

HELP Vega Baja Befriending Service may have the answer for you....

There is no denying that many people who come to live in Spain find their lives very different to what they expected. They come perhaps with a partner and sadly the relationship ends; death, divorce and illness can change a person's life in the blink of an eye. Some also find that their life becomes very different when they take on the role of carer for a loved one. The opportunity to go out with friends often diminishes with worries about leaving their loved one alone. This can also impact upon their own health, not least because opportunities to visit their GP are often difficult to arrange and even a simple coffee with friends can be out of the question.

HELP Vega Baja considered what they could do to change this for people and came up with their new Befriending Service. Co-ordinated by Maria, the charity offers the opportunity for people to have a "Befriender", perhaps for a few hours a week to enable carers to have some time for themselves, for those who are housebound and lonely to have the chance to meet someone for a chat and where needed, to visit people in local nursing homes.

As expected, the service has been very well received and Maria is being kept busy! President, Michele Masson said "We are delighted with the response we have received so far and we can see already that this totally free service is going to expand quickly. Knowing that we are making such a difference in the lives of people is why we all signed up as volunteers so seeing a service like this grow is wonderful. The service is not "hands on" in any way. Our volunteers are there to chat with people, perhaps have a game of cards but mostly to be a friend. When someone contacts to say that they would like to join the scheme, Maria calls them to assess their requirements and then matches a volunteer with the person. We would really like to have more volunteers to help us support the service. 
It has been a busy couple of weeks in Spanish politics. On Friday, Feb' 15, Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez called a snap general election for April 28 after his 2019 budget failed to pass Congress. Sánchez needed the support of pro-Catalan separatist parties, but they voted against the budget because the Socialist Party (POE) government had refused to negotiate Catalonia's right to self-determination and did not offer any concessions to the jailed separatists.

On Tuesday, Feb' 12, the highly anticipated trial of 12 pro-Catalan independence leaders, who are facing charges over their involvement in the illegal referendum of the separatist drive, began at the Supreme Court in Madrid. The separatists argue their rights have been violated throughout the judicial process, while prosecutors maintain the trial is "in defence of Spanish democracy." Keeping an eye on the testimony of the accused, they do seem to be suffering from a collective amnesia, some refusing to answer question from the prosecutors.

The Catalan pro-independence leaders who have been in pre-trial custody since late 2017 were transferred on Feb' 1 from jails in the northeastern Spanish region to Madrid, where their cases will be heard in the Supreme Court.

Prosecutors are seeking a 25-year prison term for ex-deputy premier Oriol Junqueras for rebellion and misuse of public funds, and they also want the Catalan Republican Party (ERC) leader barred from holding public office for the next 25 years. Prosecutors are also seeking 17-year jail terms for Jordi Sànchez and Jordi Cuixart, and for former speaker Carme Forcadell. Other defendants in the upcoming trial face penalties ranging from economic fines to prison terms of 16 years. In an effort to maximize transparency and avoid accusations of bias, the Supreme Court will allow live coverage of the hearings, which are expected to last around three months.

The former premier of Catalonia, Carles Puigdemont, fled Spain in the wake of the unilateral declaration of independence, and has been living in Belgium ever since. If he returns to Spain, he will be arrested. A number of his former colleagues also left the country to avoid detention and trial.



During Sunday February 10 in Madrid, Spain's right-wing and centralist parties rallied thousands of people to a demonstration in Madrid to protest against Sánchez and his handling of the Catalan independence drive and demand a new general election - "For a United Spain, Elections Now!" against the "betrayal" of Pedro Sánchez in Catalonia.

The call for the demonstrations was prompted during early February by a political storm in Spain over the government's decision to accept having an observer at the planned cross-party talks on Catalonia. It was unclear what this figure – who had been described as a cross between a rapporteur, a mediator and a notary – would have been tasked with doing at the talks, but the opposition said it was a concession to the Catalan separatists, who have repeatedly asked for international mediation.

Police say 4,000 attended the demonstration, the organisers say it was more like 200,000. See photo.



Police in Alicante-Elche Airport arrested 267 passengers during 2018 for falsification of documents - forged passports. Total of people arrested by the Border Police there was 455. The most common of the forged documents are Greek and Italian as the relevant documents from these countries contain less security measures. The most frequent destinations for passengers who falsify identity documents are England, Scotland and Ireland. This is because, as judicial sources explained, that these countries have better conditions when applying for refugee status, so many people who are fleeing conflicts in their countries of origin, seek to get there from Spain. The second cause of the greater number of arrests is the European Arrest Warrant.

What's Up? Continued......Maybe I should just call this the Crime Page?

A 40-year-old man was arrested in the Valencian town in La Ribera in late January. The man, who has a police and criminal background, was accused of repeatedly raping his 13-year-old niece for several months. Horrific enough, but when his family heard of his arrest, they loaded the home of the young girl with gas cylinders and gasoline and set fire to the house! The young girl escaped through the roof and was quickly saved by the Guardia and Policia Local. Police describe both families and the area as 'conflictive.' The young lady is now thankfully in police protection. There have been murders in the area and police have detected many clandestine marijuana plantations and fraudulent links to the electricity grid over the years. Death threats and drug trafficking are common there.

A security guard who was working in a department store in Santa Pola has been arrested by the Guardia Civil for stealing from his workplace. Their investigation has revealed



that he had taken objects from the store valued at a total of €20,000. The home of the 40-year-old Spanish citizen was searched and revealed a stolen stock of five plasma TVs between 24 and 55 inches, three mobile terminals, two laptops, two tablets, two DVDs, two video game

consoles, a sound bar, video game cartridges, a hard disk, a vacuum cleaner, etc - around 50 items. An undisclosed number of items had already been sold on the internet, as the thief was believed to have been pilfering since June last year. This photo shows just some of the stolen items.

The Netherlands will assign a permanent prosecutor for Spain and another for the US in the face of an increase in the involvement of its citizens in crimes committed in both countries and in the judicial processes that are still open, according to the Public Prosecution Service (OM). In the case of Spain, the focus is especially on the Costa del Sol, a tourist area that the Dutch press has dubbed the "Crime Coast" because of the detention of numerous Dutch citizens in recent times. In an investigation by the Dutch television NOS, Spanish police and judges showed their "serious concerns" about the multiplication of violent incidents related especially to drugs and involving leaders of the Dutch Mafia in the Spanish Levante area. These are several cases of assassinations, bombings and the discovery of large amounts of cocaine, they stressed.

There is no doubt about it but Southern Spain has major problems with drug smuggling gangs, dealers and violence. Let's hope that this infestation does not spread up here from the Costa del Sol. Meanwhile, Uber and Cabify have announced they are pulling out of Barcelona after the Catalan regional government approved new rules that will force customers to request their services 15 minutes ahead of their planned journey time. Cabify are threatening to do the same in Valencia if the regional government here impose the same regulations. But these reg's must surely be against EU competition rules.

A British MP has been given a three-month jail sentence for lying to avoid a speeding ticket, automatically triggering a recall petition in her Cambridgeshire seat. Fiona Onasanya, the MP for Peterborough and a former

Labour whip, was sentenced for perverting the course of justice after a retrial. She appeared at the Old Bailey in London alongside her brother Festus Onasanya, who pleaded guilty to three similar charges. Mr Justice



Stuart-Smith sentenced the solicitor-turned-MP to three months in prison and her brother to 10 months. This is the first sitting MP who has been jailed in the UK in 28 years. But what struck me about this case was to compare the jail sentencing to the current practice in Spain. Now I do believe that this sentence was excessive but this story indicates how easy it is to go to jail in the UK. Whereas here in Spain no one serves a jail sentence of less than two years if it is a first offence.

If Spain was to operate a similar penal criteria to that of the UK, they would need at least three times as many prisons! If one follows the current Brugal case concerning the PP corruption in Orihuela to its conclusion, it will be interesting to see at the end of the trial how many will actually be jailed or how many will receive a sentence of less than two years and will still be driving out of their expensive houses in flash cars.

During early January at 5:20am two Local Police officers in the city of Cadiz were surprised to find a 38year-old Spanish woman and a 39-year-old Spanish man beating an elderly man to the ground. demanded everything he had and when he refused they beat him up and stole his phone. The couple, who have a long history of police records, were taken to the police station, charged and then released. At 3:30am on the following morning, less than 24 hours after the first incident, police were called to another incident in the city where a couple were assaulted and the man knocked to the ground, both their phones being stolen. Police found the offending couple immediately, retrieved the phones, and yes, you guessed it, they were the same couple as in the previous assault. They were taken to the police station, charged with robbery with violence and injuriesand then released!

The following is an article by Alberola Pine based on an interview with Álvaro Rodríguez Lescure, (photo) who is head of Oncology at the Elche General Hospital and is also the vice president of the Spanish Society of Medical Oncology, which has just published the latest figures on cancer incidence in Spain. The interview appears in Informacion and is translated here from Spanish.

Is the incidence of cancer in our country increasing?

It has increased in the last four years by 12%, a large part of this increase corresponds to women and has to do with the incorporation of women into smoking. In fact, one of the tumours with more increase among women is lung cancer, which is resulting in more deaths. Do not forget that among young people more girls smoke than boys.

Besides tobacco, what other factors are behind this increase in cases?

The main cause of the increase in cases is the aging of the



population, along with others such as alcohol or obesity. Also, the implementation of early detection systems means that tumours are detected in

increasingly early stages. In the coming decades we will find an increase in most cancers, especially in Spain, where we live more and more. It must be taken into account that at 85 years the risk of suffering from cancer is 50% in the case of men.

What role does obesity play as a risk factor?

It is an important factor to suffer cancer, especially together with the reduction of physical exercise. Influences countless cancers, such as breast, endometrium, ovarian ... The metabolism of those who have a sedentary life is a metabolism that promotes the growth of tumour cells.

There are more cases, but is survival increasing?

Yes, early detection is essential. But more important are the new treatments that change the history of the disease.

What are the most promising treatments?

Especially targeted therapies, for example, in melanoma. Immunotherapy is changing the perspective of the survival of many tumours. Before there were tumours, such as metastatic melanoma, with very bad prognoses, which now with immunotherapy yield rates of 50% of patients alive at

five years. Before, that was unthinkable. Immunotherapy is applied with more or less success in several tumours. In breast cancer, monoclonal antibodies are also changing the prognosis in more severe cases. The effect of these treatments we will see in the coming years.

Are we on the way to the disease becoming chronic?

In metastatic phases it remains an incurable disease and the goal is to scratch years of survival. But immunotherapy can open the window to having patients with many years of stable disease. At the moment we gain time and quality of life

Is Spain incorporating the latest advances in terms of treatments?

Overall, yes, but sometimes it takes too many years. From SEOM we have demanded that the process be more agile. The benefits at the end arrive, but with a certain delay and due to a bureaucratic process difficult to understand and explain. We have 17 autonomies and that generates delays and inequity. The approval and use of pharmacological news is not resolved in all communities. Not all communities are the same and even within autonomies there are differences between hospitals and this generates situations that are unfair.

And how is the situation in the Community?

In the Valencian Community we have a central body, which depends on the General Directorate of Pharmacy, and that generates more equity. That makes all hospitals alike have access to the news. What we have is in general a problem in access because there is a lot of bureaucracy.

In the case of breast cancer, is the age of the patients going down?

Below 35 years the incidence is very low, but it seems that it has increased more in that group. It seems that cases increase and is related to cultural changes and reproductive life. The progressive delay in the first pregnancy is a risk factor. Also the fall in the number of children influences. These factors cause that in this segment to increase more cases, but in absolute terms, cases below 35 years represent only 7%.

What are the most common tumors?

The most common are colon cancer, prostate cancer and breast cancer. In fourth place is the lung, followed by the bladder, which is also closely related to smoking. The figures do not differ much from those recorded in Europe.

The upkeep of the sole river in our area, the Segura, should be maintained by the Confederación Hidrográfica del Segura (CHS) (Segura Hydrographic Confederation). But as usual, these bureaucrats are too busy shuffling papers and having long lunches. Now the stretch of the Segura which runs through the Vega Baja has been severely contaminated with plastic and other waste.

Tired of waiting for those responsible for the upkeep to take action, on Saturday February 16, over 300 volunteers decided that they would take immediate action by manning the stretch of river between Bigastro and Guardamar and collecting as much rubbish as they could in one day. Now as you will see from the photo below, the pollution in many areas has been quite dramatic, so it is hardly surprising that the volunteers collected three tons - around 3,000 kilos of plastic.

This included hoses, bottles, irrigation pipes, chairs, boxes, drums, animal food sacks, containers etc. Other waste collected included toilets, glass bottles, auto parts, mattresses, sheets and even a sofa and a sofa bed.

CANCER SPECIALISTS WARN AGAINST PSEUDO THERAPIES.

The Head of Oncology at the Elche General Hospital, Álvaro Rodríguez-Lescuer, has warned against the use of pseudo therapies in the treatment of cancer. He recalled two recent cases in the province where conventional treatments were ignored. In the first case, a 30-year-old lady who had recently been diagnosed with breast cancer, decided to reject chemotherapy and surgery and entrusted the fate of her disease to a pseudotherapy alone. When she returned a year later, what twelve months earlier was an early-stage turnour with a good prognosis, "it had become an aggressive cancer with metastases and finally the patient died, " explained Álvaro.

In the second case, he remembered a female patient to had the diagnosis when the disease was already well advanced. She did not want to follow any treatment, "because she embraced a movement that determines that all diseases have an emotional origin and advises a kind of quarantine to overcome them." After spending some time isolated from family and friends, recalls Lescure, "she died with many pains as he rejected any type of palliative treatment."

Now these may be extreme cases but oncologists and doctors from many other specialties warn that the so-called pseudosciences are increasingly noticeable among patients. Recently, the Ministry of Science announced a survey which revealed that 5% of cancer patients and other diseases have used pseudotherapies to replace conventional medicine and 14% as complementary treatment. Nieves Díaz, Head of Oncology at Hospital de Sant Joan, has not encountered any case of treatment abandonment but she has to deal with many patients who alternate chemotherapy with other alternative therapies. Here she finds that these therapies interact with the chemotherapy, potentiating it and therefore increasing its toxicity or reducing its effect.

The Ministry of Health has catalogued about 140 techniques with dubious scientific evidence, but in many cases enjoy enormous popularity. For this reason, doctors are calling on Sanidad for more sanctions and new regulations in this regard, since pseudosciences are becoming "a plague that affects the very roots of the health system in our country," according to a letter sent to the Minister of Health and signed by 400 doctors and scientists from Spain.

Francisco Carratalá, neuropediatric at Hospital Sant Joan feels that children are particularly vulnerable to quack therapies, introduced by their parents. "You see that there are children who, after the diagnosis, disappear from the consultation and then return after two years, when the few options that could receive treatment have not been applied at the time." Carratalá believes that pseudotherapies have gone on more in recent years and in a way have been sophisticated driven by the internet and social networks. "Before, this was in the hands of the healers of the villages, who tried to cure you and if they saw you as very bad, would send you to the hospital." Nowadays "behind many of these pseudotherapies there are very powerful companies that invest millions in marketing".

Psychiatry is also a fertile ground for pseudotherapies, with the aggravating circumstance that patients suffering from important diseases, such as schizophrenia, are often unaware of the seriousness of their illness. "Sometimes they end up in the hands of people who tell them that everything is a because of their environment and that they do not need medication," says Elena Benítez, a psychiatrist at Elda Hospital. In his practice, it is not uncommon to find patients who, after 20 stable years, abandon their treatments for miracle products, such as the popular MMS, which is no more than diluted bleach. "When they return at the end of the year they are very uncompensated and relapses in these patients are very hard."

Even in the field of Ophthalmology, specialists such as José Belda, responsible for service of the Hospital of Torrevieja, warns of the appearance in recent years of the so-called visual therapy, a kind of gymnastics for sight that for 500 euros promises to cure cataracts. "All they can do is delay the operation and aggravate the problem," he warns.



Valencia Region Pledges Free Healthcare for Brit's Post-brexit

The President of the Valencia region had some reassuring words for those British residents who have made their home in the region in eastern Spain.

"Healthcare is not under threat for the 71,000 Britons issued with a health card," Ximo Puig, the regional president from the Spanish socialist party (PSOE) said, insisting that universal healthcare was a right for every Valencian citizen and would continue to be so, whether a Brexit withdrawal agreement was struck or not.

"No Briton will lose (Valencian) citizenship in terms of the basic right to healthcare," he said on Tuesday, February 12, following an inter-departmental meeting to analyse the effects of Brexit of those living in the Valencia region.

(He added in Twitter 'The changing position of the United Kingdom with respect to Brexit pushes us to develop different responses to each of the possible scenarios. For this reason, we will provide advice to the affected companies and we will launch an online information platform for them.')

Apart from the 71,000 Brits officially registered as resident in Valencia - the majority of whom live along the coast in Alicante province – around 100,000 British visitors to the region receive healthcare while on holiday.

Valencia remains one of the most popular destinations in Spain for British residents and visitors alike. Last year, 37 percent of the 9.2 million visitors to the region came from the UK.

Puig said that in return for treating Brits at its health centres and hospitals, the region of Valencia claims approximately €75 million a year from the UK.

He said that "the Generalitat (Regional government) has the political will to formalize a bilateral agreement" with the United Kingdom, where some 10,000 Valencians live, to continue receiving economic compensation for the aforementioned universal health care".

"Even in the worst case scenario of a hard Brexit, Brits can continue with their status as Valencians, and that means free healthcare," he emphasized. (From The Local) See also:

A Greek Tragedy?

Greece is in danger of losing its national character, according to many Greeks. They may soon be a minority in their own land. And it's all because of a law passed by the Greek government in the wake of the 2008 financial crisis in a desperate attempt to attract foreign investment - and thereby mitigate the crippling austerity imposed on them by international creditors. The law grants a residence permit to anyone spending more than €250,000 on Greek real estate, a permit which eventually bestows Greek citizenship, and, thus, citizenship of the EU. And to get that benefit, foreigners are now buying up Greece - and in so doing, they are pricing locals out of the housing market. When foreign buyers get this so-called "golden visa", their spouse, children and even parents are also entitled to one - and they don't even have to actually live in their Greek home to qualify! That's why in the past five years, Athens has turned into a multicultural shelter for the foreign wealthy, mainly from Turkey and other non-EU countries. Many natives believe that this "vulgar sell-off" of their precious citizenship will leave Greece ravaged by the "monster of globalisation", a country overrun by non-Europeans.

Bit like the southern Spanish coastline, I suppose.



Football Fallout.

I see that Jose Mourinho, the former Real Madrid manager, has received a one-year suspended jail sentence and has to pay a €2 million fine (60% of the defrauded amounts) for tax evasion from the Spanish Treasury.

According to the agreement with Spanish public prosecutors, the coach created the company Koper Services SA to "financially hide the profits made from his image rights." Before September 2004, he signed a contract that ceded his image rights to the company, which was located in the Virgin Islands.

A few weeks ago, Portuguese soccer legend Cristiano Ronaldo accepted a 23-month jail sentence and €18.8-million fine for tax fraud. Last year, Argentine Barça player Lionel Messi and his father received jail sentences and fines for three tax offences. Colombian singer Shakira is currently accused of evading €14.5 million in taxes in Spain.



The Orihuela Brugal Corruption Case has Commenced.

This trial relates to the awarding of the multi-million rubbish (basura) contract to companies of businessman Ángel

Fenoll. The long awaited trial has finally begun in Elche Court, with 34 people in the dock. These include two former mayors of Orihuela, José Manuel Medina and Mónica Lorente, photos, together with 15 others who held public office at the time either as councillors or technicians in

Orihuela. Several businessmen and relatives are also included.

The defendants are charged with offences of fraud, prevarication, bribery, negotiations prohibited to officials, influence peddling, privileged information disclosure, electoral crime, conspiracy, disclosure of secrets, extortion and attempted coercion. Some of the allegations date back to bribery charges as early as 2006!

The public prosecutor is asking a 37 years jail sentence for Angel Fenoll; while José Manuel Medina faces 12 years in prison and eight for Monica Lorente. According to the accusation, Medina was paying bills for years without a contract to Colsur and Proambiente - the companies of Fenoll; while

Lorente is alleged to have 'managed' the public tender in exchange for Fenoll financially supporting her political career. The case is expected to last 11 months and covers allegations during the period 2006 to 2017.

ANIMAL PROTECTION

Many believe that animals get little or no protection from the law in Spain. Although the system is far from perfect, it is improving gradually. In 2018, Spain's Civil Guard's nature protection service *Seprona* investigated or arrested 590 people for animal abuse against both wild and domestic animals. According to *Seprona*, 854 criminal offences were recorded. *Seprona* investigated dog kennels and animal exploitation at farms and zoos on more than 200 occasions. The agency recorded 11,277 reports of animal abuse in 2017 – more than the figure for 2018. Last year, however, the number of people investigated rose by 1% while the number of people arrested or charged jumped by 20% on figures from 2017.

In the last three years, *Seprona* has taken action in 50,000 situations involving all types of attacks against wild and domestic animals. In 2018, 10% of the Civil Guard's activities in defence of the environment were related to animal injuries or deaths. In Galicia, *Seprona* is currently investigating the brutal killing of four wild horses, which were corralled into a de-worming corridor and beaten to death.

During last year, *Seprona* investigated 10,920 offences related to injuries against domestic animals. This does not include the 1,731 reports concerning potentially dangerous dog breeds. The agency also addressed 3,974 complaints regarding owners keeping wild animals as pets. (El Pais)

The National Police has issued a public warning to people who place sulphur outside their properties to prevent pets from urinating, pointing out that it's actually highly dangerous. The force has that the chemical does not act as a deterrent, whereas in fact it causes harm to pets and humans, as it's highly poisonous. Sulphur is an extremely dangerous substance if inhaled, ingested or put in contact with skin, can cause ulceration, asthma and breathing problems, conjunctivitis, or inflammation of the nasal mucous. The chemical is also highly flammable. The use of sulphur on public streets is illegal in many Spanish locations and could entail a heavy fine.

Processionary caterpillar's are now coming off their tree nests locally. These are very dangerous to animals and humans. Keep your dog on a lead and keep a watch for their long trails. Their hairs are highly toxic.



Regionalism & the Inheritance Tax

Depending on where you live in Spain, inheritance tax (IHT) can be a major headache and a big drain on finances.

Largely due to the pressure from the Ciudadanos Party in Andalucia, the inheritance tax in that region introduced by the socialists has now been virtually abolished with children and spouse now entitled to receive one million euro each free of that tax.

Unfortunately in our region, Valencia, the ruling left-wing government are not nearly so generous. In fact this region is one of the more tax demanding i.e. greedy ones.

Taking a hypothetical case of a 30-year-old who inherits assets of say $\[\in \]$ 309,000 (property, savings and car) from either parent, the regulations in Valencia are the most penal at the regional level given that the payment of an <u>average rate</u> of more than 1% must be made. Valencia is followed by Cantabria and the Balearic Islands with average inheritance tax rates between 0.45% and 0.60% and the rest of the communities have their average rate between 0.01% and 0%. In this particular case, the IHT payable in Valencia would be $\[\in \]$ 3,582, Cantabria, with $\[\in \]$ 1,826.95, and Baleares $\[\in \]$ 1,340, while Madrid and Catalonia are located in the ninth and tenth place with rates of 252 and 159 euros respectively. Aragon, Asturias, Castilla-La Mancha, Castilla y León and Galicia are

the Communities exempt from paying taxes on inheritances of €300,000.

In Valencia, the IHT tax free portion is just €100,000 and this has led to many direct family inheritors renouncing the inheritance,

fearing more debt

In the smaller Alicante province alone, notaries registered 1,611 people who renounced their inheritance during 2018 - that's almost five cases every day! This is up from 286 cases in 2007. Would-be inheritors are concerned that the debt associated with the inheritance - mortgage etc, may be too much. And of course, it is probable that some inheritors are unemployed or lack liquidity.

There are also 'tactical' renouncements where several brothers would choose to withdraw their inheritance rights to favour another of them who has fewer resources.

The Partido Popular (PP) proposed a reduction of the inheritance and gift tax so that inheritances of up to 300,000 euros would be exempt. However the socialist regional government called the proposal "electoralist, demagogic and not very serious" and rejected it without hesitation.

Let's hope that the Ciudadanos party do well in the regional elections this May. They want to reduce or eliminate IHT everywhere, as they have virtually done in Andalucia.


Who Turned the Lights Off?

The theft of electricity is a significant problem in much of Spain. In the municipality of Badalona in Catalonia on January 5, three people died and thirty people were injured after tenants in a block of flats there 'rigged' the electricity supply so they didn't have to pay and caused a fire.



Closer to home, consumers in the area of Caliu in Elda, Alicante, have been experiencing daily black-outs during January, some for more than seven hours. When Iberdrola investigated they found that in blocks of flats only 20% of the residents had a legal supply of electricity, the

remaining residents stealing the power with dodgy wiring. But this type of fraud is not new to Caliu. In December 2014, electricity technicians, backed up by 20 riot police discovered 90 clandestine power outlets and manipulated meters in the area.

Problems with your Spanish Bank?

From time to time problems can and do occur in Spanish Banks, just as they do in other countries. Quite often any grievance can be sorted out at a branch level simply by speaking with the manager and putting your case forward maybe even by going as far as threatening to take your business elsewhere. However, occasionally you may have a more serious grievance and wish to take matters further. So what should you do?

Customer Services

As you would probably expect, a quick telephone call to the Bank's Customer Care call centre can often resolve the issue. The veiled threat of 'taking the matter further' is usually something that the majority of Banks wish to avoid and so, if they can, they will try to resolve the issue at this early stage.

Defensor del Cliente

If and when speaking directly to the branch manager and customer services at head office, has failed to bring any closure to the issue of your problem you should then find out who the 'Defensor del cliente' for your bank is. Think of a Defensor del cliente as a kind of Ombudsman protecting the interests of the client, but concentrating exclusively on the one banking organisation as opposed to the banking sector as a whole - which is why you need to sure that you are contacting the right one. The Bank is duty bound to show their appointed Defensor either on their website or on the literature you were given upon opening your account.

You should contact the *Defensor* in writing clearly stating the nature of your grievance and quoting as many times, dates, names and any other relevant information you can think of. If you have any evidence of letters, cheques, statements of passbook entries that support your complaint then you should include them.

It goes without saying that if you are submitting a complaint in writing (as opposed to email) then you should keep copies of your correspondence and send your envelope by recorded mail (Correo certificado).

The *Defensor* will then contact the bank and conduct a brief investigation into the matter to see if your complaint is justified.

As in the UK and other countries, Banks have a responsibility for due care and diligence to their clients and their money, but if they feel that they can shirk this responsibility and prove that they have not acted unfairly or improperly, they will.

The *defensor* should then get back to you to advise you of their findings and what course of action (if any) will be taken.

Banco de Espana

On the rare occasions that the *Defensor* has been unable to intervene and resolve the issue on your behalf (If not to your entire satisfaction and in your favour, then at least with adequate explanation), then you can take matters further by appealing directly to the Complaints Department of the Bank Of Spain.

Again, you should repeat the process as above, but also include your reasons for being unhappy with the findings of the *Defensor del Cliente*, once again providing copies of any written documentation you may have.

It's the thought that counts!

At the cosmetic counter in a store in Newcastle, I ran into an old friend buying his girlfriend's Valentine's Day present - some fancy moisturiser. After much thought he picked up one of the numerous varieties of moisturiser and brought it to the counter. Still unsure, he sought advice from the lady behind the counter:

Chap: 'Excuse me, but do you think this is a good moisturiser for my girlfriend?'

Lady: 'Well that depends, what type of skin does she have?'

Chap: 'I dunno......Caucasian?!

The ability to reverse ageing is something many people would hope to see in their lifetime. This is still a long way from reality, but in our latest experiment, we have reversed the ageing of human cells, which could provide the basis for future anti-degeneration drugs.

Ageing can be viewed as the progressive decline in bodily function and is linked with most of the common chronic diseases that humans suffer from, such as cancer, diabetes and dementia. There are many reasons why our cells and tissues stop functioning, but a new focus in the biology of ageing is the accumulation of "senescent" cells in the tissues and organs.

Senescent cells are older deteriorated cells that do not function as they should, but also compromise the function of cells around them. Removal of these old dysfunctional cells has been shown to improve many features of ageing in animals such as the delayed onset of cataracts.

We still don't fully understand why cells become senescent as we age, but damage to DNA, exposure to inflammation and damage to the protective molecules at the end of the chromosomes – the telomeres – have all been suggested.

More recently, people have suggested that one driver of senescence may be loss of our ability to turn genes on and off at the right time and in the right place.

One gene, many messages

As we age, we lose our ability to control how our genes are regulated. Each cell in the body contains all the information needed for life, but not all genes are switched on in all tissues or under all conditions. This is one of the



ways that a heart cell is different from a kidney cell, despite the fact they contain the same genes.

When a gene is activated by signals from inside or outside the cell, it makes a molecular message (called an

RNA) that contains all the information needed to make whatever that gene makes. We now know that over 95% of our genes can actually make several different types of messages, depending on the needs of the cell.

A good way to think about this is to consider each gene as a recipe. You could make either a vanilla sponge, or a chocolate cake, depending on whether you include the chocolate. Our genes can work like this. The decision as to which type of message is produced at any given time is made by a group of about 300 proteins called "splicing factors".

As we age, the amount of splicing factors we are able to

make declines. This means that aged cells are less able to switch genes on and off to respond to changes in their environment. We and others have shown that the levels of these important

regulators decline



exams any more than you do!"

in blood samples from elderly humans, and also in isolated human senescent cells of different tissue types.

Rejuvenating old cells

We have been looking for ways to turn the splicing factors back on. In our new work, we showed that by treating old cells with a chemical that releases small amounts of hydrogen sulphide, we were able to increase levels of some splicing factors, and to rejuvenate old human cells.

Hydrogen sulphide is a molecule that is found naturally in our bodies and has been shown to improve several features of age-related disease in animals. But it can be toxic in large amounts, so we needed to find a way to deliver it directly to the part of the cell where it is needed. By using a "molecular postcode" we have been able to deliver the molecule directly to the mitochondria, the structures that produce energy in cells, where we think it acts, allowing us to use tiny doses, which are less likely to cause side effects.

We are hopeful that in using molecular tools such as this, we will be able to eventually remove senescent cells in living people, which may allow us to target multiple agerelated diseases at once. This is some way in the future yet, but it's an exciting start.

HAPPIEST AT 16 AND 70 YEARS OLD?

People in the UK are happiest at 16 and 70 years old, with their wellbeing taking a dive for the majority of their working lives, according to an analysis of official data carried out by a leading thinktank.

A Resolution Foundation paper published on Wednesday said people tend to be happier, more satisfied and to feel a greater sense of self-worth in their earlier years — and again as they approach older age.

The study of seven years of Office for National Statistics (ONS) data also suggested that anxiety levels tend to rise between their mid-20s and their mid-50s.

After a downturn in people's late teens, the data suggested an increase in overall wellbeing in people's early 20s. But that tends to be followed by a stark dropoff in each of the components of wellbeing from around the age of 30 until people reach their 50s. At that point, the curves shift steadily upwards until the age of about 70. The ONS' collection of subjective wellbeing data was started in 2010 by David Cameron, who felt the nation's success was being measured in financial terms alone. "It's time we admitted that there's more to life than money and it's time we focused not just on GDP but on GWB —

general wellbeing," he said at the time. "Improving our society's sense of wellbeing is, I believe, the central political challenge of our times."

On Wednesday, George Bangham, a policy analyst at the independent thinktank, said: "It is encouraging that a growing number of policy makers are interested in boosting wellbeing. But their focus on the new objective should complement, rather than replace, priorities such as income redistribution, better jobs and secure housing."

He added that the ONS data "shows that there is more to life than a country's GDP, but that the employment and income trends that lie behind our economy can make a big difference to our wellbeing too".

According to the Resolution Foundation report, the statistics show the most important determinants of wellbeing to be good health, a job and a partner. But it said the data suggested wellbeing also varied significantly depending on someone's age, income level, housing tenure, and where they live.

A civil guard in pajamas, robe and slippers stopped two robbers trying to steal in a bar in Cadiz. The owner of the




Dog-walking has been banned in Tehran, as part of a long-standing official campaign to discourage dog-ownership in the Iranian capital. "We will take measures against people walking dogs in public spaces, such as parks," said police chief Hossein Rahimi. Driving with a dog in your car is also banned. Dogs are regarded as unclean by the nation's Islamic leaders, and they also, added Rahimi, cause "fear and anxiety".

A cryptocurrency exchange in Canada has lost control of at least \$137 million of its customers' assets following the sudden death of its founder, who was the only person known to have access (passwords) to the offline wallet that stored the digital coins. QuadrigaCX has 115,000 customers with outstanding balances.

An Irish man who swallowed a \$40,000 diamond ring at a jewellery store in Turkey has told prosecutors that he "fell into a trance" when he saw it. Ian Campbell, 54, was arrested after ingesting the 2.5-carat diamond ring while on holiday in Marmaris, and was given laxatives to help him "return" it (this didn't work; it had to be removed surgically). Campbell explained that his wife had died in a car accident after falling into a lake; her wedding ring had never been found. Now, he said, when-ever he sees diamond rings, he feels "a strong urge" to take them, "especially the ones with higher carat diamonds". I'm sure the Turks believed him.

A few preflight drinks can get expensive rather quickly. For David Stephen Young, a round of six alcoholic beverages he drank before his flight from Calgary to London prompted a rash of unruly behaviour, culminating in an abrupt turnaround, an arrest and a hefty fine of more than \$16,000. Young, 44 and a British national, tried to access the restroom during takeoff and became belligerent with the flight crew and a passenger. He was ordered by a judge to pay WestJet for 20,000 pounds of fuel the pilot dumped over Alberta to safely land the aircraft back in Calgary on Jan. 4.

Asylum Seekers.

Spain received a record-breaking 54,000 requests for asylum in 2018, making it one of the five countries in Europe with the highest number of applications. However it accepted a far lower rate of requests than other European countries facing the same demands. In 2018, just 12,000 requests were resolved in Spain, and just one in four asylum seekers was granted protection. The acceptance rate has fallen from 35% to 24% – the lowest rate of the seven European countries that have the highest number of requests for asylum (Germany, Greece, Sweden, Italy, France and Spain). Germany tops the list, granting protection to 50% of 185,853 applications last year.

The figures from 2018 also reveal the backlog at the Asylum Office, which reports to the Interior Ministry. Asylum requests are dealt with slowly. There are 78,710 applications yet to be processed, and each can take up to two years to be resolved. The Asylum Office has been staffed by just 60 people since it was founded in 1992, when Spain received hardly any asylum applications. Of the 11,875 applications that were approved, only 575 – less than 5% – were granted refugee status, which provides the greatest level of protection and is indefinite. The rest were offered subsidiary protection, a temporary measure that is granted largely to people from Syria, Ukraine and Palestine.

More than a third of asylum applications to Spain have come from Venezuelans, who have been struggling with a

deepening humanitarian and political crisis since 2016. But while there is high demand, only 30 Venezuelans were granted recognition.

Meanwhile, the new right-wing regime in Italy has rejected a record 24,800 asylum applications in the last four months. The rejections were up 25% on the previous four months, from June to September 2018, and coincide with the bringing into law of the Salvini decree on immigration, named after the far-right interior minister, Matteo Salvini.

According to estimates, there could be more than 670,000 asylum seekers who will find themselves living irregularly in Italy, partly because the government does not have the capacity to deport them. It can take an average of 19 months for Italian authorities to respond to an asylum application. The Italian government has promised to repatriate 500,000 people. To date it has repatriated about 500 migrants per month – fewer than the average of the previous government. One research group believes that it would take almost a century to repatriate all the migrants denied asylum.



It is often said that 'a picture is worth a thousand words'and probably stops me from waffling-on too much. The graphic on the left indicates the British registered in the various EU countries. The key word here is 'registered.' In reality, I'm sure the numbers are actually much higher.



You may need to show proof of age ID plus Residencia, NIE or DNI. A bit of a palaver really.

Prior booking is not required. Sometimes the bus fills up quickly with people and you have to wait more than 2 hours for the next bus.

Applying Online for A Padron Appointment In Orihuela.

Many of us who have been over here for some years will only be too aware of the many, many hours of seemingly endless queues while waiting to register for Padron, Residencia, SUMA - in fact most things. The bureaucracy in Spain teaches us all patience.

Fortunately the local council have come up with a very welcome efficiency, where one can now register online for an appointment.

On this website you can choose day, date and time for your appointment, subject of course to availability.

The web address is located below and is, helpfully, also available in the English language.

When you first try to access the site, you may get a warning saying that this particular website does not have a security certificate. I just ignored it.
