Cañas was acquitted in Spain after using privileged information in the purchase of shares in the Canadian company Potash, in a controversial sentence because the vote of one of the judges was critical.

In the United States, however, he attempted a plea with the US Securities and Exchange Commission to pay a large fine to close a legal demand from the supervisor of the Securities and Exchange Commission, which presumed he was admitting his guilt, but in any case the plea was rejected.

January and February can be wicked months for bars and restaurants. After what is usually a financially draining Christmas, private coffers are at an annual low. This coupled with much colder weather - and it has been very cold in the evenings locally - encourage people to stay at home in the warm and semi-hibernate. This of course means a very lean time for many bars and restaurants in the area, who can only look forward to improved trade in the late spring and early summer.

But life goes on and one bar in particular, Bentor's, opposite Mercadona in Los Balcones, maintains its weekly entertainment offerings - live music and karaoke - on a regular basis. Now Bentor's is a small bar, but it has character, plenty of charm, very reasonable prices and can be very atmospheric at times. Their first year anniversary came up on February 7, so it was decided to celebrate by bringing in a 'big act'; so Stevie Spit was contacted and booked for the evening. Spit's fee is relatively expensive so it was decided to put on a buffet and charge €5 per ticket to help with the cost. The bar sold approx' 30 + tickets which for such a small bar, is capacity.

At lunchtime on the scheduled performance day, Spit was telephoned to confirm the timings and stated that he would be arriving to set up at around 6:30pm.

Spit then telephoned around an hour later and stated that he would not be turning up as he did not want to perform for a crowd of less than 30! This was regardless of his fee being guaranteed. Now at Bentor's, 30 is almost a capacity crowd as it is such a small bar, but staff had already purchased the food and prepared the buffet. So not only was money wasted on food, but also the customers arrived that evening to find that the entertainment was cancelled!

So here you have yet another small bar being dropped in the shit because of a performer who is just too big for his boots...or high hells! But then I heard that this was not the first time that this performer had let down this particular bar. I understand it happened once before with the previous owner. Now I know this chap raises money for charity, etc, etc, but there is no excuse for this sort of behaviour. It is bars like this that are trying to keep live entertainment going on the Costa. The very least the artists could do is keep their word and turn up. So I wondered how to finish this story off, and initially thought that it might be appropriate to respond using the tenor and content of Spit's own performances, but that would just be more smut. 
the driver said after police in the town of O Carballiño explained why she had been fined.

Murcia's San Javier Wins EU's Best Airport Award.

Will AENA close commercial flights at Murcia's San Javier following the facility being awarded the title of the EU's best Airport (in the under 2 million passengers per year category) for 2014?

Most of the bogus gasmen have no technical qualification, and many have a criminal record and use fake ID. Because of the simplicity of the fraud it is difficult to



determine the full extent nationally. However, the Andalucian authorities estimate that these conmentake around €150,000 a month in their region alone.

Spain has lent €7 billion to Greece and has been a guarantor for a further €18 billion and is now decidedly nervous.

Municipalities Tightening the Belt.....or Noose!

Now that the building boom is no more, Spanish municipalities, particularly the coastal ones, are finding it difficult to generate funds and investments to progress the efficient management of their boroughs. As more services are withdrawn and more roads are in need of repair, these municipalities are forced to become more creative and indeed tough, when it comes to raising additional funding.

The province of Málaga is leading the way in this by initially focusing on two areas where they hope to generate significant revenues - unauthorised building works and motor vehicles.

But have no doubt that these revenue raising efforts will be coming to an area near you soon. The only reason we are not subject to these inspections and fines is down to a lack of staff and a lack of will by what seems to be an imploding political

In Málaga, the land registry expects to detect as many as 39,000 irregular buildings. A new round of inspections will affect another 12 towns in the province, including Estepona and Marbella.

Over this year a total of 758,000 homes will revised in the province, and it follows a previous inspection which ran from the end of 2013 and during 2014 and concentrated on 29 towns in the province.

The land registry inspectors are looking for any illegal building, modification or extension and where the IBI local rent has not been paid in sufficient quantity. In 2013, the number caught without an ITV/MOT in Málaga province was 26,032 and in 2014 it was 38,527, up 12,495 which at €200 each fine brought the DGT €7.70 million last year.

These figures have to be taken in context; according to the public company Industrial Verifications in Andalucía, which manages the testing stations authorised by the Junta de Andalucía Council; some 150,000 cars on the roads of Málaga province have no ITV, and almost 24,000 motorbikes are in the same situation.

The DGT, which usually lists on their website the location of speeding cameras, is giving no information on which of their current cameras or radars the new system is being used, but say anyone caught speeding would automatically have their ITV checked anyway.

Current the number total vehicles registered in Málaga province is 745,000, and in addition 120,000 motorbikes.

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
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Spanish Unions Enjoying the Good Life.

You may recall from previous issues how the trade unions in Andalucia have diverted millions of euros to other destinations other than to the supposed destination of training for the unemployed.

One of the trade sections of Comisiones Obreras (CCOO), Spain's largest labor union, spent more than €14 million on meetings and travel, and €3.7 million on bonuses between 2008 and 2012, Spain's worst crisis years, according to internal union accounts to which EL PAIS has had access.

Members of Comfia, the union's former banking branch—which has since been merged with the hospitality and commerce sections—presented their organization with restaurant bills worth tens of thousands of euros a year, very often for meals at expensive establishments frequented by economic elites.

Millions more were disbursed on a multitude of conventions at the local, regional and national level, some of which cost more than €300,000 to organize. The accounts also show numerous items recorded under generic headings such as "other" or "Visa," making it impossible to see exactly what the union's money was spent on. The accounts show that some of the union leaders dined out three times a week at expensive restaurants with some bills in excess of €1,000.

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THE SIX DAY JOURNEY By Ken & Heather Billingsley

It all started to go wrong due to the delayed sailing of Brittany Ferries crossing from Portsmouth to Santander. The sailing should have been on Sunday 1st February but due to the high winds in Spain this sailing was delayed until Tuesday 3rd till 12.30. February at 01.00.

We disembarked in Santander at 07.30 Wednesday morning. We had been told by the crew "Spain has had a little snow, so please drive carefully".

We started driving on the A67 in drizzle which quickly escalated to snow which became progressively worse. Due to the falling snow the traffic was only using the outer lane of this road. Having driven approximately 100km we came to reach our vehicles. After having my vehicle dug to a halt in a queue of traffic due to a lorry accident, it was now about 10.30am. We were only about 6 or 7 cars away from this lorry.

The other carriageway had no normal traffic on it but various snow storm but I eventually found my way back to snow ploughs and Guardia vehicles could be seen going the the hotel. wrong way down it. Snow ploughs and tractors came to our side of the carriageway and cleared snow at various times but it did not have that many rooms and the staff were nothing much happened at all until 17.00 when a JCB (photo) cleared the snow from the right hand lane of the carriageway



and it would have only taken a few shovels of snow and we could have moved into the right hand lane and we had hoped been on our way. It was not to be.

Nothing further happened until 02.40 when blower snow came along and again cleared the right hand lane. 03.00 At. worker knocked on the window and said that "in about 5 - 10

minutes you will be out of here". What he forgot to say it was not the cars but only the people.

We had now been in our car for 17.5 hours. At 04.00 a soldier from UME - this is the unit that deals with disasters - came and told us we were leaving our vehicles and to go with them. We only had to time to grab our handbags, phones and passports. The UME had dug a trench which was knee high through the snow, we then had to climb the central reservation barriers and through another trench on the other side and climb into a snow vehicle. We were then taken 10 km to a school hall but our rescuers were told there was no room for us and we were then transferred into a Guardia 4 x 4 and driven back the way we had come and onto Reinosa which was 20km to a hotel. It was 05.45 when we arrived. We were taken into a large dining room there were no blankets or help and not even a warm drink. So it was sleep where you could, if you could!

At 07.00 the cafe in the hotel opened and that was the first warm drink we had had since 06.00 on Wednesday before we left the boat.

At 10.30 the Guardia asked all people heading south to proceed outside and we would be taken back to our vehicles. There was not enough vehicles for us all and so those that could got into the Guardia vehicles and the rest of us had to return to the hotel. Those in the vehicles did not in fact leave the hotel

At 14.00 the Guardia said drivers only who were going south to go outside and they would be taken back to their vehicles, but that no one was allowed to drive south. Unfortunately the Guardia exited the carriage way one junction too soon and we completed the journey on the opposite carriageway. We therefore had to trek through thigh high snow out by the Guardia we were told we could not be given an escort back and we had to find our way on the N611. During that journey there was another

Although the hotel we were taken to seemed large unsure how many would be available that day so a list was started and we were very low down on the list.



On my return I found that my wife had managed to get onto the Internet and had booked a hotel about 5km away in Reinosa North. We had to risk making the journey to this hotel before the roads became impassable.

The hotel we went to was called Hotel Golobar and we arrived at 16.00 on Thursday afternoon. The hotel is owned by Mario Gonzalez. Mario and his staff were very obliging and ensured that our enforced stay was as pleasurable as possible. We stayed at the hotel till Sunday morning by which time I had extricated the car from the snow drifts on two occasions (one with the assistance of a tractor).

The journey from Reinosa to Torrevieja was free from any mishaps and we arrived home at 1700 Sunday evening.

Looking back on our adventure it was quite challenging and not something to be repeated again in our lifetime.



Refusing an Inheritance!

Further evidence on the failure of the Inheritance Tax in Spain comes from Malaga. Here around 1,000 residents of Málaga province refuse to accept an inheritance every year. According to the Notaries College in Andalucía the choice depends on how much tax has to be paid. And Andalucía is one of the Spanish regions with higher fiscal pressure on successions tax, which means an inheritance in Málaga can be a poisoned gift. A member of the managing council of the Notaries College, Ramón Blesa, said, 'When this year ends 1,060 malagueños will have rejected their inheritance, so far this year 803 have done so and 6,018 have accepted it, down from 8,013 last year. If the inheritor accepts and is in debt, the creditors can embargo the inheritance, although there are judicial shortcuts for a person to accept. 'It's not clear if we have touched bottom, the number of renunciations should fall in line with the growth of the economy and employment in Málaga'.

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
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

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

Spain Now World's Largest Exporter of Wine.

Spain's El Economista has reported how the country has now overtaken the likes of France, Italy, Chile, Australia and South Africa to become the largest exporter of wine in the world.

The daily newspaper cited data produced by the Spanish customs and excise agency, compiled and analysed the Spanish Wine Market Observatory (OEMV).

The reported revealed how a total of 2.168 billion litres of wine was sold between September 2013 and September 2014 - up 19.9% on the previous 12 months.

This compared with Italy - who were last year's largest exporter - selling 2.025 billion litres, which was down by 1.7% on the same period the year before.

France came in 3rd position in terms of the total volume exported, yet top in terms of the financial value at EU7.763 billion, whilst the value of Italian wine exported came to EU5.087 billion, with Spain lagging behind at just EU2.524 billion.
