Following the terrorist attacks in Catalonia, Spanish cities are now reinforcing security in central pedestrian areas.



The most common method of doing this is using large, heavy concrete plant pots, which are at least attractive. The Government has called on 20 municipalities within Alicante Province to strengthen the protection of public spaces. Prevention measures recommended include the reinforcement of agents on tourist rides, transport stations and areas of large crowding, as well as the installation of planters or bollards that prevent attacks by restricting vehicles. These measures have already been implemented in Alicante, Benidorm and Torrevieja, as well as some other cities. More on the attacks


So far it has been a brutally hot summer with very high and uncomfortable humidity levels. As I write this on August 26, temperatures are still peaking in the shade at 31/32°. Locally we have had no rainfall this summer aside from a couple of short light sandy drizzles. However, on the early morning of August 10, much of the Costa Blanca North was subjected to a storm and heavy rainfall. Fortunately our particular part of the coast was spared, but a number of beaches, Granadella de Xàbia and Les Deveses in Denia, were washed away, or as the Spanish press reported "eaten by the storm". 100 litres of rain fell in both these areas, 30 litres in less than an hour. The beaches of Albufereta and Pichón Tire were closed as a flood of rainwater passed through a ravine carrying assorted garbage and dead rats to the beach. Lovely! The resultant stink was appalling. Heavy rainfall on the island of Ibiza caused many flight cancellations. There was also significant damage to beaches around Mar Menor and the heavy rainfall on nearby farming land would have done little to improve the pollution in the lagoon, carrying pesticides, fertiliser and chemicals into the once crystal-clear waters.

28 people had to be rescued from drowning in Guardamar in one day; strong currents and high waves trapped the bathers. Two bathers will have to pay some €1,500 for not respecting the red flag in La Manga. It is worth noting that the lifeguards you see on the beaches are, technically, not supposed to enter the water to save people in trouble. They are there to warn bathers of dangers and to call the emergency services when bathers are experiencing difficulties. The fact that they will 'dive-in' is down to them and admirable.

Did you know that

...Chinese users rely on virtual private networks (VPNs) to circumvent the country's internet filters and access the open web. But in late July, Apple confirmed that it had removed the software from its China app store in order to comply with a law, approved in January, that bans all VPNs operating without government approval. Also, Vladimar Putin, the Russian president, signed a new law that prohibits the use of VPNs and other technologies allowing people to surf the web anonymously. The regulations will go into force in Russia on Nov. 1.

...alien cults are making a comeback in France. Despite a 1995 government crackdown, more than 600 sects exist today. France began cracking down in 1995, in response to a murder-suicide in the Vercors Mountains, where 16 members of the Order of the Solar Temple were shot and killed and arranged in a star formation by two other members who then committed suicide. In 2001, the repressive policy culminated in the controversial About-Picard Law, which allowed the government to ban religious groups if they were found to be manipulative and abusive.


once they are signed up, parties are considered "permanent" and actually need to inform the authorities should they wish to be dissolved. Consequently, many fail to take the last step. During the last general elections in Spain, for example, only 51 parties actually took part.

Toni Mayor president of a hoteliers association stated 'In Benidorm we are not concerned about tourism-phobia - this city is a tourism factory and the locals have learnt to sacrifice - the real problems are Brexit and more going to Tunisia and Turkey.'

Sky offers pay TV in Great Britain, Ireland, Germany, the low uptake of pay TV for the size of its economy. Andrew Griffith, financial director of Sky, said entering Spain would be a modest investment of several dozens of pounds (?), given the company already has the technology and programs. Looking to the future, if a significant audience is obtained, Sky will turn to Spanish content providers and develop programmes with content direct to Spain. However the British company arrives late in Spain, with Telefónica, Vodafone and Orange who now offer television. Other companies, such as Netflix and HBO also offer video on demand for their subscribers. Disney has now withdrawn from Netflix and years for drug smuggling, the Spanish authorities told the plans to launch a subscription service of its own, starting in the U.S.

> The health service in a number of regional location in comprehensive coverage to Spain is deteriorating. Diario de Ibiza reports 'Patients on the island are waiting for more than three months for hitting an operation' -the waiting list for surgery in the Can the Misses Hospital has doubled in a year - on Eivissa and Formentera 9,306 people are waiting for an X-ray.

> > 'Doctors on the Costa del Sol are those most under medical professional on the coastline has assigned 1,812 health cards, 500 more than the national average - those who leave from exhaustion are not being replaced, and it is only paediatricians are not under pressure because of the lower birth rate.

El País reports 'Bullfighting without blood in the Baleares' - the autonomous parliament will prohibit killing the animal, and limit the bullfights to 10 minutes. Diario de Mallorca headlined 'The pact also bans the use of banderillas or picadors.' The regional law challenges the Government and the ruling PP warn about its unconstitutionality. Despite its growing unpopularity with some regional Spaniards, the right of centre PP continue to support and promote bullfighting as one of the keys to Spanish culture.

Increasing numbers of babies are being removed from parents in the region of Valencia, when newborns test positive for drugs. The Generalitat of Valencia warned that in the province, it takes into care an average of four babies every week because of this.

There have been all-out strikes by taxi drivers in Madrid and Barcelona. This has caused chaos and resulted in hundred of missed flights at the airports. The drivers were striking because of 'private rentals.' There has also been a strong reaction to the introduction of Uber, particularly in Andalucia. The EU has warned that the regional restrictions being placed on Uber (taxi service) and Airbnb (accommodation) are not in accordance with the normal EU competition rules and are putting obstacles in the way of these platforms.

The Supreme Court has annulled the sentence against Miguel Blesa (former head of Caja Madrid) for the opaque cards, following his suicide. Although he obviously cannot pay any of the compensation fines, it has been confirmed by the National Court that payment to be made by his inheritors, if they don't renounce their proportional part of the inheritance.

Información in Alicante reports 'the special court established for the ground clauses has collapsed after two months' - the judges urge a separate tribunal to deal with the avalanche of claims - already 1,200 across from province.

House burglaries in Mazarrón, Murcia, have soared by 80% in just six months.

El Mundo reports that in 2016 'Podemos earns nearly €12 million and is already the most profitable party' having lifted their income by 412% because of their greater presence in the elected institutions. The PSOE earned €11 million in 2016 thanks to dramatic spending cuts and the PP lost more than €600,000, according to the accounts made public.

La Opinion de Málaga reports that 'USA has placed Málaga as an example in the fight against jihadism' - the US State Department 2016 report on terrorism praised the pioneering program launched by the City Hall to prevent radicalisation - by using all municipal resources as a prevention.

A Malaga hospital has been using Botox to treat patients with chronic migraine. The department specialising in headaches Malaga's Clínico Universitario hospital is a pioneer in Malaga and in Andalucía in the use of the botulinum toxin on patients with chronic refractory migraine (the type that does not improve through pharmaceutical treatment). The use of the botulinum toxin for this type of complex migraine is authorised by the Spanish Medication Agency. It is applied to different points of the cranium and neck, and it reduces the frequency and intensive of the pain.

The Spanish Foreign Ministry has sacked the Spanish consul in Washington for taking the mickey out of Susana Díaz and her accent. Diaz is the socialist president of Andalucia.

In an effort to contain hooliganism and anti-social behaviour, the Police in Calvià, Majorca, has imposed 24 sanctions for openly having sex in the street. 24 sanctions? Maybe it's a different fine for each sexual position.

El País notes 'none of the Spanish university are on the list of the best 200. Spain is the only developed country without any university of quality in the list, which is led by Harvard, Stanford and Cambridge. La Verdad in Murcia reports 'Murcia University has for the first time made the list of the top 800 in the world' - only 11 Spanish campuses are in the top 500 of the most prestigious.

The council in Ponteareas, Galicia, hopes to combat absenteeism by rewarding employees for turning up! It is well-known and possibly too readily accepted in Spain that there is a high degree of absenteeism among those who have managed to secure a job for life in public sector administrative roles - *funcionarios*. It has been agreed by the nationalist-led council that money should be set aside to pay bonuses to any staff who manage to attend work regularly and to complete at least 90% of their theoretical working hours. In other words, it appears that laziness in the Town Hall has reached the point where staff are under the impression that their salaries are paid in order for them to be absent from the workplace for at least 10% of the time!



A new Cafe/bar has opened in the commercial area adjoining Dream Hills II, with OC Garage, a Chinese *todo* and Aldi's taking most of the other units. The new bar is called *Sorraia* and is a very welcome addition to the area. The name, *Sorraia*, comes from a rare breed of horse indigenous to part of the Iberian peninsula and named after a river in Portugal.

La Pedrera, is the most important fresh water reservoir in



the province of Alicante and the second in the Segura river basin after the Cenajo. It is situated just a ten minute drive from Orihuela Costa, photo. Because of the


very hot summer and lack of rainfall, the reservoir was storing just over 73 cubic hectometres at the time of writing, which represents just 30% of its total capacity, which is 246 cubic hectometres. Fortunately this summer we have not experienced any water cut-offs (nor electricity cuts) in this area, which is remarkable. Other Mediterranean tourist spots have not been so lucky and have had to ration water, particularly in the city of Rome, where water cuts of eight hours a day are being contemplated. The problem there is that the older pipeworks leak between 40% and 60% of the water into the subsoil. Fortunately, the pipework in this part of the Costa Blanca is relatively new and regularly upgraded. However, the 1,000's of new properties now being built in the area will surely put tremendous pressure on the coast's limited resources. And the misery of the traffic jams on the N-332 during summer are set to continue for several more years.

Water supplies in the Costa del Sol are not as reliable. Málaga is having to finance 136 new projects to improve the water supply. There, €72 million will be spent on replacing old piping and €52 million on improving the network.

The lucky-lucky men and their ilk, are an utter nuisance on the beaches and bar terraces. They can be aggressive an form gangs when police arrive, particularly in Torrevieja. Most of their wares are dodgy, with even the mojitos they

sell are contaminated by human faeces. Their presence is also a real problem on the packed beaches of Benidorm.

In just 76 calendar days this year, the local police in Benidorm have issued 1,400 fines to these illegal traders. The fines, for just over two months, totalled €400,000. But guess what? None of these fines have been paid nor will be

floating in the lagoon at las Salinas despite it being prohibited.

Salt production in these lakes has been very poor this year. A target of 600,000 tons was planned for 2017, but heavy rains



in December and January now means that at most around 400,000 tons will only be produced this year. The Torrevieja facility produces salt for ten months of the year. The French owners, Groupe Salins, have already had to import 31,000 tons from their salt farms in Tunisia and Ibiza as demand has been exceeding the local supply. Half of the salt produced is used as table salt, the remainder for the chemical industry and the 'snowy roads' in northern Europe. Organised tours of the salt farm took place during August and it is hoped that during next year's season a tour of the facility will be included in the tourist-train route.

Alicante-Elche airport has had an incredibly busy summer season. The airport registered the passage of 65,000 passengers and 400 flights in just one day!

The grape crop locally is down this year, but the quality of the wine is expected to be good. If you like a robust red, try a bottle (or several) of Jumilla from Murcia.

A plague of rabbits are doing great damage to the table grapes and vines in some areas of the Vega Baja. Trying to eradicate them with shotguns put leaks in the watering pipes!

El País notes 'the number fatally drowned is already half the deaths on the roads'. In the first seven months this year 305 people have drowned in Spain, up 14.6% on the same time in 2016 while the number of road fatalities was 673. Most of these deaths have been caused by stupidness and rip-tides.

New Laws on Spanish Mortgages.

The government plans to introduce new laws governing mortgage transactions after the summer period. More transparency, information, ability to change conditions and greater protection for the consumer are promised.

To date the financial institutions have complained that the new laws demonise them whereas the customer associations complain that the new legislation favours the banks and "will only protect banks from extrajudicial and judicial claims".

Any improvements in this particular aspect of bank borrowing is welcome, particularly as the banks in Spain have demonstrated that with mis-selling and the ground floor clauses, they cannot be trusted.

What is interesting is that some of the new regulations are retroactive. I briefly outline some of the key changes hereunder.

Pre contract preparation: Previously unregulated, the lender will now have to offer all documentation to the client seven days before the signing of the mortgage. This will include much more information, including future options on variable aspects of the mortgage. With these papers, the client will be obliged to visit a notary to discuss any issues arising out of the terms. This visit to the notary is free!

Second Visit & Signing: The client will also have to visit (not free this time!) the notary again prior to the second signing of the mortgage. Both the notary and the registrar have an obligation not to authorize the contract if there are clauses therein declared to be abusive or if all the requirements have not been met. Notaries can face sanctions in case they do not fulfil these obligations.

Cross Selling: Banks will be prohibited from selling products linked to mortgages, as only packages deemed beneficial to the client and authorized by the Bank of Spain will be authorized. In addition, banks will only be able to charge a single opening commission.

There are a number of other major changes to the legislation, some very beneficial to the borrower. Due to lack of space I'll report on these in a future issue.



Half of Male Pensioners Frustrated Because Their Partner Has Given up Sex.

Half of male pensioners are sexually frustrated because their partner has given up making love, a survey has found.

The figures produced by ComRes show that one in six over-70s say they have sex a few times a month or more - but many are not having it as much as they would like.

Almost half told the BBC Radio 5 Live survey that they would like to have more sex than they currently do, but the figure is very different for women than for men.

Only 21% of women aged over 60 say this is the case, compared with 61% of men.

And half of men who would like to do it more say they can't because their partner is unwilling.

Sex is also more significant to older men than it is to women. 42% of men say it's an important part of their lives, compared to 16% of women.

Corinne Sweet, a sex therapist who works primarily with older clients, said she was surprised at the figures because she has found that women are less likely to lose their sex drive.

"Women are more like Duracell bunnies when it comes to sex, they tend to keep going for longer," she said.

Customers as old as 95 are now buying sex toys, with some recommended by NHS clinics.

Samantha Evans, who runs sex toy company Jo Divine, said: "Sometimes they go to the GP with problems and when they don't get helpful advice they think: 'I'm going to buy a vibrator!""

The survey of 1,330 over-60s also showed that one in ten have sex once a week, and 35% never have it at all.

Earlier this year a study by Coventry University suggested that regular sex could help the over-50s stay mentally sharp.





Hey Dude! Where's my \$1.5 million?

She was an ordinary bank employee in the small municipality of Almoradí, population 20,000, located in Spain's Alicante province. Yet for 25 years she lived far beyond her means: she owned a big house, drove a luxury car, and took expensive trips to exotic destinations with her partner, then openly boasted about it on social media.

The Spanish Civil Guard has just discovered the origin of her wealth: for a quarter century, she had allegedly been stealing from a Russian client who had an account at her bank.

Investigators believe that the suspect, a 51-year-old woman whose identity has not been disclosed, diverted \$1.5 million (around €1.28 million) in funds from an account held by a Russian national now aged 80. She is being charged with bank fraud and forging documents.

The investigation began a month ago, when the account holder filed a complaint with the local Civil Guard in Almoradí. The name of the bank has not been released either.


According to police sources, the Russian national arrived in Rojales, located eight kilometers from Almoradí, in 1992. He then opened a bank account in the latter municipality, and developed a relationship of trust with the suspect.

The account holder rarely checked his balance, but in June of this year he requested a detailed statement because he was considering switching banks. That is when he realized that over \$1.5 million was missing.

Investigators analyzed all the transactions linked to that account, and realized that most money transfers had taken place while the account holder was in Russia, meaning that he did not authorize them.

Every time the man returned to Russia, his bank balance would be depleted a little more. But every time he requested information about the balance, the employee would provide unofficial documents forged by herself, to make it look like his balance had not changed.

The suspect was arrested and released pending trial following her arraignment.



Men, Listen Up: Women Like The Smell Of Guys Who Eat A Certain Diet.

What we eat can influence more than our waistlines. It turns out, our diets also help determine what we smell like.

A recent study found that women preferred the body odour of men who ate a lot of fruits and vegetables, whereas men who ate a lot of refined carbohydrates (think bread, pasta) gave off a smell that was less appealing.

Skeptical? At first, I was, too. I thought this line of inquiry must have been dreamed up by the produce industry. (Makes a good marketing campaign, right?)

But it's legit. "We've known for a while that odour is an important component of attractiveness, especially for women," says Ian Stephen of Macquarie University in Australia. He studies evolution, genetics and psychology and is an author of the study.

From an evolutionary perspective, scientists say our sweat can help signal our health status and could possibly play a role in helping to attract a mate.

How did scientists evaluate the link between diet and the attractiveness of body odour?

They began by recruiting a bunch of healthy, young men. They assessed the men's skin using an instrument called a spectrophotometer. When people eat a lot of colourful veggies, their skin takes on the hue of carotenoids, the plant pigments that are responsible for bright red, yellow and orange foods.

"The carotenoids get deposited in our skin," explains Stephen. The spectrophotometer "flashes a light onto your skin and measures the colour reflected back," says Stephen. The results are "a good indicator of how much fruits and vegetables we're eating," he says.

Stephen and his colleagues also had the men in the study complete food frequency questionnaires so they could determine the men's overall patterns of eating. Then the men were given clean T-shirts and asked to do some exercise.

Afterward, women in the study were asked to sniff the sweat. (Note: The methodology was much more scientific and precise than my breezy explanation, but you get the picture.) "We asked the women to rate how much they liked it, how floral, how fruity," and a bunch of other descriptors, explains Stephen.

It's a small study, but the results were pretty consistent. "Women basically found that men who ate more vegetables smelled nicer," Stephen told us.

Men who ate a lot of meat did not produce a sweat that was any more — or less — attractive to women. But meat did tend to make men's odour more intense.

"This is not the first study to show that diet influences body odour," says George Preti, an adjunct professor in the dermatology department at the University of Pennsylvania and a member of the Monell Chemical Senses Centre in Philadelphia.

A study published in 2006 found that women preferred the odour of men who ate a non-meat diet, "characterized by increased intakes of eggs, cheese, soy, fruit and vegetables."

But Preti points out that the relationship between diet and body odour is indirect.

Some people think if they eat a garlic or onion — or a piece of meat — they will smell like that food. "But that's not what happens," Preti says. Your breath might smell like the food you eat, but not your sweat.

Body odour is created when the bacteria on our skin metabolize the compounds that come out of our sweat glands.

"The sweat doesn't come out smelly," Preti explains. "It must be metabolized by the bacteria that live on the surface of the skin."

Now, of course, at a time when good hygiene and deodorant use are commonplace, is the smell of our sweat a big concern?

I put that question to the happy hour crowd at a bar down the street from the NPR headquarters in Washington, D.C. "I'm pretty OK with my smell," Stefan Ruffini told me. That evening he was ordering a burger on a bun and a side of fries, along with a beer. When I told him about the findings of the study, he laughed it off. "I've got a girlfriend, so I don't worry about these things," he said.

The study did not assess diet and odour attractiveness among same-sex couples.

"As a lesbian, I haven't smelled a man in several years," Stacy Carroll, who was also at happy hour, told me. "I eat a lot of produce, I have a girlfriend, so it's working out."

Carroll says people who eat a lot of fruits and vegetables are more likely to be interested in their health — "feeling good, looking fit" — than their smell.


