, and this eventually led to the location of a suspect named Mohamed. Police kept a discreet watch and in the early hours of one day in 2011, they noticed that the suspect threw his cigarette end into the street in Punta Ballena, Magaluf. Using DNA from the cigarette butt they made a match with the sample



taken in 2008 and the rapist was quickly arrested.

Mohamed Fadel E.A. (Photo) was given a 23 year prison sentence for raping and trying to kill Cheryl Marie Maddison, and now for the second case regarding the 2010 rape, the prosecutor has asked for another 12 years in prison. Let's hope his lengthy incarceration will be an interesting one.

#### Men Really Are More Stupid than Women!

"There are anecdotal data supporting MIT, but to date there has been no systematic analysis of sex differences in idiotic risk taking behaviour." He said an honourable mention must go to the man who slipped when using a belt sander as an auto erotic device and lost a testicle. But Dr Lendrem said: "Despite these limitations there can be little doubt Darwin Award winners seem to make little or no real assessment of the risk or attempt at risk management.

#### **Spanish Taxation - Important Changes.**

This year will see a tremendous wave of changes to Spanish law - civil and criminal and of course also to taxation. I outline some of the latest changes to the latter below.

#### Inheritance/Succession & Gift Tax.

Although long overdue, the authorities have finally succumbed to pressure from the EU and have withdrawn the penal tax rate on inheritances imposed on non resident beneficiaries.

Non tax residents are now entitled to apply for the inheritance tax applicable to the Autonomous Community where the greatest value of the Spanish assets in relation to the inheritance are located. Previously the more severe national rates applied but now non tax resident inheritors (who are resident in another EU country) will be treated the same as tax resident ones for inheritance tax calculation.

This change dramatically reduces the inheritance and gift tax bills when one of the parties is not tax resident in Spain.

The appeal process against the discriminatory taxation commenced in 2010. Any non resident who paid inheritance or gift tax in Spain since then, can now claim a rebate for the overpayment. This will be substantial in some cases. Do not expect the tax authorities to remind you to claim!

#### Income Tax.

With a general election looming at the end of this year, the government have introduced a number of income tax reforms. Although all taxpayers will pay slightly less, those on low/medium incomes with large families will benefit the most.

The tax exempt threshold has been reduced from 17,700 to  $\Huge{12,450}$  and the first tax band rate has been reduced from 24.75% to 20%. The top tax rate is now 47% compared to 52% last year, although the income threshold for this rate has dropped from  $\Huge{300,000}$  to  $\Huge{60,000}$ .

The savings income tax rates and thresholds are also a little lower. The rates are now 20% for income up to 6,000, then 22% on income up to 50,000 and 24% after that.

#### **Capital Gains Tax**

All capital gains are now taxed at the savings tax rates, even those arising on assets held for less than a year. If you acquired assets before December 31, 1994, the time apportioned C.G. Tax relief has been removed from Jan' 2015. However, each taxpayer is now entitled to a cumulative lifetime allowance of €400,000 to apply to the sales proceeds of pre-December 1994 assets.

#### Wealth Tax.

Although the wealth tax was reinstate in 2011 for just a two-year period, it still remains in place for 2015. It is unlikely to effect you unless you are wealthy.

#### Exit Tax.

This is a new tax introduced this January. This effects former tax residents whose wealth in certain institutions is in excess of €1,000,000 and who have lost their Spanish tax resident status.

Several of the new laws have caused great controversially, in particular the Law of Citizen Safety. This has now popularly been called 'The Gagging Law.' While some of its proposals are long overdue - such as keeping GreenPeace out of nuclear stations etc., certain aspects of it appear to be draconian. For example, it is now a crime to occupy any business, home, or any building, or holding a sit-in in such a place, against the wish of the owner. This will include sit-ins in banks to protest unfair evictions etc. This can now carry a fine of 600. Those who campaign against unfair evictions, fraudulent selling of financial products and such like will be hit by this.

Taking unauthorised photos of the police or armed forces can now land you in a lot of trouble and a fine of up to 30,000 in serious cases. There are many new civil and criminal laws pending. I thought it unusual to find that at under the old law, it is not a crime to have sex with an animal. If you were charged, it would be for cruelty to the animal and not say 'humping' a donkey. More next month.

#### Chocolate Component Reverses Memory Loss in Older People, Claims Study.

Columbia University research indicates high-flavanol cocoa rejuvenates specific brain activity through increased blood flow. Flavanols are found naturally in cocoa, tea and a variety of fruit and vegetables, but most methods of processing cocoa reduce levels. Late night cocoa has never looked so appealing. A component of chocolate has been found to reverse age-related memory loss in healthy adults aged 50-69. The rejuvenating effect can be traced to increased blood flow in a specific region of the brain, say the researchers.

This is the first direct link that age-related forgetfulness is caused by changes in a specific part of the brain. It is also the first piece of evidence that memory decline can be reversed by a change in diet.

A specially prepared cocoa drink was fed to a sample of 37 older adults daily for three months. For some, the drink contained a large quantity of flavanols, which are found naturally in cocoa, tea and a wide variety of fruits and vegetables. For the others, the drink was largely free of the compound.

"If a participant had the memory of a typical 60-year-old at the beginning of the study, after three months that person on average had the memory of a typical 30- or 40-year old," said Scott A Small, a professor of neurology and director of the Alzheimer's Disease Research Center at the Taub Institute at Columbia University Medical Centre.

Small is the lead author on the work, which was published online in Nature Neuroscience.

The results have been greeted with cautious optimism. "It would be very exciting if such a cognitive benefit of flavanols were shown in a larger study," said Liz Coulthard, consultant senior lecturer in dementia neurology, University of Bristol.


Unfortunately guarding your memory is not as easy as remembering to eat more chocolate. Most methods of processing cocoa remove the flavanols. A typical chocolate bar contains about 40mg. The special drink used in the trial contained 900mg.

The drinks were prepared by chocolate manufacturer Mars Incorporated, who also partly funded the study. The Mars flavanol research programme began in the late 1980's to investigate the possible benefits to cardiovascular and cognitive health offered by the compounds. Source : The Guardian.

#### Lidl Expanding.

Lidl is to install its largest logistical centre in Europe in Alcala de Henares (Madrid). The new platform will become online in the summer of 2016 and supposes an investment of 70 million €, with the creation of 100 jobs, according to the company. The project, which the supermarket company signed three years ago, will be located next to the M-300 previously occupied by the old Electrolux which closed in 2011 with the loss of 400 jobs.

People who have lost their jobs at Zanussi will be given priority, as was agreed three years ago. Lidl has a total of 530 stores in Spain, and in Europe the chain has about 10,000, located in 26 different countries and with a total workforce of 335,000.



A Spanish policeman, well-known for his one-man protests in Barcelona, has been viciously attacked by three lions after jumping into their enclosure at the city's zoo.



On September 11th he burnt an estelada -- an unofficial flag flown by Catalan secessionists — in front of a public monument and on November 4th he tried to enter the regional government headquarters with a sign about officials

#### **Thousands of Spanish Traditional Businesses** Facing Closure as Boyer Rent Law Ends.

The face of many Spanish cities could change drastically from this month when close to a quarter of a million stores, bars and restaurants will face closure after their rent increases by more than 1,000%, says UPTA, which represents the country's self-employed workers and professionals.

The latest blow to a sector already struggling with a five-yearlong crisis that has seen sales fall steadily, as well as tougher competition from chains and online stores, came on December 31, 2014, when the so-called Boyer law ends. Dating from 1994, the legislation exempted establishments with lease agreements prior to 1985 from rent increases; once gone, owners will be free to impose new terms.

In Madrid, around 38,500 establishments are under threat. The result, believes Gerardo Pérez, one of the four founders of leading Madrid small jazz venue Café Central, will be multinational franchises moving in to take over inner city premises. "Our cities are losing their identity; soon it won't make any difference if you're in Paris, Berlin, or Madrid. They will all be the same: filled with big name food and clothes stores," he says.

Almudena Zarco, the granddaughter of the founder of the 110-year-old Bisutería Otero, one of Madrid's oldest surviving jewellers, agrees: "This is very sad, and not just for me. Madrid will lose out, because the tourists will stop coming if we lose the character of our city.

The rent hike will also mean the loss of more jobs. "My eight employees are part of my family," says Pepa Eznarriaga, who, along with her three brothers, runs the Así doll and soft-toys shop on Madrid's Gran Vía. Once home to cafés and the city's big movie theatres, Gran Vía has in recent years been taken over by fashion stores such as H&M and Zara.

Zarco agrees: "Even the most recent [staff members] joined five years ago. They all have proper contracts, not like the people who will work in the stores that come after us: souvenir shops, fast food restaurants or pawnbrokers. That's not creating jobs.'

The majority of store owners understand that the owners of the properties they lease want to make as much money as they can and that the rents they pay are way below market price. But they think the Madrid regional government and City Hall should have taken a case-by-case approach. Eznarriaga, for example, points out that his is a family business, but his contract is in the name of a company: "If I had signed it in my name, then we wouldn't have to renegotiate until I retired or died," he says.

A stroll around the centre of Madrid shows the impact of the coming law change, with a growing number of establishments closing down. Hernando, on number 71 Gran Vía, has been The Israeli General replied. García, who has worked in the store for more than seven decades.

Others, such as the Rústica interior design store, have already moved on – in its case from Calle San Bernardino, a narrow street running from the back of Plaza España. "The saddest part of the whole thing was seeing the desk where I have worked for the last years being moved," says store owner Catherine Tual.

#### Spanish Banks Still 'Doing the Dirty.'

We are all aware of the banking practice of many Spanish financial institutions is often far from ethical. Their poor record in relation to maintaining the rights of the individual is abysmal with abuses being recorded regarding everything from the selling of financial products to widespread abusive mortgage clauses. Fortunately there is one outstanding consumer protection association in Spain who is regularly jumping on the big banks and utility companies, bringing them to task.

The Spanish consumer association, FACUA, has reported 10 banks for charging fees on accounts used exclusively to pay mortgages or loans.

The Banks specifically named by FACUA for such 'abuses' are Santander; BBVA; La Caixa; Bankia; Banco Popular; Bankinter; Banco Mare Nostrum (BMN), Liberbank; Caixa Ontinyent and NGC Banco (Abanca). Complaints have been sent to the Bank of Spain (Banco de España), the Spanish Agency for Consumer Food Safety and Nutrition (Aecosan, according to its initials in Spanish) and the regional consumer protection authorities.

Banks are charging fees that are not justified in any service expressly requested or accepted by their clients, in accounts whose only transaction is the monthly transfer for the repayment of their loan.

FACUA has processed numerous complaints from those affected by such charges being made. Banks typically reimburse fees acknowledging their illegality, although sometimes they charge them again a few months later, knowing full well that the efforts involved in submitting a complaint is just too discouraging to many of those affected.

Law 10/2014, of June 26, on the management, supervision and solvency of credit institutions establishes in Article 5 that "commissions or expenses can only be applied on services specifically requested or subscribed by the customer and only if they correspond to services actually rendered, or incurred expenses that may be debited".

In its complaint, FACUA warns that as the Banco de España stated in their 2012 Report on its Claims Service that "It is not the customer's responsibility to bear any fees for the maintenance and/or management on accounts used solely for the purpose of receiving interests on deposits or repaying a mortgage".

FACUA also argues that the fees charged on accounts used to pay loans are breaching regulations implemented by the General Law for the Defence of Consumers and Users. Article 62.2, specifically states these charges "onerous or disproportionate to the are exercise of the rights granted to consumers in the contract". The law also considers unfair "to charge for products or services not actually used or consumed" (Article 87.5), and prescribes the supplier to "make available to the consumer and user in a clear, understandable and appropriate manner to the circumstances, the relevant, accurate and sufficient information about the essential
