Well it has been two months since the last newsletter and a lot has been happening during the holiday period.

The most dramatic political news here in Spain has been the regional elections in Andalucia. Here the socialists have been kicked out after 37 years in power. The new regional government there is now a mix of the conservative Partido Popular and the liberal Ciudadanos with the right-wing Vox party supporting them against the Left. More on this inside. But it has been the success of the far-right Vox party in those elections which shocked and surprised not only the media and polls but has acted as a 'wake-up call' to the traditional political parties. Read about it on page 4.

The other main dramatic but also tragic news has been the search for a two-year-old boy, Julen, who fell down a 110metre-deep borehole on January 13, while playing on the land of a relative in Totalán, Málaga. The country held its breath as miners and rescue teams - 300 people in all - worked for 13 days in difficult terrain to locate the boy. His lifeless body was finally found on Saturday, January 26. Unfortunately this was the second tragic event for the family as their other son, a three year-old, died unexpectedly of a heart attack during 2017, while the family was walking along a local beach.

The Brexit mess in the UK continues to dumbfound with the ineptitude, wishful thinking and plain stupidity of the politicians there. Despite little if any good news or reassurance coming from Downing Street, more comforting noises are coming from the Spanish government. See page 25 & 39.

There have been some major changes in the Spanish rental market. While tourist rentals in many areas are probably keeping ordinary rental rates high, the government is trying to introduce new controls. More details on page 29.

The hardworking and effective charity, HELP Vega Baja is looking for volunteers - check page 38. They have also launched 'Meeting Places' with their trained listeners - The Connection Team - take a look at page 3. Please help out.

The Connections Team are part of HELP Vega Baja (registered charity) that has been helping people in the community for over 36 years...... As it is now two months since the last Dream Scene, it is worth reviewing the main political events in Spain during that period. Try not to fall asleep!

The main news, and it has been quite dramatic, was the **regional election in Andalucia** on December 2. Here the socialist PSOE reigned for the 37 years since Spain returned to democracy after the Franco era. Encouraged by a number of polls which indicated an increase in voting for the socialists nationally, the socialist president of the region Susana Díaz, photo, decided to call an early regional election



for early December. It was a disastrous decision for the socialists who, having expected to win lost 14 seats to give them just 33 seats, well short of a majority 55. The right of centre PP lost seven seats to win just 26.

The parties which upset the political apple cart were the liberal Ciudadanos (Citizens) Party who went from 9 to 21 seats, Adelante Andalucia - a local variant of the far-left Podemos Party, who secured 17 seats and Vox, a far-right party which took 12 seats. After the shock defeat of the ruling PSOE, the emergence of Vox in what was traditionally a socialist region, was a major surprise. Having never gained a seat in any region, they now secured 391,000 votes as against 18,000 in 2015. Their 12 seats have now allowed the PP with 26 seats, the 21 of Ciudadanos to form a majority. The PP have selected their regional president and will now rule the region with the assistance of Ciudadanos. However, Ciudadanos will not speak to the Vox party as they consider them to be too extreme, so it will be interesting to see how long the new government and relationship will last.

Vox's surprise gains in the region has now encouraged

the party to put forward candidates for the upcoming regional and municipal elections this May. This could be bad news for the conservative PP nationally as many



voters on the right will drift towards Vox. More on Vox and its policies in the next issue of the newsletter.

'**Tourism flats** in Marbella are the 4th most expensive in the world' – according to a new study by the University of Málaga, placing Marbella only behind New York, London and Barcelona. The high rental rates for tourist accommodation nationally is pushing all rental rates upwards.

It is now 12 years since Spain's anti-smoking legislation was introduced. However, there are now **more smokers** in the country than before the legislation was introduced.

The supermarket chain **Mercadona** is 'testing the waters' in Portugal. The Portuguese project will start this summer with the opening of the first of four stores planned in Porto. They continue to be Spain's most successful supermarket.


Now looking at the national government, PM Sanchez's socialists only have 84 lawmakers out of 350 and in order to pass the national budgets for 2019, need the support of a far-left coalition led by Podemos - 67 seats - as well as other lawmakers, the most crucial being the 17 Catalan separatists. His problem is that when you do a deal or deals with the devil it carries a price. Podemos have a string of requirements they have submitted for action, although Sanchez's government haven't acted on even one. Although the PM has now pumped more money into Catalonia than in any previous years, the Catalan separatists want more, including the release of the jailed separatists. If Sanchez decides to interfere with the courts, nationally it would be political suicide. As with other socialists, he was surprised with the results from the regional elections in Andalucia and any hopes he had of calling a snap general election were dashed. He will now probably just run his term until the end of 2019. First votes on the proposed budgets are due mid-February.

Spain's audit office on Monday ordered former separatist Catalan president Artur Mas and nine others to **repay €4.9 million** of public money spent on staging a 2014 illegal independence referendum. I guess all their assets are in the wife's name by now!

Okay, enough politics! Although the warmer climate in Spain is wonderful for fruit and veg' growing, unfortunately the pests and parasites also thrive in hot weather. The destructive **almond wasp** has decimated almond groves in parts of Castilla-La Mancha and the Community of Valencia. The wasp has now been detected in two groves in nearby Jumilla and Yecla in Murcia. Almond growers in that province have now been warned that if they do not burn the wasp-infected trees, they will face fines of up to $\in 120,000$.

Forty-seven women have been killed by their partner or ex-partner in Spain during 2018. Although still an unbearable figure it is the lowest since the official statistics of sexist violence began. In the last fifteen years 975 women have died at the hands of their partners or ex-partners. Staggering!

A three-year-old boy choked on a grape in Gijón trying to eat 12 grapes to the sound of the 12 chimes at midnight on New Year's Eve. Tragic.

So, let's set the scene! It's 3:00am in this bar in Oviedo in early December, where this 25-year-old **would-be Romeo** decides to chat up this young lady. She doesn't respond favourably to him so he gives her a violent push. Big mistake! Five female friends of the young lady pounce on the assailant and proceed to beat the shit out of him using fists, a glass of cider, a bottle of beer, chairs and pepper sprays. Fortunately for this now heavily bleeding idiot whose white t-shirt had now also turned burgundy, some off-duty local police managed to rescue him by dragging him from the melee and load him into an ambulance. Two men, aged 56 and 37, both of Moroccan nationality, were arrested by the Guardia Civil in Murcia. It is believed that **they stole 115 cars** in Murcia, Mula, Caravaca de la Cruz, Cartagena, Fuente Alamo, San Javier and the Alicante towns of Orihuela, Cox, Bigastro, Crevillent and Catral. The thieves specialized in stealing older models, the Peugeot 205 and the Citroën C-15, with the same engine and transmission system, which are highly valued in the black market of their country and Mauritania. They hid them in industrial warehouses in Crevillente and Catral before smuggling the parts via the Algeciras ferry to Morocco.

Public prosecutor in Spain has accused Shakira, a pop singer of $\notin 14.5$ million **tax fraud**. The Colombian singer allegedly feigned residency in the Bahamas despite residing in Catalonia most of the year. After Messi was fined and given a suspended jail sentence last year, Cristiano Ronaldo, footballer or soccer player as we Irish call 'em, has been given a 23-month jail sentence and an $\notin 18.8$ million fine after reaching a deal with the public prosecutor and the Tax Agency, having admitted committing four tax offences between the years of 2011 and 2014. Being two year or less, the sentence will not usually be served. One must question the wisdom of the advisors to some of these people, or maybe they are just too greedy!

Whereas there is a steady influx of **illegal immigrants** from North Africa to the southern coast of Spain, the country's enclaves in North Africa have a continuing



invasion from sub-Saharans. Hidden under car seats or within the engines of cars, these methods are regularly used to

try and enter either Cueta or Melilla. This is a photo of one of two would-be immigrants who tried to enter Melilla hidden in mattresses.

The Spanish government has announced plans to fight the rise of "alternative medicine" and pseudo-therapies (including homeopathy and acupuncture) that they say have no basis in science. It says it wants to "eliminate" such therapies from health centres, and prohibit universities from including any element of them in degree courses. Under the proposed rules, anyone who is given treatments the must be told they not work! 'do According to a 2016 poll, 50% of people in Spain believe that homeopathic products work, and they are widely sold in pharmacies and are often expensive. have been pressing Doctors reforms since a series of widely publicised deaths. In one case, a 21-year-old man died after ending his hospital treatment for leukaemia in favour of a treatment by a "naturopath", who told him he could be cured with vitamins. Unfortunately cases like this are not uncommon. Ignorance is a major problem. Staff in socalled 'health-stores' will hide their quackery behind white coats.

Fancy a Ride?

While in the Torrente 5 attraction at the fair in Alicante (photo), a four-year-old boy got his foot trapped in a metal trapdoor. A group of four people, including his parents, couldn't free the young boy's foot and it was not until someone brought a screwdriver that the child's foot was released from the metal plate. Unfortunately, several of his toes were practically severed. There was an ambulance parked outside the attraction but those in the vehicle said they couldn't start the ambulance and take the child to the hospital. The father then took the child to the Alicante General Hospital in his own car. Because of the severity of the injuries to the child's toes, he was then taken to the Hospital de Manises where, during a four-hour operation, a team of doctors had to reconstruct several veins as well as the tendons.

The attraction, which was sealed by the National Police on the night of the incident, was reopened to the public less than 24 hours later.

The Failure of The Dependency Law.

which is available for physically or mentally challenged people or for old people is supposed to be covered by the Law of Dependency.

The waiting list to collect any of the allowances and benefits authorised within the Law of Dependency at (Ley de Dependencia) for Alicante increased by Santa Pola almost a thousand people between June and early The Department of Equality and on the November 2018. evening of attribute the backlog to the inability of the various municipalities to process applications. "We are there passing surveys to all the municipalities because we a know that there are many municipalities that have a huge jam of files because there is a lack of staff," says accident at Paloma Cascales, lawyer for the Platform for the Defence of the Alicante Dependency Law. Cascales also attributes this situation to the high number of applications submitted to be a beneficiary of the law. During November, there have been almost 750 applications filed in the province, the highest figure since June.

Currently, according to figures from the Department

of Equality, there are 7,678 people in the province of Alicante waiting for some aid from the law. At the same time, the number of beneficiaries is 22,481, the highest figure since counting started in 2015.

Nationally the backlog is

immense. More than 7,000 applicants have died before their case was assessed. This is because the evaluation by the social workers at the local authorities takes so long. It is undoubtedly true that too much is expected of them, but when it was recently reported that it takes two years for an autistic child to receive their degree of assessment, the situation is clearly intolerable.

The former prime minister, Rajoy, described the Dependency Law as an 'absolute failure.' Whereas most agree with that, no one is prepared to jump in the ring and change it to meet the demands and requirements of modern Spain.

My wife, Tid, applied for a disability car sticker to park in the reserved blue spaces. It took seven meetings/interviews/appointments, а medical examination in Alicante and 18 months to get the sticker. Living in Spain teaches patience! Saying that, I've just renewed my Spanish driving licence in two weeks! Hallelujah!

Local News

We have in previous issues commented on problems the Policia Local have in being properly funded by the Orihuela and Torrevieja local councils. This neglect now seems to have spread to the Local Police in Callosa de Segura. In the past, the police here had to purchase their own **bullet-proof vests** for several years. The socialist councillor responsible says that the council will now subsidise part of the purchase of these vests, which can cost around €900 each. If a local policeman/woman now wants one they will have to pay around €100. Unfortunately, the complaints of lack of resources, poor equipment and understaffing is now happening in dozens of municipalities throughout the province.

Local Police are now using a **drone** in the Benidorm area to search for illegal immigrants disembarking from boats. 11 were detained during one operation in December.

In 1998, the then PP mayor of Orihuela, José Manuel



Medina, generously granted the concession of a 75year lease at only $\notin 2,700$ p.a. to a developer Domingo Alcocer, owner of Doalco, for the


operation of a new underground car parking facility in Orihuela. Over two decades the municipality has been ruled by three PP councils and one Socialist/Green Party. But during March last year, Cambiemos Orihuela (Change Orihuela) - a small opposition party, pointed out that the car parking facility never paid any IBI - the local property tax, for 20 years! After many excuses and much fumbling, the current council announced that the concessionaire will only have to pay the IBI for four years - \pounds 52,000, that's \pounds 13,000 per year, but will be 'forgiven' the charge of \pounds 208,000 for the other 16 years as the council cannot enforce it.

Orihuela City Council have had to compensate a 64-yearold woman with $\in 6,075.71$. The woman was leaving a football match in the municipal stadium of Los Arcos in Orihuela when **she tripped outside the ground** and suffered a bruise to her knee. Bad street lighting was blamed. The event occurred in October 2015 and although she was released without hospitalisation from the Vega Baja Hospital, she claimed the injury forced her to be disabled for 50 days and another 70 days of 'convalescing.'

Corvera Airport has finally opened in Murcia, with King Felipe doing the honours in early January. The first aircraft to land was operated by Ryanair, coming from East Midlands. Up to the end of March, flights to and from the airport will be offered by Ryanair, Easyjet and TUI. Summer flights, if they are already organised, are difficult to check. More on the Corvera routes as they are announced. It is now 10 years since the local land was expropriated. Unfortunately, the nearer airport at **San Javier is now closed**. The Christmas period in Spain extends from

Christmas Eve (a big family night for the Spanish) right up to the Three Kings on January 6.

One of the Three Kings in Orihuela went a bit crazy with the eye makeup. I thought he looked a bit like a **'zombie'**





particularly after the local bars have closed!

When you check out these photos, you can understand if the kids still have nightmares.

Christmas Day saw the usual influx of expats to the beach **at La Zenia**. This year thousands, possibly as many at 8,000, many wearing red Santa hats packed the area. It was so crowded I thought the actual overall image was horrific. It looked more like a mob than a celebration. No thanks!

The long promised **Emergency Centre** for Orihuela Costa has been delayed further. What is delaying it now are bureaucratic routines and differences on the funding between the local council and the regional authorities. It seems that $\in 2.2$ million is available for the project but I think this is wholly inadequate for such a development.

Earlier building works were halted in December 2012 when the builder 'went bust', photo. The supposed new end-date for



completion by end 2020 will not now be met.

The Catalan Gravy Train.

The extensive public sector of the Catalan Generalitat employs more than 245,000 people . They represent 9% of the total salaried workers in Catalonia. In round numbers, therefore, in this region one in every ten active workers is on the payroll of the Autonomous Administration . The Catalan Government already spends more than 7,500 million euros per year in salaries- seven and a half billion euros!

The average cost of an employee of the Generalitat is around 44,000 euros per year, which includes gross salary and Social Security contributions. And this is only counting the employees that are in the Administration proper - including Health and Education. Added to this are thousands of contracted workers in a type of "parallel administration" that make up public companies and other entities controlled and funded by the Generalitat.



According to the latest wage studies of the National Institute of Statistics (INE), a public employee charges in Catalonia, on average, 39% more than salaried employees of private companies. The average annual gross salary of Catalan public employees is around \notin 31,500 per year -without counting Social Security contributions to be paid to the Administration that has hired them. In the Catalan private sector, the average gross salary barely reaches 22,700 euros per year.

In the regional ranking, Extremadura is the community with the greatest weight of public employment over the total. The workers who reside in Extremadura and are on the payroll of the State, the Board or the local administration reach 88,886 - 28.6% of the total salaried employees. It is followed by Castilla y León (23.1%), Castilla-La Mancha (22.4%) and Asturias (20.2%).

On the opposite side, Catalonia stands out, where only 11% of salaried employees are in the public sector.

25.5% of workers in Extremadura are civil servants, followed by Andalusia, Castilla y León, Castilla-La Mancha and Aragón, which have between 16 and 20% of public employees over their total. Catalonia has the lowest percentage, only 10%.

ATTENDANCE ALLOWANCE

Attendance Allowance is a benefit for people aged over 65 and who may need extra help to stay independent at home, due to an illness or disability.



IMF Cautions Spain.

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) is asking Spain to monitor the price of real estate following a rebound of the property market after years of crisis. After analysing late 2017 statistics, the global agency has detected early signs of "a slight overvaluation," although it stressed that there is still nothing like a new housing bubble in Spain.

The IMF finds that house prices increased by around 15% between 2014 and 2017, but that sales are being driven by existing housing stock rather than new housing. Another change from pre-crisis days is that the home ownership rate has dropped from 80% to 77% as people increasingly turn to the rental market.

Analysts are nevertheless concerned about the new upward trend of housing prices, which could lead to excessive trust and a relaxation of loan application requirements and building criteria. Additionally, household savings levels are at historic lows as homeowners believe themselves to be wealthier.

The IMF has been telling Spain for years to create an agency to monitor systemic risks, or in other words, to assess financial hazards in order to prevent imbalances and bubbles. And now that the property market is picking up speed again, there is an added sense of urgency.



Agents of the National Police have arrested two men in the Valencian town of Tavernes Blanques, as alleged perpetrators of 69 robberies in which they seized about 17,500 euros from recreational and slot machines located in restaurants in the city of Valencia.

Your Local Voting Rights in Spain.

Madrid and London have negotiated a bilateral treaty to maintain local voting rights for the 300,000 British nationals living in Spain and the more than 115,000 Spaniards residing in the UK. The agreement was signed on Monday, January 21st. Of the 90,000 Brit's who have already registered to vote in Spain, 63,000 are in the province of Alicante, according to the latest INE data for 2017. The timing of this is most important as both countries are holding municipal elections in May. British residents in Spain have a deadline to show their willingness to vote in municipal elections - if they have not done so in previous elections - until January 30. Chances are if you are reading this and have not voted previously in Spain or indicated your wish to do so, it may now probably be too late to register for the May elections, but you can always apply anyway.

According to diplomatic sources, Spain is the first EU country to sign an agreement of this type with the United Kingdom . The negotiation began at the end of October. This agreement is necessary regardless of whether the Brexit occurs with or without agreement, because this aspect of citizens' rights is not provided for in the exit agreement. For the municipalities of May 26, there is a transitional provision according to which the nationals of the United Kingdom who are registered on January 30, 2019 in the Electoral

Census of Resident Aliens in Spain for municipal elections will not have to fulfil other requirements and their Registration will remain valid.

Article 3 of the agreement establishes that British nationals must have a period of legal and uninterrupted residence of three years. Thus, in the municipal elections of 2023, all British nationals who are registered for the 2019 municipal elections may participate.

The text also specifies that the continuity of British local



elected officials is guaranteed until the end of their term, even after the United Kingdom leaves the European Union. In Spanish municipalities there are about thirty councillors of British nationality. Unfortunately in both the Torrevieja and Orihuela

municipalities there are no British councillors despite the high numbers of British expats residing there.

The United Kingdom will not be the first country outside the EU whose nationals can vote in the Spanish municipal elections, given that Spain already has agreements for this with Bolivia, Cape Verde, Chile, Colombia, South Korea, Ecuador, Iceland, Norway, New Zealand, Paraguay, Peru and Trinidad and Tobago.



The Nun's Story

Two nuns have admitted stealing a "substantial" sum of money from the school they worked at to go gambling in Las Vegas.

Sisters Mary Kreuper and Lana Chang, photo, are believed to have taken up to \$500,000 from St James' Catholic



School in the city of Torrance, near Los Angeles, to spend in casinos over a period of ten years. This figure is expected to rise following an audit in December 2018. The pair, who are said to be best friends and recently retired, worked at the school. Kreuper was the school principal for 29 years and Chang worked as a teacher for about 20 years.

The nuns were allegedly able to conceal their actions by depositing cheques made out to the school for tuition and other fees into a separate bank account not used by the

school. Also every autumn, the school held a Harvest Festival fundraiser, with rides and food booths. Families each had to put in \$100 and buy a ticket for the Big Red Raffle. Chang was one of the raffle winners every year!

The church does not want to press charges and wanted to resolve the situation internally, with the money repaid and the nuns disciplined by their order. In a letter to the parishioners, the two nuns "asked for forgiveness and prayers"and asked for \$50 to be put on Black!

Parents whose children attended the school in Torrance long believed that the campus was financially strapped. Textbooks were 2 decades old. There wasn't enough money for new basketball uniforms. When parents would ask,

year after year, for an awning to shade their children's outdoor lunch area; the principal, Sister Mary Margaret Kreuper, would respond, "How do you expect to pay for it?"

But oddly, this was not an isolated incident. Sister Marie Thornton, 62, blew more than \$850,000 she embezzled from New York's Iona College to support a wicked gambling addiction. Sister Marie was in charge of the Catholic school's finances between 1999 and 2009, during which time she submitted false invoices and had the college pay her credit card debts. During regular weekend trips to casinos in Atlantic City over a ten year period, she would lose between \$2,000 and \$5,000 a visit.

Major Changes to Spanish Rental Law - Lev de Arrendamientos Urbanos - LAU

A number of significant changes to the Spanish rental system were introduced during 2018. Much of these relate to long term rentals and holiday rentals. I outline some of the changes below but it is not a comprehensive list.

Tax Reporting.

Property portals and estate agents who handle rentals for clients, now have to disclose the relevant tax related details to the Spanish tax authorities. These include name & address of owners, names of renters and details of individual stays, amounts paid and more. Details for the year 2018 must be reported now. Although the Hacienda have only asked for details for 2018, they can if they wish go back four years.

These new tax laws now force estate agents and property portals such as AirBnb and others, to report the rental income of clients or face draconian fines of up to $\notin 600,000$.

Fines for non-payment of tax on rental income range from 50 to 150% of the undeclared amounts, plus delay interest. Any unpaid tax can be placed as a charge against the Spanish property.

Holiday/Tourist Lettings/Rentals & Urbanisations.

There is no doubt that in some instances holiday rentals have caused many headaches for full time residents. This has usually been, but not exclusively, in apartment blocks where a handful of noisy summer rentals ruins the peace and tranquillity of long-term residents.

Up until now, if an urbanisation wanted to ban tourist rentals, Spain's Horizontal Property Act outlined that unanimity among the owners was required to ban them. Naturally, a single owner could then vote against this and the ban could not be introduced.

However, the relevant Act has now been amended allowing the Community of Owners to vote by a simple majority of 3/5 to ban outright holiday rentals within a community.

Dick Gregory Another new amendment to the Act advises that in the case of holiday lettings, the Community of Owners can increase the communal quota assigned to a landlord of the overall community budget. This increase is capped at 20% of the quota. Simply put, communities of owners may now vote to increase the community quota of a property owner who uses his property or properties as holiday lettings.

None of the above changes apply retroactively.

I have had to ring-fence the followin info' as the Spanish Congress kicked out the new law on Jan' 23!So for the present only long-term tenancy agreement signed between the 19th of December 2018 and the 22nd of January 2019 will be ruled by the new decree explained below.

Changes to Long Term Rentals. 2019 will see the following changes:

Physical landlords: 5 years mandatory renewal period on long-term rentals (plus 3 years tacit renewal periods). Previously it was three years plus one.

Legal landlords: 7 years mandatory rental period on longterm rentals (plus 3 years tacit renewal periods). Previously it was three years plus one.

Legal landlords: additional bank guarantees demanded by a landlord on long-term rentals may not exceed a two-month deposit. Landlords typically request additional guarantees besides the compulsory one-month tenant deposit, especially when a tenant is a non-resident (because of the increased financial risk). These guarantees are now capped for legal persons acting as landlords. For physical landlords there is no change and may keep requesting additional guarantees in excess of the 2-month deposit.

Legal landlords: landlords – by law – will pay the commission to estate agencies on tenancy agreements: it was the case that tenants paid half or all this commission whether directly or not.

Just how much are the UK and the US ready to sacrifice in order to keep their neighbors out? Both countries are ending another tense week of trying to answer this question.

In the UK, prime minister Theresa May barely survived a noconfidence vote, and the country still has no Brexit deal—nor any clarity on whether it should continue with the process. So far, that process has contributed to the economy suffering a 2.1% contraction, and a no-deal Brexit could make the situation worse than it was in 2008.

Meanwhile, the US is enduring the longest-ever government shutdown, which has left 800,000 federal workers without pay and could cost the economy more than \$6 billion, as the president holds the budget hostage over his campaign promise of a wall on the southern border. Eventually, a prolonged shutdown could help push the US into a recession (paywall) as well.

Brexit, the shutdown, the wall: These all stem from the same political pursuit to keep immigrants out. The issue has been sold



as economic people worried for their jobs, their savings, their welfare. But given the losses that supporters of Brexit and the wall are

willing to accept, it's increasingly clear that xenophobia is at the core.

Xenophobia is a composite of two words from ancient Greek, one meaning "fear" and the other "stranger" or "enemy." But as we watch these governments bend over backwards to keep out a relatively small number of foreigners, "fear" does not seem to be the right word.

"Hatred" does. A hatred of the foreigner portrayed as dangerous, ill-intentioned, and undeserving. And not just any foreigner: the poor, the jobless, the non-white. Also the non-Christian: Trump recently tweeted about "prayer rugs" allegedly found at the border—the ultimate sign of its dangerousness.

All that is ironic, given what these governments are hanging themselves up for: a hatred that's quietly growing so large it's destroying their stability from within, all for fear of someone coming from the outside to do the same.



Who Let the Dogs Out?

During the Christmas/holiday period, a couple of stories concerning dogs (and pets) caught my attention.

In the first, the Local Police have opened an investigation after 18 dogs of a potentially dangerous breed were abandoned together in a fenced children's playground in Seville. According to users of the park, the animals were left there between four and seven in the early morning of Jan' 7. The dogs are a cross between two breeds classified as potentially dangerous: the American Stafford and the Presa Canario. The 18 dogs, who are in good health, are now in the Municipal Zoosanitary and, if the owners do not appear, they will be included in an animal adoption program.

This second story I find a bit disturbing. Britain has a long-held reputation as a nation of animal lovers. Historically, Britain was the first country in the world to implement animal protection laws, with legislation put in place as far back as 1822. However, during the run-up to WWII, the British government formed National Air Raid Precautions the Animals Committee in 1939 to decide what to do with all their animals once war broke out. The committee's primary concern was food shortages made worse due to people feeding their pets, so to curtail this potential problem, they sent out a pamphlet called "Advice to Animal Owners" ... which came with an advertisement for a specific type of gun. You can see where this is going.



The pamphlet advised the population that if they could not send their pets into the countryside, "it really is kindest to have them destroyed." How did the British population take this order? With protests across the Isles, surely? Not exactly. Within the course of a week, 750,000 family pets were "destroyed." "Sorry Billy. We had to put Rover down. We don't want him barking in German."

IDIOTS & ODDITIES OF THE MONTH

Almost 250 runners in a half marathon in Shenzhen, China, were caught cheating when traffic cameras captured them taking shortcuts through bushes. Organisers of the race also discovered 18 runners wearing fake number stickers and three runners they described as "imposters". Footage captured by Shenzhen police traffic cameras showed runners cutting through bushes to an adjacent carriageway, instead of continuing along the road and making a U-turn. Organisers said the 237 people caught cheating would have run two or three kilometres less than the full 21-kilometre (13.1-mile) distance. The annual race in China's fourth largest city typically attracts about 16,000 runners. Last year, organisers of the Beijing Half Marathon introduced a facial recognition system to stop runners using ringers to run on their behalf!

Closer to home, the 30th Annual Half-Marathon took place at Santa Pola during January. Over 4,000 athletes took part,



but the first three who crossed the tape, Ethiopians, were disqualified as it seems they, probably unwittingly, did not stick to the prescribed course. Moroccan Hassam Ahouchar, who came fourth, was awarded first prize.

Drinking and online shopping, it's often said, don't go together. And an unnamed Chinese man has revealed

that he woke up with a hangover after the annual Singles' Day shopping frenzy – China's answer to Black Friday – to find that he'd a bought a Thai mini pig, a peacock and a giant salamander. "All along I thought I'd only bought two sets of clothes," he said. Specsavers?

A Norwegian warship worth £385m has sunk after smashing into an oil tanker in Hjeltefjord, off the coast near Bergen. KNM Helge Ingstad – a 5,290-ton, 134-metre frigate, which was under Nato command at the time of the collision and is armed with missiles, torpedoes and depth charges – was on an exercise when it hit a (much-bigger) Maltese-flagged oil tanker early on 8 November. A large hole was torn in the warship's side, and the Norwegian navy beached the vessel in an attempt to save it. It finally sank five days later after the cables holding it in place snapped, bringing the rescue attempt to a dramatic end. It was one of only five ships in Norway's navy.

I have to admit that I was surprised at the small size of the Norwegian Navy. I can remember when the Irish Navy had only three ships and the first verse of a Dubliner's song went as follows:

> "The Cliona, the Maeve and the Macha, The pride of the Irish Navy, When the Captain he blows on his whistle All the sailors go home for their tea."

The Irish Navy now has eight ships and 1.049 personnel.

When a resident of Barking and Dagenham in east London recognised a woman caught on CCTV illegally dumping a mattress on the council's "wall of shame" website, he reported her – even though she was his wife! The man called Barking and Dagenham's "grime crime" hotline and

his wife – from whom he is not estranged – was issued with a ± 150 fixed penalty, which she paid. Council leader Darren Rodwell thanked him for "letting us know who has done this, despite their circumstances." I do believe this guy should get a permanent food taster now, just in case.

A 31-year-old jail inmate who was being transported to

answer charged in another county escaped from authorities in Kentucky. After he ran to a highway he tried hitchhiking and was soon picked up by a motorist. The United Nations came into existence to vanquish Germany, as 26 nations jointly pledged in 1942 not to surrender to "savage and brutal forces seeking to subjugate



National Police have arrested a 43-year-old man in a commercial establishment in València, as the alleged perpetrator of robbery with violence and intimidation, after stealing a cheese and an Iberian shoulder of ham that cost 28 euros, according to the police who were called to a supermarket in the district of Trànsits de València. When the police arrived they found that moments before the thief had tried to leave the place without paying, at which point he was intercepted by the security guard but managed to escape after a struggle. Naturally, he was immediately collared by the police.

A stone circle estimated to be 4,500-years-old caused huge excitement when it was found in Aberdeenshire in December. The county council called it an "amazing" discovery; Historic Environment Scotland said its "rich lichen cover" was proof "of the ring's antiquity". But research into it has now come to an abrupt halt: the former owner of the land has called to explain that it was he who built the circle 20 years ago. "It's disappointing to learn of this development," said the council, "but it adds an interesting element to its story."



Medical Negligence in Spain

According to National Public Radio in the States, as many as 440,000 patients die each year as a result of medical errors or negligence. No doubt the subsequent compensation claims account for the incredibly high settlements and high insurance rate for the medical profession in the US.

Looking at the situation in Spain, during 2018 there were 14,335 denuncias registered in the country in relation to medical negligence. Of these, 352 complaints were lodged on behalf of patients who died. (Unfortunately the same source then said that complaints regarding medical fatalities last year came to 810!)

The Valencian Community registered a total of 70 deaths due to alleged bad errors in the health field. In the province of Alicante these came to 24 deaths relating to malpractice from a total of 501 complaints.


In the Valencian Community, the top five hospitals for complaints, in order of ranking, were Hospital Universitari i Politècnic La Fe, Hospital General Universitario de Alicante, Hospital General Universitario de València, Hospital de Manises and Hospital General Universitario de Elche. You will note none of our local hospitals are on this list.

Among the most reported were medical errors were in General Surgery, Traumatology, Waiting Lists, Gynaecology and Emergency.

There is no doubt that rapid and effective care and treatment can vary enormously from area to area. In some areas, people have to wait two weeks to see their GP. A medical malpractice association, Defensor del Paciente, collated the data above and also reported that "What hit us the most in 2018 was the large number of patients with carcinogenic diseases that were kept months and months waiting for treatment or intervention."

Fortunately, in our local area, waiting lists are relatively short and medical standards appear quite high, but mistakes can and do occur - fortunately not too often.

Assurances from PM Sanchez.

With an estimated 750,000 UK nationals living in Spain, the socialist government of PM Sanchez has announced that in the event of a no-deal Brexit, the president is ready to pass a law immediately to prevent them becoming 'illegal immigrants' and to continue to be able to access the national health service, pensions, State benefits such as dole money, and to live and work.

Parliamentary spokeswoman Isabel Celáa says the law will come into force in February if the UK continues without a concrete deal with the required backing.

Where this leaves holiday home owners, present and future, who are not full-time residents in Spain, is not clear, but Sánchez intends to allow Brits to travel freely between the UK and Spain without a visa, and will authorise flights between the two countries straight away, meaning expats will still be able to return for trips to see their families and UK residents will not be cut off from their homes in the sun.

Given that foreign buyers, of whom Brits make up a significant number, are helping the housing market to recover - and boost the economy by spending in Spain on their holidays - it seems likely Sánchez will ensure no extra hurdles apply to purchasing homes on Spanish territory, or for those who already own second properties to live in them permanently in the future when they retire. (Inheritance tax for 'non EU' citizens will however be more penal.)

British residents in Spain remain sceptical and say they will not believe anything until they see it in black and white, but many are confident Sánchez's government will support them It is very noticeable that whereas they are as promised. receiving reassurances from Spain, none are forthcoming from the UK.

The French have said that for Brit's in France, they will mirror the same rights facilitated for the French in the UK.
