There is now an automated teller machine in the frontage of The Post Room in Via Park III. It is expected to be operational shortly, which together with the new pharmacy is a boon to this area. Spanish public debt has for the first time since 1909 reached 100% of GDP. The public administrations of regions and provinces have an accumulated debt of €1.095 trillion. It means Spain had paid more than it earned in the last year. It also means that each and every Spaniard or taxpayer here, owes the State €23,500. Since the start of the Rajoy Government the debt per inhabitant has increased by nearly 50%....thanks, Mariano. You should be aware that new general elections are being held in late June. Following the inconclusive result of the last one in December, there is little to be confident about the forthcoming one and the whole exercise could be repeated again in six months time. The economy of Spain remains on a knife edge and it will still be some years before there will be a noticeable improvement for most people as further austerity cuts are introduced. Fortunately for UK expats, prices still remain low and the sterling rate seems on the up.



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## Did you know that .....

...if you have a problem controlling your spending, you can now purchase a bracelet which will deliver a jolt of electricity to your wrist. That's what Intelligent Environments, a British software vendor to banks like HSBC and the Bank of Ireland, has announced on May 19. Users can connect their credit cards or bank accounts to a Pavlok (photo), a brand of electro-shocking wristband, for instance, and set a spending threshold that will set off a vibration or electric shock of up to 340 volts if the limit is passed. If the thought of electric shocks is

well, too shocking, you can have the device reduce the thermostat on your property by say 3°, which would also be an incentive. But here's an idea! Wouldn't it be a wonderful thing if these devices were integrated into smart phone usage. If we lived in a 'micktatorship' I would insist on this and if people turned on these anti-conversational & anti-social devices in bars and restaurants, they would then receive a hefty electric shock. ...medical errors are now the third leasing cause of death in the United States? Shocking! The analysis, published in the BMJ in early May shows that "medical errors" in hospitals and other health-care facilities are incredibly common and may now be the third-leading cause of death in the United States — claiming 251,000 lives every year, more than respiratory disease, accidents, stroke and Alzheimer's. Martin Makary, a professor of surgery at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine who led the research, said in an interview that the category includes everything from bad doctors to more systemic issues such as communication breakdowns when patients are handed off from one department to another. "It boils down to people dying from the care that they receive rather than the disease for which they are seeking care," Makary said. You can read more here -

Diario de Mallorca reports a witness has confirmed that José Ramón Bauzá, PP president of the Balaerics for four years, paid a €687,000 surplus for the Hotel Rocamar. The hotel, which was in ruins in Sóller, was worth only €285,000. However the Bauzá administration paid €72,000 of public money for it.

As is happening now in many regions, Ibiza is also beginning to clamp down on illegal holiday lettings. Six inspectors will attempt to combat the illegal tourism offers with software. The Council of Ibiza has acquired a program which 'combs' the internet in search of all types of illegal accommodations, which will be in action by the end of May, they say. The fines for those caught will range from €4,000 to €40,000. In Catalonia, the fines can reach several hundred thousand euros in certain cases. It is of course the hotel lobby (and of course local government greed) which is pushing for these measures.

This year the hotels in Ibiza will be so busy that they are unable to house the extra policemen being drafted into the island to cope with the summer numbers. The recent droughts have also badly effected the island's underground water table. It remains at half the level it was ten years ago with much of the water table now salty. Desalinated water is now being used to wash the streets.

The Baleareic Islands have lost 12 Blue Flags this year. In all, Spain has obtained a total of 686 'Blue Flags' (586 beaches and 100 ports) The president of the association 'Blue Flag' Jose Ramon Sanchez, explained that the beaches have lost their flags because over the years the criteria has become "more demanding" and this required more resources, so that the costs has been "deterrent". Another reason for the loss of this distinction has been to make sure that all water is "quality".

At the international level, countries that are situated next to Spain taking into account only the number of beaches are Turkey (444), Greece (430), France (400) and Portugal (315). In the number of ports, Spain, with 100, ranked third surpassed by Holland (113) and Germany (109).

After Spain, the main holders of 'Blue Flag beaches and ports, are France (498), Turkey (465), Greece (439) and Italy (359); a total of 49 different countries have earned this distinction on five continents.

In March 2015, the Constitutional Court overturned a new Andalucian law that enabled the temporary expropriation of bank-owned homes to avoid evictions. It was generally felt that this was the ruling PP central government bowing to pressure from the financial services lobby. Now, the city of Granada wants to adopt measures which insures that neither the Local Police nor fireman will take part in evictions, as has been the norm up until now.

La Vanguardia printed a report on Tony Blair – Saudi commissioner and Middle East mediator. Información in Alicante headlind that 'the companies are renouncing innovation grants for fear of being inspected'. The manufacturing sectors in the Valencia region only applied for some 400 grants in research and development projects in 2015.

Diario de Mallorca headlined that 'the number of mosques in Mallorca has multiplied by eight in a decade'. In 2005 there were five Muslim places of worship and now there are 41. These come under the control of the Justice Ministry, oddly enough.

The surfeit of part-time work contracts has hindered the reactivation of the Málaga labour market. Hour long contracts have reached 25% of the new contracts in the province, 40% more than before the recession. The unions criticise the 'precarious' model – low wages which stimulate the underground economy and temporality to a maximum.

Now this should be of interest to local bars who offer entertainment. Local Police in Palma are collaborating in the patrol of the capacity of night live venues. The judge who is investigating the corruption in the police force has uncovered an order to close bars for noise, without the use of an audiometer. Does this mean that a 'private payment' will make the problem go away, at least in Palma? Of course it does. Palma does seem to have an issue with dodgy cops. Diario de Mallorca reported that 'A policeman in Palma collected commissions for the money robbed by the wallet takers (pickpockets).' Court documents revealed that this policeman accepted drugs, clothes and perfumes from a gang of Romanian neer-do-wells. Certainly Palma seems to afford lots of opportunities to those with sticky fingers. On May 3rd alone, eight liners docked in the port to the city, with 22,000 passengers disembarking. What a treasure trove of opportunities for some! I wonder how many of them had stuff stolen?

A judge is investigating why 300 fines were 'forgiven' in the last term of the PP in Alicante. Some police say their complaints were never processed. 90 of the fines correspond to fines for breaches of the Ordinance occupation by installing terraces on public roads that contravened at the time, current legislation, and not allowed to have fixed elements, without obtaining prior license. Fines were also 'lost' relating to the activity of street vendors who worked in the Paseo de Juan Aparicio. The police realized that none of the sanctions were appealed by those affected, something strange considering the volume of offences noted by the police service. In the case of fines imposed on hoteliers, it is alleged that the government team decided not to progress the cases.

The controversial declaration of assets abroad, known as the dreaded Modelo 720, is starting to bear fruit, according to Typically Spanish. The Tax Office has collected €840 million after completing 8,800 inspections out of a total 225,000 contributors. The prosecutor is to inspect another 7,000 tax payers for failing to present the 720 or to chase up missing data. A total of 436 sanctions were levied at 150% of the amount not declared! Since 2013 and arrival of the Modelo 720, the Spaniards have revealed €141 billion.

Some 26,935 were declaring for their first time between January and April 2016, who have investment funds, shares, property or insurances abroad. Over the four years the citizens with current accounts abroad declared 2.6 billion, property one billion € and investment funds, shares and insurances of 10.1 billion €

million euros. Lorente has stated that the award for the rubbish contract 'was impeccable.' However, the 34 accused by the Anti - Corruption Prosecutor in the Brugal case investigating the alleged rigging of the contract of garbage from Orihuela, are not expected to be heard in Elche until 2018! This for a case which has already been dragging on for some years in the investigation process.

Torrevieja will have the first beach for dogs Vega Baja this summer. The governing board have unanimously approved the procedure for changing the ordinance use of the coast. An agreed site has not yet been chosen.

The police have dismantled an organized gang in Dolores who had committed 44 crimes in the area. The four men arrested were Spanish nationals, aged between 20 and 29, and a Spanish woman of 17 years.

The 27 municipalities of the Vega Baja have reduced their collective debt to the banks by €64 million during the last three years. The debt is believed to now stand at €175.5 million, that is of course if they all told the truth. Torrevieja, Orihuela and Callosa de Segura are the biggest debtors, owing €8.2 million, €38 million and €14.3 million respectively. Whereas Rojales, Benejúzar and Cox state that they do not owe anything to the banks. It begs the question, 'How much do they owe their suppliers, now?'

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Local football matches can sometimes get quite emotional and indeed a little violent. In late April Almoradi were playing Villajouasa when Kike Granados of Almoradi received his second yellow card in just eight minutes for allegedly faking an injury. Granados was not to happy about this so he head-butted the referee. Granados has been playing for six local teams over the past 15 years. Not sure if he will be playing for much longer now.

Alicante City Hall is to install 150 cameras to control traffic infractions. The mayor has asked the Industry Ministry to finance the crackdown with a €4 million payment. The cameras will detect cars without insurance and ITV (MOT).

There has been a jellyfish invasion on some of the beaches in the Marbella area. Stormy seas have brought thousands of jellyfish to the immediate coastline, some of them as large as half a metre. In our region it tends to be the Mar Menor area which appears to be more prone to them. However, wind and currents can bring these in anywhere, as happened in May 2015. Some of the jellyfish found in the Med' can be very dangerous. If you see any jellyfish when swimming the best advice is to leave the water and alert the beach lifeguards. The tentacles of dead jellyfish found on the beach can still sting for some weeks, so don't be inquisitively dumb!

It is great news to hear that Orihuela Costa has maintained its quota of Blue Flags at eight flags this year..

Alicante General Hospital has had one of its operating theatres closed for three months, even though there are still 550 children on the waiting list. There is lots of anecdotal evidence that waiting times are increasing although none of the professionals are admitting it.

The Spanish town of Lorca, which suffered a damaging earthquake five years ago killing at least nine people, is now painfully aware of the current inadequacies of the restoration works. Whereas priority has been give to the restoration of the monuments, 2,000 dwellings remain in ruins. Seems people come last in emergencies. The area continues to receive earthquakes.

In the city of Alicante, the Policia Local **fine** an average of 143 drivers daily for parking offences. Last year 52,170 drivers were fined. The worst month was July with 5,226 fines and the best December with 3,557. Of the cases resolved (only 7,587), €353,660 was added to the municipal coffers.

According to data from Spain's National Statistic Institute (INE), multiple births accounted for 2.29% of all births in 2014 with 9,493 twins, 117 triplets and two quadruplets or more. In other words, 22.9 of every one thousand births were multiple.

These statistics mean that Spain is a frontrunner in Europe when it comes to multiple births, according to a 2013 study of 29 countries published in the European Perinatal Health Report using 2010 data. Only Cyprus, with 25.1 multiple births per thousand, the Czech Republic with 21 and Denmark with 20.9, are ahead of Spain. Comparing this study with another one released in 2008 with 2004 data, multiple births have fallen everywhere except in Spain, where they have increased. Multiple births have increased in Spain by 287% since fertility treatment was introduced.

If you were last on the electoral roll in Northern Ireland then you need to act quickly. The Electoral Office for Northern Ireland says that if you are appointing a proxy to vote at the EU Referendum, the deadline for sending in your printed application is 5.00pm on 3 June.



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## **Snippets!**

•Barcelona mayor Ada Colau has said her emergency habitation and energy poverty law has halted 639 evictions in four months. She defended her administration to attend to their obligations to protect the vulnerable and to continue to halt the evictions, and if this law proves insufficient, she will have to find other Meanwhile, several hundred militant squatters caused a violent riot in late May.

•The Treasury is insisting on the payment of income tax on the compensation paid for damages to the owners of preferential shares.

•Spanish bishops have warned cultural piracy is a sin.

•The number of mortal accidents in the Spanish workplace was more than 500 last year, more than half the number to die on the roads. Between March 2015 and February 2016 there were 521 compared to 443 in the twelve previous months. On average each week around ten people die in their workplace.

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

## Funerals - It's a Dying Business!

Well, not really. Funerals are still big business in Spain. The death rate is still rising in Spain, as the trend on the graph above illustrates. For some years now the death rate has averaged 390,000 annually.

In early May, *Informacion* featured an interesting article on the 'Cost of Dying in Spain.' It included the most recent survey on the subject, which unfortunately was more than three years old. However, most of the information is still current as inflation has been very low for several years now.

Some years ago, I included an article in the newsletter on funeral costs, but I think it's time to take a quick look at the subject again. I did go to the *tanatorio* in Torrevieja to gather information, but it was like trying to get blood out of a stone.

The average cost of a funeral/burial in Spain is €3,545. However, the cost can vary significantly from area to area. For example, a funeral in the city of Cuenca can cost as little as €2,261. In some cities in the Canaries it can be just as cheap.

In Valencia and Murcia, the cost increases to approx.  $\mathfrak{S}$ ,150 each, whereas in Alicante it rises to an average of  $\mathfrak{S}$ ,622. In the city of Madrid you can expect to pay  $\mathfrak{S}$ ,765.

But when it comes to the highest cost, unsurprisingly it is our friends the Catalans, who are the most expensive. Here, the average cost of a funeral in Tarragona will cost €5,323, while if you 'peg it' and expect a funeral in Barcelona, your nearest and dearest will be expected to come up with €6,441!

I can remember reading an article several years ago which reported that most of the coffins used in Spain were made in China, so these are probably much cheaper than locally produced ones. So, why the big difference in funeral prices?

The main problem is lack of competition. In 1996, Spain relaxed some of the controls on the setting up of undertakers. Then in 2009, another law known as Omnibus, eliminated some of the obstacles required for the granting of a burial license. However, many municipalities never adopted the change in the law, continuing to operate with a single *tanatorio*, resulting in oligopolies. These restrictions are still in place today, even locally. This of course restricts competition and is bad for the consumer. In the municipal monopoly prices remain exorbitant. I cannot understand why the process is not challenged, particularly when trade, under EU directives, should be more open and accessible. But then again you don't see any non Spanish operating pharmacies, do you?

But neither have the government helped. A couple of years ago, under the cloak of austerity measures, the government increased the IVA (VAT) on funerals from 8% to 21%.

Unfortunately now, many of the institutions will not accept a cadaver unless they are paid at least €1,000 to cover movement costs etc. But based on how some of these institutions, even hospitals, have been looking after the remains, I'm not sure I would like my friends or relatives to be subject to those conditions......well maybe just a handful of relatives!

(Late thought: you can actually buy a coffin off another supplier and instruct the undertaker in Spain to use it. They have to comply with your request and they cannot charge you a fee for using it.)



#### Being Spanish.

Nearly 40% of Spanish adults say they play video games, according to a study by Sigma Dos for AEVI. AEVI, the Spanish Association of Video Games, who have introduced the first national study to determine the penetration of video games in the adult population.

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

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Take a look at the map on the left. It illustrates the autonomous communities of Spain - 17 in all and two autonomous cities, Ceuta and Melilla, in North Africa. They were created in accordance with the Spanish constitution of 1978, with the aim of guaranteeing limited autonomy of the nationalities and regions that comprise the Spanish nation. When the Franco regime disappeared, the period became known as café para todos: coffee for all. This was the chance for every region to make its pitch and govern according to the constitution and their own organic laws known as Statutes of Autonomy. This of course created a new bureaucracy in each community with their own presidents and duplicated civil service. Coffee for all and lots of jobs for paper pushers.

Language policy has been especially contentious, with moves by regional governments to impose Catalan, Galician or Basque in schools and the civil service, provoking angry reactions from Spanish-speaking residents. Autonomy is not only occasionally inconvenient for those who want to speak Spanish. Investors - domestic and foreign - complain bitterly about the extra bureaucracy imposed by regional governments, costs Spain can ill afford as it attempts to exit the deepest recession in memory. "The administration in Spain suffers from elephantiasis," was the verdict of one lawyer in Madrid. But as the Financial Times put it, 'Café para todos is a stimulating brew no one wants to forgo. When the waiter comes, however, no one wants to pay the bill.' But the situation is even more complex. The communities are also split into regions. Our community, Valencia, is divided further into three separate provinces - Alicante, Valencia and Castellón, each with its own president and bureaucratic political entourage. And if you think that is bad, look at Andalucia - Spain's black hole. Here they have eight separate provinces. But there could be worse to come. The socialist PSOE promise that they will create another 200,000 jobs in the public sector! Fortunately they have no chance of winning the election, unless they team up with the far left, the separatists and Ciudadanos. This is unlikely.

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
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
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## **Lime Bar Fishing Sunbathing Club**

## All Cats Are Beautiful or All Cops Are Bastards?

A Madrid resident has been fined by the police for carrying a bag depicting a cat's face and the slogan "All Cats Are Beautiful."

According to her own version of events, posted on Facebook and Twitter, Belén Lobeto was returning home on Sunday when two police officers approached her. An argument ensued over allegations that the slogan was really a stand-in for "All Cops Are Bastards."

The phrase "All cops are bastards" has been documented since the 1970's, and became popular after a British punk band named 4 Skins used it in a 1980 song. It has also been adopted by some soccer hooligans.

"The police have just fined me across from my house (near

the Calderón) for carrying this bag.'

As a result, the law enforcement agents presented her with a fine that she is promising to appeal.

The sanction is based on Article 37 of the new Citizen Safety Law – popularly referred to as the Gag Law because of its restrictive nature, particularly when it comes to capturing images of police officers or holding public protests.



According to the riot officers who fined her, Lobeto incurred in "disrespect for a member of law enforcement in the exercise of his or her duties to protect citizen safety."

The fine could be anywhere between €100 and €600.

Lobato's tweet denouncing the incident, which took place near the Vicente Calderón stadium on the same day that Barça and Sevilla faced off in the Copa del Rey final, has been shared over 13,000 times and made the front page of the online news aggregator Menéame.

In a Facebook post, Lobato – who could not be reached for comment – explains the incident:

"I live next to the Calderón [stadium] and they're playing the Copa del Rey final today. The police on duty must have very little to do, because as I was calmly walking home, suddenly two law enforcement officers ran after me to ask for ID and inform me that they were going to fine me for carrying this bag. I asked for explanations and said I really doubted that I was calling attention to myself or committing any crime, and they said to go tell it to the judge. They handed me the notice, which of course I didn't sign, and I saw that the reason for the fine is something that is not anywhere on my bag, and when I told them that what they wrote down is A LIE, and that I can prove it to a judge, they said to go tell my government delegate about it, and that they were fining me for the acronym, which is there on the bag. I tried to talk to them calmly and reason with them, but it was impossible for a change, and I was forced to keep quiet to prevent them from slapping me with a bigger fine. I also told them that there are lots of more important things to deal with. What a fucking disgrace of a country. Yes, ALL CATS ARE BEAUTIFUL. And whoever says otherwise is lying.

The government delegation in Madrid will now have to decide whether the sanction was justified or not. Lobeto will have the right to appeal before a judicial authority, said police sources.

A similar incident involving the ACAB acronym was reported in Alicante in 2015, and a year earlier two German courts handed down convictions against individuals who displayed "ACAB" and the numbers 1312, where the latter were understood to stand for the same letters.

#### A Bit Odd!

A recent article in the excellent *Informacion* caught my eye. It dealt with the subject of emergency tracheotomies.

Researchers at the University of Munich in Germany wanted to test the effectiveness of non medical personnel using pens for emergency tracheotomies. They invited ten volunteers to use three different sorts of pens to attempt the procedure. They included lawyers, police and students but they were to try the procedure on a number of corpses which were just two days old! Of the nine, only three managed to pierce the throat in the correct place but only one person was able to penetrate the skin, ligaments and the wall of the airway to establish an air channel. It took five minutes and required a lot of patience and strength. Even then there was damage to the throat and airways.

The researchers determined that it was virtually impossible to carry out the procedure with a pen, although a pen could be used as an airway, provided that something sharp



was used in the first place to make an opening. Call the ER, they advised.

The Spanish public continue to be assaulted by more and more cases of corruption among the Spanish political elite. It is no wonder that the public are fed up with the 'old school' and are now attracted to the new populist far-left parties and their promises. Even the traditional party of the left, the PSOE, may soon be moved from second position in the polls to third; people are just fed up with them. I must confess that I an fascinated by the corruption and skullduggery in Spanish politics. It may be depressing but it is also very entertaining.

During my regular daily trawls through the Spanish media, I came across this photo, probably just a few years old, of three senior Spanish PP politicians in Valencia. On the right is Rafael Blasco. At one time a

committed communist and socialist, he later moved to the right-of-centre PP, where he rose to be the spokesman for the PP in Valencia and have the grand title of The Minister of Solidarity and Cooperation. But then it was revealed that in June 2012 six million euros which was supposed to be sent in aid from the Valencian Government to stricken areas, such as Haiti and Nicaragua, never actually got there. The aid funding was redirected to enhancing the personal wealth of Blasco (and others) by purchasing property in the Valencian region. In May 2014 the High Court of Valencia




condemned Blasco to eight years in prison and twenty years of disqualification from public office, being the author of the crime of embezzlement of public funds. On June 10, 2015, the Supreme Court upheld the conviction but downgraded it to six and half years of imprisonment.

Now to the short chap in the middle of the photo, Alfonso Rus. Now this guy, another big wig, was president of the Provincial Council of Valencia between 2007 and 2015, president of the Popular Party in the province of Valencia between 2004 and 2015 and also president of the football Club Deportivo Olímpic Xàtiva. But in May 2015 he was kicked out of the PP. It was alleged that there is a recording of him counting the money in a cash bribe which exceeded €100,000. Then on January 26, 2016, he was arrested with several dozen others and investigations are continuing.

Finally on the left hand side of the photo is Gerardo Camps. In 2003, he was appointed PP Minister for Economy, Manufacturing and Employment in the Valencian regional administration. I must say immediately that Camps has not been investigated or charged by the police. But he has received quite a bit of unwelcome notoriety in recent weeks when it was revealed by the socialist parliamentarian José Muñoz that between the years of 2007 and 2011, he spent \( \frac{6}{33},000 \) in expensive restaurants at the public's expense while the PP were in power. It is also believed that he charged the tips to expenses. Now this expenditure occurred during the most severe period of the recession. Camps denies any wrong doing and it is a measure of the paucity of available politicians for the Alicante PP election list for the coming general election, that Camps is number four on the list. The list has contracted as most of the usual politicians on the list are being investigated for various corruption cases.

Finally, a brief mention of the Púnica corruption case which is now erupting in the Madrid Region. One of the main building contractors involved in the case is spilling the beans so that when it comes to sentencing, he hopes to get off lightly. The deal was basically this: the contractor wanted to build on land which was not zoned for building. They bought the land and then got the local mayor, Francisco Granados (photo), to rezone the land. This was done and houses were built on the rezoned land. The mayor (and his associates) would then receive a 20% cut off each property sold. An estimated €250 million in public contracts in exchange for kickbacks from construction companies was the total deal. Because of the large sums involved and the risk of flight from Granados, he has been in custody since October 2014.
