Tourists from Germany and Ireland are believed to have dropped off. Turkey, Egypt and Tunisia have seen growth of 35% in the first quarter of this year.



> under draft proposals presented to MEPs as part of the European Commission's planning for Brexit. proposal emerged as the Home Office outlined how millions of EU citizens who wish to stay in the UK after Brexit would pay £65 for "settled status", with decisions on applications promised within a "matter of days". Hmmm. If this comes about, it will have a massive negative effect on Brit tourist trade to Spain.

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Crime Detection Rates Slump in UK.

Okay, nothing to do with Spain, but Brit' expat's will be interested in a survey where The Sunday Times has for the first time mapped every neighbourhood in England and Wales to provide an immediate, local snapshot of the 4.7m crimes committed in 2017, and, crucially, the proportion solved. You can read the full report here -

The online report contains a facility whereby you can enter your postcode to discover the number of unsolved crimes in your neighbourhood last year.

- Just 4% of robberies were solved in England and Wales last year, compared with 9% in 2013. The burglary detection rate fell during the same period from 6% to 3%.
- In more than 1,000 neighbourhoods with at least 30 crimes, the police failed to catch and punish any of the suspects.
- There were 355 burglaries last year in the Derbyshire Dales. The figures show that it is the only local authority area where **no burglaries were solved**.
- There were 159 robberies in Holloway Road and Highgate Hill in north London last year, the two streets most plagued by an epidemic of moped gang crime. To date, one offender has been caught and punished. (Moped gang crime is now very common. Even the current British home secretary, Sajid Javid, has revealed that he was mugged by a moped

gang outside Euston Station in London, and his new mobile phone snatched.)

Police crime figures reveal Rushcliffe in Nottinghamshire, south Buckinghamshire, south Cambridgeshire and Blackpool were among the areas with the lowest rates of solved crime: less than 5% of crime in 2017 resulted in offenders being caught and punished.

In 2010, there were over 141,500 police officers in England and Wales. This number has decreased steadily over the years to just 118,000 in 2017. Amber Rudd, the previous

home secretary, said there was no correlation between police numbers and crimes!

Uttlesford in Essex, introduced high-visibility foot patrols across the district, solving 26% of crime last year. Police forces that have some of the highest detection rates say the traditional

bobby on the beat plays a crucial role in solving crime. Michael Barton, chief constable of Durham, the police force that solves the highest proportion of crimes in England and Wales, said detection rates in his police authority had been boosted by "boots on the ground". More police please!

Although the **jail sentences in the Gurtel fraud case** appeared very tough - some 34 years - it is unlikely that any of the PP politicians or businessmen found guilty will serve more than 12 years. Also in Spain, if you are in jail and hit 70, you are usually released.

One particularly interesting case, Noos, has finished. This involved **the brother in law of the current king**, Iñaki Urdangarin, photo, who is married to Cristina de Borbón,



the sister to King Felipe VI. There were many doubt as to whether the establishment would allow him to actually go to jail. However, he returned from Switzerland about two weeks ago and began his prison sentence of five years and 10 months. He, like most of the 'great & the

good' was allowed to nominate his prison. He choose a woman's prison in Ávila, which has a small men's section attached. Urdangarin and others diverted €6.2 million from their 'non-profit' business organising sports events in Valencia and the Balearics, to their private accounts. A number of others were also jailed including the former premier of the Balearic region.

I know what you are thinking. Is corruption pervasive throughout Spain? Of course it is. One would hope it is on the decline, but it will take years.

The former PP regional head of the Murcia government, Eduardo **Zaplana**, who was also a minister under the national government of the then PP prime minister, Azner,

has been arrested along with a handful of others. He is charged with laundering as much as €20 million abroad to 'fiscal paradises' (Uruguay) being



'commissions' (backhanders) obtained from contracts ranging from ITV testing stations to wind farms. Zaplana has not been allowed bail as he is considered a flight risk. Zaplana, who at one time had a very heavy involvement in the Orihuela district, was blamed in one of the Spanish newspapers as the single individual who destroyed the Orihuela Costa coastline with too many housing developments. The photo of him above, from the Spanish media, is taking the piss, comparing him to a saint.

Nigel Farage, prominent among the Brexit campaigners, has been accused of hypocrisy after the referendum result. He sparked outrage by refusing to give up his taxpayer-funded EU pension after Brexit, asking: "Why should my family suffer?" It is understood the 53-year-old former Ukip leader will be entitled to an annual pension of £73,000 when he turns 63. Just more lies from Farage!

La Liga will use the Video Assistant Referee **(VAR)** system next season, says the country's football federation (RFEF). It can only be used under specific conditions: in the awarding of a red card, a penalty or to correct a case of mistaken identity for a carded player.

More than **6,000 women have ignored** in the last year the call of the Breast Cancer Prevention Unit (UPCM) to have a review in Elche. In the year 2017, 21,669 women were called, of whom 15,612 attended. In other words, three out of every ten women do not attend the requirement in order to be controlled by a simple mammogram, thanks to which it can be detected and, thus, avoid breast cancer or have it treated in time. Ignorance and the fear that pathology is detected are usually the main reasons.

Diario for Mallorca reports that the scant number of flats available in Palma have seen **shops and garages being converted into homes**. The Neighbourhood Federation opposes the changes approved blaming the shortage on the expanding number of tourism rentals. This unfortunately is seen throughout the Balearics and is part of the 'tourist dividend.' A small berthed yacht there is being rented out for accommodation - a bargain at 150 € a month 'close to the railway station'.

La Verdad for Murcia reports 'Saving the Mar Menor lagoon would need between 430 and 615 million € and ten years of work.' The ministry has issued an environmental report with four alternatives, the strictest would suppose changing the farming practices in 35% of the Cartagena farming land and the end of dumping of rubbish and nitrates under the slogan 'Zero rubbish'. 21 measures are proposed to correct the underground water channels which are leaking and a central network for the treatment of waste. The major impact on the lagoon is caused by watering crops, which has increased from 12% to 63% from more intensive farming and the boom in tourism. The lack of attention to the lagoon by the authorities has been staggering. Once again, all too often in the coastal areas, short term profit is God and damn the environment. Just take a look at our coastlines and ask yourself, 'Do the Spanish really care about the environment?'

The Guardia Civil allege that €3.26 million of public funds was embezzled by the Generalitat of Catalonia to finance the illegal referendum of October 1st last year. Unfortunately the new PM, Pablo Sanchez, has given back the control of their finances to the separatist Catalans. It's like giving a bottle of whiskey and the keys of the Porsche to a teenager!

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Still no beach bars on the Orihuela Costa! The geniuses in the town hall have been evaluating the first two stages of the tender for more than three weeks now. Even if a bidder is selected after the third stage, a period of time is allowed for the unsuccessful bidders to object to the winning bid. Allowing for the leaden feet at the town hall and 'the process' it is most unlikely that the beach bars will be open for the summer. Life guards will of course be on the beaches and the council will have to introduce port-a-loos. The absence of the bars and monitored toilets could cause the withdrawal of the Blue Flags in the area next year.

But the cock-ups are not just restricted to the OC coastline. They have also had a number of problems with the bars and facilities in Guardamar and Santa Pola. And in **Torrevieja**, none of the beach lifeguards have the special chairs necessary for their job. They have been obliged to us ordinary chairs to supervise the bathers and beaches, photo. In La Mata, some have been sitting on the sand! It seems



chairs for the lifeguards at a cost of €11,929. These are wooden structures two and a half metres high. The council also planned to spend €13,462 on minor repairs to seven wooden decks the lifeguards use. But then an authorised 'jobs-worth' functionario pointed out that both costs should be added together, and as the total amount is greater than €25,000, it must go out to public tender. Now looking at the leaden-footed bureaucracy in Orihuela, the evaluation of the contracts, the allocation of the awards together with the construction of the chairs, would take the timescale up to the late summer - early autumn! The council have now decided to spend €3,000 on repairing 21 of the old broken chairs and issue them to the lifeguards, as they become available. What a palaver!

€14.3 million euros was raised last year from the sale of plots in Orihuela Costa. Unfortunately, only a fraction of this will be invested back into the coastal area, the bulk going to the city and the outlining villages.

The absence of *chiringuitos* on the beaches of Orihuela Costa this summer will mean that hawkers selling **alcoholic drinks** will no doubt be selling drinks to the public on the beaches. The local health officials warn that the beverages sold by these street vendors pose a 'serious health risk', with no controls over the quality and the content.

A fishing fleet off Torrevieja caught 50 tons of anchovies in just one trip during early June. This equates to around **6,000 boxes of fish**, each box containing eight kilos of the tasty little fishies. At around €2 a kilo, the sale proceeds to the wholesalers would approach €100,000. This catch was welcome as the boats had previously experienced two weeks of fishing drought. Many of the boats unloading were from the port of Mazarrón, and from the coastal areas of the province of Almeria.

Información for Alicante reports, 'The new Government wants to **remove the AP-7 motorway tolls**(and four others) after 2020.' The governing PSOE in Madrid has opened the door to tool-free driving from Alicante to Tarragona. However the removal of these tolls could mean a loss in excess of €450 million of public money.

There was a Feria del Automóvil in Almoradi from June 8^{th} until the 10^{th} . Nine car dealerships had placed **400 used cars** in a single plot for sale, with prices ranging from $\in 3,000$ to $\in 100,000$.

Half a million people in the Community ask for money from family members to make ends meet. Informacion reports that there are more than **3,000 vulnerable people in the Alicante province** who are waiting for social housing. Some families have been waiting for 15 years! The Generalitat Valenciana is hoping to do a deal with three banks to allow repossessed properties to be allocated to this sector. The Generalitat would pay the rent while claiming it back from the tenants. In the first quarter this year, courts in Alicante have evicted 545 families. Eviction rates are now at their highest level for six years.

Benidorm is to introduce ordinance to prohibit the use of segways and electronic skateboards **on sidewalks** and pedestrian areas. The thriving tourist location has already restricted the use of electric wheelchairs to people over 55 years old or those who are younger and can prove a physical disability or injury.

Seven Ways to Minimise the Risk of Having a Stroke

Know the signs; early treatment prevents lasting damage

A stroke is the damage caused by a clot or a bleed in the brain. It is the major cause of serious long-term disability in the UK. A quarter of strokes occur in people under 65, and the damage caused ranges from minimal changes picked up on a scan, through to loss of speech, difficulty finding words and loss of power down one side of the body or face. Up to a fifth of strokes are fatal. Prompt diagnosis and treatment means a better outcome. The Fast test is useful: Face – can you smile? Is your face lopsided? Arms – can you raise them and keep them there? Speech – is it slurred or hard to understand? Time – to call 112 if you see any of these three signs. Other symptoms to urgently act on are sudden weakness or numbness on one side of the body, sudden blurred or loss of vision, unexplained confusion, a sudden fall and very severe headache.

Keep your blood pressure in check

High blood pressure is an important preventable risk factor. Have it checked at a pharmacy, GP surgery or buy your own gadget and check it yourself. In the US, pharmacists are checking and treating blood pressure in barbershops as black men are underdiagnosed, undertreated and underrepresented in clinical trials. There is evidence that, in the UK, people from African-Caribbean backgrounds are more prone to high blood pressure, strokes and diabetes although less prone to heart disease. (A blood pressure monitor costs around €20 + on amazon.es and you should let your GP know if readings are consistently over 140/90. Most pharmacies in Spain will check your BP.) Lifestyle changes and, if necessary, medication work for most. Some people's blood pressure remains high despite all conventional treatment; a new technique using ultrasound to zap part of the nerve supply to the kidneys offers hope for the most tricky cases.

Check your pulse

An irregular heart rate (atrial fibrillation, AF) increases the risk of stroke because the heart can throw off small bits of debris when it goes in and out of an irregular rhythm that travel up to the brain and cause a blockage. Thinning the blood (anticoagulation) significantly reduces the risk of strokes. AF may revert to normal, regular (sinus) rhythm on its own but tends to recur and it is this fluctuation that is most dangerous. The heart can also be given an electrical shock (cardioversion), treatment to destroy the rogue electrical source of the problem (ablation) or a pacemaker to override the irregular heart beat. Some people in AF will experience palpitations, but many won't feel any symptoms. The best way to detect it is to check your pulse; we all get occasional extra beats but if the rate is consistently irregular, see your GP. There are apps to diagnose and manage AF.

Are you diabetic?

One in 16 of us is living with diabetes and an estimated 12% don't know it. Undiagnosed and undertreated diabetes

is a major risk factor for stroke. You are more likely to be diabetic if it runs in your family, if you are overweight or have southeast Asian or African-Caribbean background. You can buy self-test kits, but it is cheaper and more holistic to get a complete NHS health check if you are aged 40-74 – or see your GP if you think you are at risk. If you are diagnosed with diabetes, careful management to get your blood glucose levels back to the normal range will reduce your stroke risk. If you are diabetic, your blood pressure should be kept under 140/80 and cholesterol below 5mmol/l to keep stroke risk as low as possible.

The more you smoke, the more you stroke

The more you smoke, the greater the risk, so if you can't quit, at least cut down. If you do manage to quit, your risk of stroke will be that of a never-smoker within five years. Vaping is almost certainly better than cigarettes, but there are concerns that the nicotine may still increase stiffness of arteries and the risk of heart disease and stroke.

Check your cholesterol

High levels of cholesterol in the blood can clog up arteries. If early heart disease or stroke (under the age of 60) runs in your family, you may have a genetic tendency to abnormally high cholesterol levels, even if you lead an impeccably healthy lifestyle. A one-off blood test (fasting) will tell you whether you have a problem or not. Again, you can buy a self-test kit or get it done at your GP surgery or pharmacy. To reduce the risk of heart disease and stroke, blood pressure, cholesterol and glucose levels all need to be measured; there is no point in treating one and ignoring the others. High cholesterol levels can be lowered by losing excess weight, by exercising, by cutting down on cholesterol-rich foods and, if necessary, by taking drugs such as statins; they get a bad press but they do work.

Mini-strokes

Transient ischaemic attacks (TIAs) cause the same warning signs as a stroke but typically last for about half an hour resolve completely within 24 hours. However, 40% of people with a TIA will go on to have a stroke, and the risk of that is greatest if you are over 70, have high blood pressure or diabetes and have symptoms that last longer than 90 minutes. Treatments for TIAs include blood thinning drugs (anticoagulation) and careful control of the risk factors (glucose, cholesterol and blood pressure). People are often dismayed that they end up on a cocktail of drugs despite having made a complete recovery from TIA, but it really is worth popping the pills to avoid a stroke.

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

Red Days in the Valencian Community 2018.

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
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Dates in late December 2018 and early January 2019 have been bandied about regarding the opening of **Corvera Airport.** However, there are still many approvals and licences required, which AENA cannot control, before any commercial flights will be allowed. However, EasyJet state that they will begin flights to and from the new airport from January 2019. As yet, they have no destinations announced. Jet2.com advise that they will be offering flights to and from the new airport in March 2019, with routes to Leeds Bradford with three weekly services (Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays) operating until 25th October 2019 and to Manchester, with three weekly services (Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays) also operating until 25th October 2019.

Seven of the nine operating theatres have been closed at the **Can Misses Hospital in Ibiza** due to the presence of fungus. The remaining two are now only used for emergencies.

The closed operating theatres on the island means flying patients to the Son Espases hospital in Mallorca and this has cost more than €190,000 for just nine patients. There has also been an invasion of flies into the quarantined area at Can Misses which is blamed on cracks in the facade.

Real Madrid's star soccer player Cristiano Ronaldo and captain of the Portugal team, has made an offer to

"Tell him," she whispers, "there is no toilet paper, hand soap, or paper towels in the ladies room."

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
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

Drugged Drivers!

Mutxamel is a municipality in the comarca of Alacanti. The Policia Local decided to organise a series of road blocks to test specifically for drug use among

drivers, the last block-test being about a year ago.
This time the police tested 32 motorists and, surprise, surprise, all bar one tested

We may not have any ambulances on the Orihuela Costa, but we do now have a little train! Yippee!

The Orihuela Costa tourist train, or "Orihuela Tren Turístico" started operating in June and will run until the end of September. There are two trains operate from 9am to



9pm daily. They are certainly cute, see photo, but as they have only two 'carriages', they can fill up very quickly.

With a travel time of 55 minutes each way, there are slight divergences in both routes, with the trains running from Campoamor beach to near the post office at Playa Flamenca. As the routes avoid the N-332 much of the route is north of that busy and dangerous road, so that some of the local beaches are missed. Scheduled stops include Playa Flamenca beach, La Zenia beach, Zenia Boulevard shopping centre, the port and beaches of Campoamor, and the Cabo Roig strip.

A single ticket costs just €3 and 'ankle-biters' travel free. Kids aged 5 to 12 & pensioners pay €2.50. There are also family rates and a ticket will last you the whole day for several trips! Lots more info on the train together with timings, routes and scheduled stops are on the dedicated website, which is in several languages including English.

€350,000 has also been allocated by the city to repair a monument dedicated to the victims of the Madrid train bombings, which collapsed some years ago. See photos.





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
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

Brooks also started off at the Radisson Blu before being moved to another hotel. He spent 243 nights in hotel accommodation, costing RBKC more than £49,000. He racked up a room service bill of £276 and charges of £9,000 on a pre-paid credit card, and was also given an Oyster card. In total, he claimed £58,396 in relief intended to help the victims of the fire, while Douglas claimed £67.123.

I have been using amazon.es now for some time and it has a number of advantages.

Firstly they offer Amazon Prime at a much cheaper rate than in the UK. Whereas in the UK Prime cost around £80 a year or £8 a month, Prime in Spain cost just €20 a year.

Prime in Spain will give you free and fast carriage on many eligible items sold on the site - but not all! It also gives you free access to AmazonTV (if you have a smart TV). This contains many movies and TV series, most of which are in English, with English subtitles also available on some programs. I have found the content to be excellent viewing.

Another handy element to amazon.es is that you can also search in English. So, if you enter say 'inflatable sex doll,' guess what pops up! No need to search the Spanish phrase book now!
