As I write this, on the evening of Sunday, March 24, the Brexit fiasco continues. We are all now no wiser than we were almost three years ago with regard to our future in Europe. In the past I have often joked about Spanish woolly thinking and bureaucracy stating that we are lucky that the Spanish don't have nuclear weapons. Apologies to them. When one sees the dithering and incompetence coming from a nuclear UK during the last few years, one has little confidence in or indeed any reassurance from the idiots now running the that country.

Although there have been positive signs regarding the continuance of healthcare in Valencia from the regional government, providing of course that the UK reciprocates to the Spanish there, there is some slight assurance from the UK. The UK's Health Minister Stephen Hammond said that in the event of a no-deal Brexit the government would cover the health costs of pensioners throughout the EU for up to 12 months. The UK has suggested to EU Member states that the current reciprocal arrangements continue up until December 2020 in the event of a no-deal to "minimise disruption." But that proposal needs agreement from EU states. However if those agreements are not made the UK will cover the health costs for a period of 12 months for those who relied on NHS cover via the S1 reciprocal scheme.

The weather here in Spain continues to be a little erratic. Temperatures on St. Patrick's Day, March 17, reached 30° in the shade. The following day, we only had highs of around 15°! Swimming one day and wearing jumpers the next! Reminds me of summers in Cornwall! As it has not rained normally hear since October 2018, Feb' and March have been the fourth driest since 1950. This dry trend has been evident since the year 2000, cumulative rainfall being 94% lower than the climatic average for the period 1981 to 2010.

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Although chaos appears to be ruling in the British parliament, the next couple of months in Spain will determine the country's political future for the next four years.

First of all, there will be a **general election on Sunday**, **April 28.** Although this is the third general election since December 2015, the current political landscape shows how quickly the country has changed.

The past two general elections were held in the shadow of austerity and corruption involving the PP. The Socialists (PSOE) then seemed to be facing extinction at the hands of Podemos, a far-left party. Now Podemos is fading amid internal splits, but still remains one of the top four parties.. Pedro Sánchez, the socialist PM has won some favour by introducing a hefty increase to the minimum wage and promises of higher social spending. However, he appeared to be softening in his approach to the Catalan separatists and this led to substantial criticism and suspicion leading to a drop in popularity.

The Ciudadanos (Citizens) Party are a centrist party, who have been gaining solid support at the expense of the PP and the PSOE. Their moderation and their ability to introduce reforms while acting as a coalition support has introduced many worthwhile initiatives, such as the almost elimination of the hated inheritance tax in Andalucia.

But it is the emergence of the VOX party that politicians and voters are watching closely. Their first serious foray into politics came during the Andalucian regional elections where they defied opinion polls and pundits by securing 12 seats, after taking 10% of the votes, even though they never gained a seat previously! Their impact on the general election should be dramatic as polls in late January saw them taking more than 10% of all votes. **VOX** is a far right party and there is little doubt that **right-wing populism** is growing in Europe. Although they have some great ideas such as the reduction or even the removal of 'regionalism', some of their proposals are what I would call to the right of Genghis Khan. Their latest has called for the country's criminal code and gun regulations to be reformed to make it easier to own a gun and to ensure people who shoot home invaders are not prosecuted by the law. Still, it will be some time before I will be carrying ads for AK47's in the classifieds!

It is **highly unlikely that any one party will get a majority** in the general election in late April. The erosion of the previously two main parties and the proliferation of other political parties will probably lead to either a centre right coalition or a left-leaning one. The former being an alliance of the PP, Ciudadanos and VOX. The latter a coalition of the PSOE, Podemos and a smattering of several smaller parties.

Catalan separatism remains Spain's thorniest problem. Should the several separatist parties there do less well this time, it will be a bonus, saving us from their lunatic rants.

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A tweet by a Catalan government official who paraphrased Anne Frank to describe the situation in Catalonia has received widespread criticism, including from Israeli diplomats and former French Prime Minister Manuel Valls. "Nothing, nothing can be compared with the Holocaust to promote a political cause. This comparison is shameful!"

responded Assaf Moran, the deputy chief of mission at the Israeli embassy in Madrid, to a tweet posted by Elsa Artadi, photo,the Catalan regional government spokesperson. The Catalan separatists appear to have their own highly delusional grasp of history and reality.

The **Mercadona supermarket** in Los Balcones will be closed from March 23 until April 12. Extensive renovations are planned.

About 131,000 adolescents between 12 and 18 years in the province of Alicante will be **vaccinated** within three years against new variants of meningitis, specifically against meningococcal A, W and Y, due to the increase in cases occurring in recent years of this serious disease throughout Europe and also in Spain. Currently, babies are vaccinated at four months against meningococcus C, which causes one of the most severe and fulminating types of meningitis. At 12 years of age, a booster dose of this vaccine is given, since after the newborns, the group with the highest incidence of meningitis is adolescents.

two months of this year. And close to San Pedro, a couple from Los Alcazares were arrested after stealing 50 drain covers. They also stole electricity and water meter covers in the municipality to be sold as scrap. A walk around many urbanisations locally will reveal that some of the covers to the street lighting posts have been removed and sold.

Fifteen years after the 2004 Madrid terrorist attacks that killed 193 people and left around 1,700 injured, eight of the 18 men sentenced by the Spanish Supreme Court for the massacre remain in prison. Of this group, three have been given improved conditions thanks to good behaviour, including Otman El Gnaoui, photo, an actual perpetrator of the bombings. The other five remain in the most restrictive prison regime. Although El

Gnaoui along with Jamal Zougam, was sentenced to 42,922 years in prison for being direct perpetrators of the massacre, they are expected to be released on March 19, 2044. Others are expected to be released between now and 2023 save for José Emilio Suárez Trashorras, who was sentenced to 34,725 years and Antonio Toro Castro, who got four years but remains in prison after accumulating another 18 years of prison time for drug trafficking and possession of explosives in other cases. He is not expected to be released until March 30, 2022. The long jail sentences in Spain are just a joke.

Spanish police have arrested five people for operating a lucrative IPTV system, believed to be one of the largest illegal TV streaming businesses in Europe. Operating with branches in Denmark, the United Kingdom, Latvia, the thousands of people from 30 Netherlands and Cyprus, different countries paid between €40 and €460 a month to watch their favourite football games, TV shows and movies. What they did not know was that they were doing so via a pirate operator. The Spanish police led a joint investigation with Denmark and the United Kingdom in which 14 other branches were found: eight in Spain (in Málaga, Madrid and Alicante), four in Denmark and two in the United Kingdom. As a result of the investigation, 66 servers were disconnected and the rest, which were part of a network of internationally connected computers, were detected and identified.

On February 22 at 3pm, 10 masked men carrying imitation weapons (allegedly) burst into the North Korean embassy in the residential area of Aravaca, just to the north of the city of Madrid. Photo.



They tied up the eight people inside and put bags on their heads. They then beat up and interrogated the eight, two of whom required medical attention later. They were believed to be an efficient military type unit as the operation was perfectly planned, the assailants taking with them all the mobile phones and computers.

A woman managed to escape from a window on the second floor and her screams for help were heard by a neighbour, who contacted the police.

Officers arrived at the scene but when they tried to enter the embassy a man opened the door to them and told them that there was nothing going on. Minutes later, two luxury vehicles sped out of the embassy. The cars used for the getaway belonged to the diplomatic mission and were later abandoned in a nearby street.

It was then that the police found the victims inside.

Investigators from the Spanish police and National Intelligence Centre (CNI) have linked the attack on the North Korean embassy to the US Central Intelligence Agency (CIA).

At least two of the 10 assailants who broke into the embassy and interrogated diplomatic staff have been identified and have connections to the US intelligence agency. The CIA has denied any involvement but government response sources say their "unconvincing."

Sources believe the goal of the attack embassy was to get information on the former North Korean ambassador to Spain.

Skin is our largest organ and something we may take for granted when it's healthy. Sara Brow, Professor of Molecular & Genetic Dermatology, Wellcome Trust Senior Research Fellow, University of Dundee, writes 'As an academic dermatologist I frequently hear misleading "facts" that seem to be stubbornly enduring. Here are some of the most commonly shared myths that can be cleared up immediately, and some truths you can rely on.'

Skin constantly renews itself

TRUE The skin provides a dynamic barrier between your body's internal environment and the outside world. Cells called keratinocytes in the epidermis (the outer layer of skin) are constantly dividing to produce a supply of cells that move up through this layer and are shed from its surface. Skin is a rich source of stem cells with the capacity to divide and renew themselves.

Drink two litres of water a day for healthy skin

FALSE The amount of water you drink does not directly affect your skin. Water is supplied to the skin by blood flowing through the dermis, the inner layer of skin; water is lost from the epidermis, especially in a dry environment.

Water is needed to maintain skin hydration and when you become seriously dehydrated your skin appears dull and is less elastic. In a healthy person the internal organs – kidneys, heart and blood vessels – control the amount of water reaching the skin. There is no fixed volume of water that you need to drink, it simply depends on the amounts you are using and losing.

Stress can make skin unhealthy

TRUE There are many health issues in modern life that we blame on stress, but several skin conditions have been shown in scientific studies (see below), to be worsened by life events, possibly via stress hormones including cortisol (a steroid hormone made in the adrenal glands). Notable examples are alopecia areata, an auto-immune condition where the body's immunity begins to attack the hair follicles, causing hair to fall out; psoriasis, another auto-immune condition that causes skin thickening, scaling and inflammation; and eczema, itchy red skin inflammation often occurring alongside asthma, hay fever and other allergies. Unfortunately a flare up of these skin conditions is exactly what you don't need when you are feeling stressed or under pressure.

Eating chocolate causes acne

FALSE Acne vulgaris, the common "teenage" acne which can actually persist into your 30s and 40s, occurs as a result of the interaction between hormonal effects on grease glands in the skin, plus the skin's immune response to blocked pores and microbes living on the skin.

Eating a high fat diet is unhealthy for many reasons, but it doesn't cause acne. In fact some tablets prescribed for severe acne such as oral isotretinoin are better absorbed when pills are swallowed with a fatty meal – and that could include chocolate.

Washing powder causes eczema

FALSE Eczema is a condition where the skin is dry, itchy and red. It is caused by a combination of genetic factors (how your skin is made) and environmental effects, leading to inflammation. Soap, detergents and washing powders can irritate the skin and contribute to dryness because they remove oil from the skin (just as washing-up liquid removes grease from your dishes). Biological washing powders contain enzymes – proteins that break down fats and other proteins to remove stains – and these can irritate sensitive skin, so they may worsen eczema. It is important that any washing power is thoroughly rinsed out of clothing before it is worn, to avoid skin irritation.


White marks on nails = calcium deficiency

FALSE Nails are manufactured in the nail matrix, an area under the skin at the top edge of your nail. If the matrix is traumatised, bumped or bitten, an irregularity in the developing nail occurs and air can become trapped. This appears as a white mark as the nail grows out. Calcium is important for healthy nails (as well as bones and teeth) but these white marks are not a sign of deficiency.

Sunshine is good for you

TRUE & FALSE Many people have experienced the feelgood factor of a sunny day, but there are good and bad effects of sunlight. Light from the sun includes a mixture of

different wavelengths of light: some are visible the to human eye, some are shorter than the colours we can see - these called ultraviolet (UV) and some are longer, the infrared. Different



wavelengths have "It's not a rash, it's moss. You need to different effects start being more active than a tree."

on skin. UVB is used by skin to manufacture vitamin D which is essential for bone health. Without sun exposure this vitamin must be obtained from the diet. Dermatologists use specific wavelengths of UVA and UVB in carefully controlled doses to reduce skin inflammation, a valuable treatment for some skin conditions. But when the skin is exposed to too much UV it can damage the skin cells' DNA, leading to uncontrolled growth – the basis of cancer. As a simple rule, unless you have a disease or treatment that suppresses your immune system, sunshine is good for you in moderation, but always avoid getting sunburned.



services will be available for Easter. The council may have to make special arrangements to cover the Easter holidays, but the absence of a contract would be disastrous for the summer! Look what happened in Orihuela Costa last year with the *chiringuitos*.

From a short tour of Orihuela Costa, the amount of new building works currently under way is stunning. However, the relevant property developers are far from happy with the local council. It seems that there are 1,200 properties which are still awaiting building permits, some for over 22 months! Representatives from TM Real Estate Group, Trivee and Marjal, among other development companies, along with the Association of Real Estate Developers of the province of Alicante, Provia, met with the mayor of Orihuela, Emilio Bascuñana (PP). The City Council has again claimed that it lacks personnel sufficient and that the limitations of the sustainability law prevent hiring more Developers are demanding that the process be outsourced so that building permits and occupational licences are They point out that the neighbouring speeded up. municipalities of Torrevieja, Pilar de la Horadada or Guardamar, the waiting period is only four months. Provia stated that 'Orihuela has the dubious honour of accumulating the greatest delay in the province of Alicante and most likely of the entire Valencian Community."

The City of Orihuela was placed in third place in the community by volume of construction activity in 2018, just behind the city of Alicante and Torrevieja, although this is still at 30% of the level of activity prior to the crisis. Last year, the municipality received more than four million euros between construction and construction taxes and license fees. In addition, the collection of Real Estate Tax (IBI), generated mostly by residential development on the coast, accounted for another 28 million euros for the municipal coffers, to which there are another two million added by capital gains, derived from the activity of buying and selling real estate. This 34 million euros account for 40% of the total income chapter of the municipality in the 2018 budget.

Unfortunately, only a tiny portion of these funds were invested back into the coastal area.

The Guardia Civil arrested 21 people in Torrevieja for cultivating and supplying narcotic substances to various cannabis associations of the town, in an operation which included five establishments and two private homes. In addition to narcotic substances, other products were found, such as cream chocolate spread, chocolate bars, muffins, jelly beans, lollipops, cookies, honey, cotton candy and jams, all of which contained different levels of cannabis. Of the 21 arrested, were 17 men between the ages of 25 and 57 and of different nationalities (Spanish, Senegalese, Chadian, Dutch, Swiss, Russian and British) and 4 women, between 28 and 48 years of age and of Spanish, Canadian and British nationalities. The crimes charged are those of drug trafficking and criminal organization. A British couple, residents of Torrevieja, are alleged to be the leaders of the organisation. These 'legal' cannabis associations in Torrevieja have more than 6,000 registered members.

believed to be in Spain, filmed was by naturalists using a remotely operated camera during January. Believed to be one of the most threatened felines on the planet, whose population is recovering thanks to ongoing conservation and breeding programs in captivity. This



is the first time that the wild breed have been seen in Alicante, several hundred Km from their normal habitat.

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So, How Much Do the Fat Cat Mayors Earn?

César Sánchez, the president of the Diputación de Alicante and the mayor of Calpe, is the highest paid politician in the province of Alicante, earning 80,999 euros per year, almost seven thousand euros more than the President of the Generalitat Valenciana, Ximo Puig.

The mayor of Alicante, Luis Barcala, 66,004.62 euros per year and Emilio Bascuñana, mayor of Orihuela, has a salary of 57,125 euros.

The left-wing female mayor of Madrid 102,010 euros and the mayors of other major capitals such as Barcelona (\in 100,000), Bilbao (\in 91,318.28), Valencia (\in 82,602.94) and Vitoria (\in 81,860.70) also received remuneration last year higher than that of the Prime Minister (79,757 euros) or any of its ministers (the person who charges the most is the Interior Minister, 81,064 euros).

Interestingly, if you serve just two full terms of four continuous years in Spanish politics you receive a full political pension.

SPANISH POLICE RESCUE ELDERLY PEOPLE FROM 'HOUSE OF HORRORS'

Spanish police have rescued two elderly people who had allegedly been locked up and drugged by a couple who posed as carers while draining more than €1.8m from the bank accounts of a string of victims. The Guardia Civil was eventually led to what it described as a "house of horrors" after police in Frankfurt asked for help in tracking down a 101-year-old German woman called Maria Babes.

Officers from the Spanish force located Babes in a care home in the town of Chiclana de la Frontera, near the southern city of Cádiz. The elderly woman was seriously ill and her hospital records raised suspicions about the behaviour of the people who had been looking after her before she entered the care home.

An investigation found that a Cuban-German couple, who have not yet been officially named, had befriended Babes in Tenerife and brought her to southern Spain "so that they could control her better". Police said the couple had used the same technique to take advantage of other vulnerable people.

Once she was well enough to talk, Babes told the Guardia Civil the couple had kept her in a rented house for months, bound by her hands. Unbeknown to their prisoner, they sold her house in Tenerife and took more than €160,000 (£120,000) from her bank account.

A day before officers arrested the couple, the man and woman managed to persuade Babes to leave the care home with them. Within five hours, she was dead. "The death was strange given that that morning a video was shot showing her in perfectly good health and playing the tambourine during Christmas breakfast in the home," the Guardia Civil said in a statement.

No postmortem examination was carried out on her body as the couple insisted on an urgent cremation. The undertaker told police he had thought it was odd that the couple had not asked for Babes' ashes, despite claiming to be very fond of her. (Postmortems are not very common in Spain. One would wonder how many murders of elderly people have slipped through the net?)

When the Guardia Civil arrived at the rented house, they found two plane tickets to Cuba – and evidence of another rented property close by. It was there that they found an elderly Dutch woman and an elderly German man in dire hygiene and health condition. "Both were found in rooms that were bolted shut from outside, and both were being fed through nasal tubes and could not move about," said the statement. They are now recovering.

The notary who did the paperwork for Babes' estate identified the Dutch woman as the person who had posed as Babes during the signing over of her assets.

The couple remained in custody. Investigators have come across €1.8m "obtained in similar circumstances" from another four people they had "looked after".

The Spanish authorities are seeking legal assistance from courts in England, Italy, Germany and Cuba to help determine the scale of the couple's international finances and holdings.

The couple are accused of fraud, misappropriation, domestic abuse and money laundering. Four other people have been arrested and a further nine are under investigation.

Attendance Allowance is a benefit for people aged over 65 and who may need extra help to stay independent at home, due to an illness or disability.

You could get: £57.30 or £85.60 a week if you need help both in the day and at night.

Completing the lengthy form, you need to show that you need help at home or someone to keep an eye on you. This can include help such as getting out of bed, help to wash and dressed.

You don't need to have carers to help you but the money can help pay towards this.

The benefit is not means tested and does not affect your state pension or other income.

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Not a bite, but.....



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
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

PLUSVALIA TAX: BIG REFUNDS COULD BE ON THE WAY FOR HOME SELLERS OVER "WRONG TAX CHARGE" IN SPAIN

Many people have paid a 'plusvalía' levy when selling their property, even if its value has dropped, but this might be declared unconstitutional.

After the scandal over the misleading sale of preferential shares in savings banks and the upcoming big payouts to homeowners for 'floor clause' interest rate over payments, the next wave of mass financial lawsuits and possible refunds is already on the horizon.

An increasing number of property owners are taking legal action against local councils over the forced payment of 'plusvalía' (increased value) tax when they sell up. Town halls are continuing to charge the seller this tax even if the property is being sold at less or at the same price than the price they originally paid for it. Also, there are cases involving properties in which the sales price was slightly superior to the purchase price but once all the expenses were deducted, there is no gain actually.

The loophole arises as the value of the home that the council uses for it calculation is its 'valor cadastral', (official taxable value). Following the pre-crisis property boom, real market values rose well above this official valuation and councils can still therefore keep collecting the money, which is an important source of revenue, even if the seller is losing money.

In December, a case was filed against Fuengirola town hall, after a woman who had bought a flat for 220,000 euros and sold for 70,000 euros less still had to pay 5,000 euros of this increased value tax. The woman won her case. Campaigners against the charges, who are increasing in number, argue that the charge violates article 31 of the Spanish constitution which covers taxpayers' rights.

In order to study a possible claim, the following documents are necessary: title deed of the purchase, title deed of the sale and the proof of value added tax payment. You will also need lots of patience!

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
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

The gains of a daytime nap are both physical and psychological

The Mediterranean custom of taking an afternoon siesta has long been stigmatised in more northerly climes. Sleeping during the day is frowned upon in North European and American culture. The daytime doze is associated with laziness or a response to lunchtime overindulgence, gluttonous and probably bibulous as well. A new study in Greece, however, suggests that the siesta deserves a better press. An afternoon nap, researchers have found, has as much health benefit as the olive oil and fresh vegetables that, as is more than likely, preceded it. Specifically, they discovered that a short sleep is almost as effective at lowering high blood pressure as medication.

The evidence is mounting that a lack of sleep has deleterious health effects among those toiling in the contemporary workplace. The average British adult

manages just six hours and 49 minutes of sleep each night, and none in the day. That is at least an hour less than

required.

Studies indicate that the rampant sleep deprivation of the modern world may be contributing to increases in Alzheimer's disease, diabetes and obesity. A lack of sleep leaves a high level of cortisol, the so-called stress hormone, in the body. A tired nation makes for an anxious, intolerant, irascible nation. Getting enough sleep should not be seen as a luxury, more a medical and social necessity.

Power-naps have a beneficial effect on levels of concentration, creativity and co-ordination. One Nasa study found that a 40-minute daytime sleep doubled alertness. Winston Churchill

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

Longevity drops in England and Wales.

British adults' life expectancy has been cut by six months in the biggest reduction in official longevity forecasts.

The Institute and Faculty of Actuaries, which calculates life expectancy on behalf of the UK pension industry, declined to speculate on why longevity is deteriorating for men and women in England and Wales. Some analysts, however, blame austerity and cuts in NHS spending, others point to worsening obesity, dementia and diabetes.

The institute said it now expects men aged 65 to die at 86.9 years, down from its previous estimate of 87.4 years, while women who reach 65 are likely to die at 89.2 years, down from 89.7 years.

The actuaries said the evidence of slowing life expectancy that first emerged around 2010-11 is "a trend as opposed to a blip".

Falling longevity has accelerated. Last year's analysis cut forecasted life expectancy by two months. This year it took off another six months. Compared with 2015, projections for life expectancy are now down by 13 months for men and 14 months for women.

Flat or falling longevity has major implications for health, finance and government policy. The state pension age is planned to rise to 68 in 2037, and the government has floated the idea of increasing it to 70 but will come under pressure to backtrack if longevity drops.

Strike One!

This is a fascinating story I found several weeks ago in El Mundo.

Fifteen people, 13 men and two women, were arrested in Valladolid, a city in north west Spain, in relation to an alleged fraud. It seems that the employees of a funeral home there were switching expensive coffins purchased



by the families for cheaper ones when the undertakers were taking the coffins to both their

crematoriums. The second crematorium is in Santovenia de Pisuerga, just 5k from Valladolid.

Initially the authorities believed that the fraud only commenced during 2017, but they quickly ascertained that the fraud went back 20 years and affected thousands of people. Wreaths and flowers were also reused in successive funerals.

76 police and officials took place in the raids on the business and homes and discovered €961,785 in cash in one of the suspect's home.

The police became interested in this case firstly in 2017 when a retired employee of the firm tried to blackmail his employers for a larger pension, or he would disclose their shenanigans. The company called the police and the pensioner was subsequently convicted. However, the pensioner gave the police a pendrive which contained numerous details and documentary evidence of the fraud. Police say that the initial investigations are limited to two decades, between 1995 and 2015, although they do not rule out that the criminal acts investigated can be extended to other periods and, above all, lead to the arrest of more people for continued crime of fraud and belonging to a criminal group.

There is no doubt about it, but when one decides to pay for a funeral in Spain, and probably any other country as well, one can be very vulnerable. It is always a stressful time and regrettably during my decade and a half in Spain I have come across many cases of people being sold very expensive coffins when simple ones were all that were requested. If one is asked to pay more than €3,500 to €4,000 for the whole procedure, it is time to ask questions and get a breakdown. I am also aware next-of-kin being put under pressure by hospital staff to

arrange a funeral quickly and providing the phone number of a tanatorio, one even threatening not to sign a death certificate until a funeral was arranged!

Many people are now opting for funeral insurance schemes with either monthly or lump sum payments, the former being particularly popular with the Spanish public.

I have carried several articles on funerals over the years

and after researching the market, I found the scheme outlined on page 26 to be one of the best. What particularly struck me after speaking to relatives several who benefited from scheme, was how complimentary they were about the quality of service



offered during such a stressful time. Both Tid and I then signed up for it.

No Crematoriums in Greece!

I was amazed to read that there are no crematoriums in Greece. Senior Greek Orthodox clerics argue that funeral rites other than burial defy gospel teachings and can never be condoned. Ecclesiastical condemnation effectively quashed legislation in 2006 that approved cremation and would have brought Greece in line with other EU member states.

For decades Greeks seeking cremation for loved ones have had to go abroad. Neighbouring Bulgaria is the nearest country where cremation is allowed.

Several Greek politicians have been campaigning for the construction of crematoriums since 2014 and it is now planned to have a couple constructed in Thessaloniki and Greece's western port town of Patras, but progress has been very slow and buildiing works have not commenced yet. Meanwhile, the Orthodox church's ruling body, the Holy Synod, is expected to try and cancel the works.

The mayor of Thessaloniki, Yiannis Boutaris, has spoken openly of his own bitter experience being forced to transport his late wife's body across the border to Bulgaria for cremation.

Spain introduces new rental rules with more safeguards for tenants Contract periods are extended, price hikes are contained, and evictions must first be notified with social services

A new government decree regulating rentals in Spain went into effect on Wednesday, March 6, five days after being approved by the Cabinet. The measures introduced by the government of Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez, of the Socialist Party (PSOE), seek to improve protection for tenants at a time when affordable housing is becoming increasingly difficult to find.

The decree extends the duration of the rental contract from three to five years (or seven if the landlord is a company), and prevents annual rent hikes of more than the consumer price index (CPI) within that period. The new rules do not put a cap on how much monthly rent a landlord can ask for, as the anti-austerity party Podemos had lobbied for. Deputy Prime Minister Carmen Calvo said recently that the decree is "an action plan for an unacceptable situation," adding that the measures will be particularly helpful for young people.

Like all government decrees, this one will have to be ratified by Congress within a month. But because of the snap election called for April 28, parliament has been dissolved and this task will fall to a permanent congressional committee. The PSOE executive has already secured pledges of support from left-wing group Podemos and the Catalan nationalist party PdeCAT. The Basque Nationalist Party (PNV) is expected to back the decree as

The main changes will only apply to new lease agreements signed on March 6 and later. Earlier ones will continue to be covered by the previous legislation, although if both parties agree and there is no legal impediment, older contracts may be upgraded to reflect the new situation.

These are the key aspects of the decree:

Contracts extended. The minimum length of a contract has been extended from three to five years (or seven if the landlord is a business). To provide greater stability for tenants, the period of tacit renewal has been extended from one to three years. After the mandatory renewal period, landlords must give four months' notice to end the contract and tenants must give two. Previously, owners could give two months' notice and tenants one.

Rent hikes limited to CPI. While earlier contracts could establish their own provisions for annual reviews, the new decree prevents annual rent hikes of more than the consumer price index (CPI) within the contract period.

Price benchmark system. The decree introduces a state benchmark index for rental prices that will be used to follow changes in the market and help determine whether an asking price is adjusted to market realities. This index will provide the average price in any given part of Spain, and undergo annual reviews. The government has given itself eight months to produce the first figures.

Limit on property costs. In addition to a one-month deposit, property owners can only ask a tenant for additional guarantees equivalent to two months of rent. If the landlord is a legal entity, it must cover any real estate agency expenses.

More security for tenants. The decree equally recognizes contracts registered with the Property Registry and those that have not been registered. In other words, if someone buys a property that is already rented out, they must respect the tenant's lease agreement.

Evictions. All eviction processes will go through the social services first to determine whether a tenant is in a vulnerable situation. If so, the eviction process will be pushed back one month (three if the owner is a business) to help the tenant find a new place to stay. Judges must also communicate the exact date and time that the eviction will take place.

Vacation rentals. The decree says that a building's apartment owners may collectively agree to place limits on the use of units for the purposes of tourist accommodation. The measure comes amid growing public debate over the impact of online services such as Airbnb on city centres and on the price of housing.

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Uncovering the Mess in Andalucia

If you are a regular reader of the political news in this newsletter you will no doubt be aware that the socialist regional government of Andalucia were ousted in December 2018 after being in power for more than 37 years.

During early February this year, the new incoming regime did not expect any good economic news following their take-over, but were astounded to discover that the outgoing government had stashed hundreds of thousands of unpaid invoices in drawers as they did not have the funds nor the authority to pay. These totalled €1,074.5 million euros - that's more than a billion euros!

The highest mountain of unpaid bills corresponds to suppliers of medicines and sanitary material. The Andalusian Health Service (SAS) incurred expenses without budget support for a total amount of 607.12 million euros. They account for 56.5% of the unpaid invoices that emerged at the end of the year. 300,000 SAS invoices for the 2017 year and previous years remain outstanding. The amount outstanding for 2018 is not known yet.

Granted many of the invoices outstanding are from the huge drug companies but there will also be many small to medium sized companies who would have to wait more than a year for payment.

A supplier payment plan was introduced by the national government of Mariano Rajoy in 2012 to ensure that suppliers to the regions and municipalities would not have to wait more than a couple of months for their money. Whereas many regions and towns have greatly improved their payment practices, many others have not.

Training Funds Spent at Brothel!




hunters that prey on more than 85 species and no doubt viewed the woman as food! The big cat, photo, grabbed the woman's with its claws and would not let go. The woman's screams

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HUMAN BLOOD SAUSAGE?

Raúl Escuín, photo, a 30-year-old wood cutter in the remote village of Alloza in the Teruel province, believes he has come up with a blood sausage that is suitable for vegans. He insists that his version of morcilla is vegan friendly because it doesn't involve any animal abuse

in its creation. "If you are vegan and want to eat morcilla then the only option you have is to make it with your own blood."

His recipe involves extracting 40 ml of blood - which is done by a professional nurse who lives in the village - before frying it up with rice, onions, water and a

selection of herbs and spices. The mixture is then inserted into a vegan sausage casing before being boiled, sliced and fried in the usual way. He has encouraged others to make their own morcilla using

their own blood. "So far everyone who has tasted their own blood sausage, has been surprised by how tasty it is!" he insists.

But he warns that under no circumstances should the morcilla be shared with another

person. "No, that really would be cannibalism," he said.

You will have to listen carefully though as they all speak different dialects! Bring a translator and 15 copies of your residencia. Oh, and your wallet!

Although the fishing this winter has been terrible, there have been some big fish around. Several of the club have hooked into something huge before eventually being snapped off or lost in the weeds. It has been reported (Lime Bar gossip) that a 17 pounder was caught at Bigastro. For the local rivers this is a monster!

At the end of February with the thought of catching it again, Beat Me Phil and Ball Boy were fishing Bigastro when Beat Me landed a whopper of 11.3 pounds. Unfortunately, the only person able to witness it was Ball Boy who up until this fish was leading the biggest carp competition with 10.4 lbs. Although Ball Boy acknowledged he had been beaten, he still couldn't get a photo sorted out. Come on Ball Boy if you want your photo in here you will have to invest in a camera!

This month's match was held at El Bosquet and out of 12 anglers on the bank, only 2 blanked, a vast difference to the last 2 matches at Bigastro. I was starting to get a complex with the number of blanks I have had this winter. We fished the oblong and the back canal (pegs 12 to 24). Even though the forecast was good, when we arrived the car's thermometer was blinking with a "Risk of Ice" at 3° but there was a light breeze and the water looked OK. Beat Me Phil (who had 2 wins to my 1) and I both drew pegs on the oblong again (to the disgust of 3 Rods) so at least we could see how each of us were doing. Beat Me started off well landing a few early carp while Anti-Social and I were feeding maggots to a stonechat (feathered bird) in between cups of coffee. After 4 hours Beat Me Phil and the Antique man were well in the lead with several carp each where as I had only had 2 small mullet. This was when the wind picked up and started gusting which it made it very difficult for me to control my pole! © I decided to set up a feeder rod and cast into where I had seen some fish earlier in the day. 1st cast and I had a 2 pounder, 2nd cast (I was short by about 12") and didn't get a bite. 3rd cast was on the money and I had a 3 pounder within a couple of minutes. When I realised that the fish were SO localised, if I missed the sweet spot, I wound in and recast until I hit it. I ended up with 10 fish for 9 kilos to win the match, followed by Antique Man in 2nd (his best result) with 7 kilos then Beat Me Phil in 3rd with 6 kilos. The top 3 weights had all come from the oblong again. This match confirmed the finalists for the winter competition. They were Beat Me Phil, 3 Rods, Ghost, Just John, Sweeney and Ball Boy.

The following week the 6 finalists left home bright and early in a temperature of 14°C, full of anticipation and raring to go. As we pulled into the fishing complex, the car thermometers were flashing 2° again. There was even a bit of ground frost. Unperturbed (as we had such a good day the week before) we drew pegs on the back canal and set our kit up. We didn't draw on the oblong as 3 Rods wanted an "even" competition. There was no sign of any fish so it was pot luck where you tried, most of us opting for the far bank to start with. I was at the far end in peg 24 and had seen a carp swirl just before the start of the match. I put my pole away and lobbed a swim feeder to where it had been. 1st cast and after waiting about 5 minutes, the rod tip swung round. Thank goodness, I hadn't blanked and it was a good fish of about 3 pounds. Then nothing! So, I then joined everyone else trying to coax a bite from anywhere. Compared to last week's match the fishing was terrible. 3 Rods had found some small mullet so was trying to keep them on the hook to build up a weight. He hooked one good fish but it got snarled up in his keepnet and spat the hook out. This match really was luck of the draw as only pegs 18, 22 and 24 caught. On this canal you can see all the other anglers so it is disappointing when you are trying your best (not getting a bite) and the bloke next door is catching! With 30 minutes to go, I could see 3 Rods was probably beating me with his catch of small mullet so I lobbed the feeder where I had caught 1st cast in the morning. Luckily, I caught another carp of about 3 pounds. All day, I only had 4 fish but it was enough to win the final with 4.4 kilos. Silver went to 3 Rods with 2.73 kilos of mullet and a very close bronze was Beat Me Phil with 2.69 kilos. Roll on summer and some fish that want to be caught!

This service will provide eight return trips between Alicante-Elche Airport and Torrevieja central bus depot. It will operate every day of the year and without any stops.

Torrevieja to Airport: 7:00 - 9:00 - 10:00* - 11:00 - 12:00* - 13:00 - 15:00 - 16:00* - 17:00 - 18:00* - 19:00 - 21:00

Airport toTorrevieja: 8:00 - 10:00 - 11:00* - 12:00 - 13:00* - 14:00 - 16:00 - 17:00* - 18:00 - 19:00* - 20:00 - 22:00 (I hear that the summer timings are now year round.)
(*) - From 1st April to 31th October

Price: €6.92. Children under 4 years travel for free but ID may be requested.
