Well, after almost three years, the **Brexit Can** continues to be kicked down the road. What must enrage many souls is the fact that the parliamentary members will take an Easter break from April 11 to April 23 and of course a summer break usually between late July and early September. Well, it's not like they have anything important to discuss and decide, is there? To think that after almost three years, I have been unable to report a single successful agreement and what it will mean for the individual! The European parliament elections will take place between May 23 and 26, bringing no doubt more chaos rather than clarity.

A **Spanish General Election** is due on April 28. (The newsletter will be at the printers before that, so a full report next month.) Although polls indicate that the Socialists (PSOE) are likely to attract the largest number of votes, they are unlikely to have sufficient seats to rule. They would have to depend on other parties to do so. More on this in page 3.

Spanish municipal elections are due in late May. If you have voted in a previous local election or have registered to vote since, you should be still eligible to vote in this one. According to official British statistics, France is home to a little over 157,000 British citizens, making it the biggest expatriate community after that of Spain. But what I was surprised to learn was that some **900 Britons are serving on local councils in France!** 

Now a major complaint I have had with living in Spain is that so few British expats, or indeed other European expats, serve on the Spanish local councils. This despite the massive majority of expats in many areas, particularly on the Orihuela Costa and in Torrevieja. If expats do appear on a party's electoral list, they are usually well down the list in an unelectable position. This is a sop! The French have clearly believed that in the past, expat input at local levels is beneficial and worthwhile. Unfortunately the Spanish political chiefs believe otherwise, thinking that they can do a better job on their own. When you look at the cock-ups we have experienced locally with the beach bars, closure of the leisure centre, incompetence and the poor relationship of the Torrevieja Council with the Policia Local, some fresh blood and ideas are badly needed in these councils.

There is still **too much nepotism and favour/funding rewarding** when it comes to the allocation of councillors. It is a pity that we have to vote for a party here instead of an individual.

With a Spanish General Election scheduled for May 28, the following is an very abridged version of an article in The Economist, which gives a good state of play on the current national political situation.

Until 2015, the Socialists and the PP alternated in power, sometimes relying on Catalan and Basque nationalists to make up the parliamentary numbers. But the discontent aroused by an economic slump that followed the bursting of a housing bubble in 2007 spawned two new national parties, Podemos on the far left and Ciudadanos, originally in the liberal centre. The slump was also a factor in the Catalan nationalists' espousal of independence, culminating in an unconstitutional referendum in October 2017. This threat to the existence of the nation has in turn fuelled the **rapid growth of Vox**, a new far-right party, and also pushed the PP and Ciudadanos to the right.

The three-way fight on the right has imprinted an illtempered character on the campaign. Whereas former PP PMRajoy was a cautious moderate, his replacement as PP leader, Pablo Casado, is much more ideological and confrontational. Both he and Albert Rivera, the leader of Ciudadanos, have tried to turn the election into a plebiscite on Mr Sánchez. Neither has forgiven the prime minister for stealing a march on them with the censure motion on Rajoy, which succeeded with the votes of Basque and Catalan nationalists, or for holding inconclusive talks with the separatist administration in Catalonia. Both threaten to impose direct rule on Catalonia and denounce the illegal referendum in 2017 as an attempted coup. Socialists used their months in power to roll back some of Mr Rajoy's cuts in the welfare state and decree a big and popular increase in the minimum wage (as well as on a not-yet-successful attempt to exhume the remains of General Franco, Spain's former dictator, from his grandiose memorial at the Valley of the Fallen outside Madrid). The right wants tax cuts, and worries that the Socialists will curtail a strong economic recovery which is starting to run out of steam.

Most political leaders accept that Spain is heading for its first-ever coalition government at national level since democracy was restored in 1977. "The new parties are now old parties—they know the system more and they know they have to make deals," says Pablo Simón of Carlos III University in Madrid. But it may require a fresh election in the autumn to define its make-up. All will turn on the precise parliamentary arithmetic, and on whether Mr Rivera is pressed into dropping his promise (made with an eye on Vox) not to enter a coalition with Mr Sánchez. "This is only the end of the beginning of the cycle of instability" that began in 2015 (when the PP lost its majority), Mr Simón adds.

**Wolves**, not the football team Mike H, are making a comeback to the Madrid region. After a handful were sighted in 2013, there are now believed to be five

established packs numbering between 35 and 40. Livestock breeders in Madrid want the wolf population to be kept in check. As the number of wolves has increased, so too has the number of attacks on livestock. In 2013, the year when wolves were found to be breeding again in Madrid, 15 attacks were recorded. Within

three years, the number of attacks soared to 213 and last year, it jumped to 398 Compensation payments have risen from €40,000 in 2014 to €300,000 in 2019.

Spain country is the **third largest consumer of coffee** in the world, with 4.5 kilograms per capita per year. According to the Spanish Coffee Federation, 63% of Spaniards over 15 years of age take at least one cup a day. In Spain, some 40,000 tons of coffee are drunk per year from capsules alone. I thought it might be a lot more.

A school in Barcelona has decided to remove 200 children's books from the infant school library for perpetuating sexist stereotypes. The Taber school, which is under the responsibility of the Catalan regional government, reviewed its catalogue of books in its library for children up to the age of six, and found that only 10% were written from a gender perspective. 30% of the stories were "toxic" and 60% had less-serious problems. Other schools are also working to fill their libraries with more gender-balanced books. The classic fairy tales **Sleeping Beauty and Little Red Riding Hood are two of the books that been removed from the catalogue.** Catalonia does seem to be a harbour of lunacy. Reminds me of some boroughs in North London!

Okay, many of you may have come across an over zealous cop or traffic warden in your travels, but this guy surely is one of the worst. It has only now emerged that during the motorcycling Grand Prix in Cadiz last May, one local police officer in the nearby town of El Puerto de Santa Maria issued a total of **269 fines to motorists and motorcyclists during just one morning.** Now this equates to a fine every two minutes or so during an 8-hour shift! It seems the street signs were changed for the weekend to alter the flow of traffic with some roads now out of bounds. Unfortunately, some of the signage was not visible and the total fines issued on the day came to 451! Now a year later, the council are only just beginning an investigation and have requested that the majority of those fines paid should now be refunded.

In an effort to make drivers more cautious this **Semana Santa** (Easter Week). The advert begins with the statement that last year, 190 people did not make it back home after the

the 'Top Three' destinations for those who ignored the speed limits, use mobiles while driving and drink-driving: the preferred resorts are, in reverse order, 3, the cemetery ( for a quiet getaway, no noisy neighbours), 2, prison, (plenty of time to meditate with a special taxi service included and 1, hospitals (pamper yourself with specialist carers). The new popularity of electric scooters had already claimed its first victim: a 92-year-old woman was mown down by one of them as she went for her daily stroll in Esplugues de Llobregat in Barcelona. The woman was knocked to the ground as she shuffled along a pedestrianised section of the town's Rambla with her walking frame by a young man on a scooter who allegedly didn't see her because he was looking down at his mobile phone. He reportedly had a passenger on the scooter and the pair were travelling at a speed of around 30 km/h when they ploughed into the nonagenarian, who hit her head against the pavement and died in hospital of her injuries a few days later. The driver of the scooter is now being investigated by a judge for involuntary manslaughter. The case has turned the spotlight on the need for nationwide regulations of electrically powered mobility devices such as Segways, scooters and skateboards which now share city streets with cars, cyclists and pedestrians.

Murcia Town Hall has now banned under-15's from riding electric scooters.

Driving and using a mobile phone is becoming increasingly risky in Spain, at least in terms of its legal implications in the case of an accident. From now on, police will be able to carry out checks on the mobile

phones of drivers involved in crashes in order to determine whether they were using the device at the time of the crash, and whether it could have had an influence in causing the incident. This will include of all forms mobile communication, including texts, calls or voice messages on WhatsApp, Facebook, Messenger.



Twitter or any other social platform. Spain's top road safety prosecutor Bartolomé Vargas sent out an order to all regional traffic authorities on April 12th, calling on road safety officers to begin implementing the measure from now on. **Using a mobile phone while driving in Spain** is currently punishable with three points docked off drivers' licenses and a €200 fine.

Catch up: Last month we reported on the incident where 10 individuals broke into the North Korean embassy in Madrid. There, they assaulted the embassy personnel, took computers, cell phones and documents with them. An investigation has now revealed the identities of seven of the ten, some South Korean and most US citizens. One of the group, who claim to be members of a human rights association working for the liberation of North Korea, telephoned the FBI later. The men broke up into four small groups and travelled to Lisbon, where they boarded an plane bound for Newark, New Jersey.

On Sunday, April 7, four people in the centre of Murcia between the ages of 20 and 24, baked some **marijuana sponge cake.** Three of them began to experience chest pains and spasms and called emergency services and were taken to the nearest hospital. The fourth was 'Okay, like everything is cool man!' Experts warn that marijuana takes longer to take effect if consumed with food. This leads to overdosing. The medics confirmed that incidents of this kind are not uncommon.



Municipal elections nationally are now due in late May. In Orihuela, we have at present a PP (Partido Popular) mayor. However, the party is badly divided with two of their senior politicians wanting to become mayor. This may be a bit premature as the PP are expecting to get a hammering in the elections - nationally and locally - according to the polls. Ciudadanos (Citizens) Party appear to be gaining in popularity, but I cannot see any one party obtaining sufficient seats to rule in a majority. Once again it will be a coalition type council, I expect, who will rule.

I anticipate it will be much the same in Torrevieja. The council is run at present by a coalition of the Greens and assorted Socialists. The new councillors there will probably be much the same.

But politics makes strange bedfellows. In the **O.C. the Claro party** used to be one favoured by many expats. At one time they cosied-up to the right-wing PP. Now however they have formed an alliance with Podemos (left-wing loonies) and Cambiemos Orihuela.

What will be most interesting will be the impact that **Ciudadanos** (centralist party) and **Vox** (far right) will have not only in the local elections but nationally as well.

As you are probably aware, several former PP councillors



are on trial at the moment. One result was that relating to Pepa Ferrando, seen here to the left the former **Mayoress** Monica Lorente, who is also charged with various frauds. Pepa has just received a twoyear prison sentence (which won't be served) and a ban of more than 15 years from serving in public office. She was found guilty of five crimes

administrative prevarication and four frauds between 2008 and 2011 for the contracts made at Fitur Tourism Fare in Valencia in those years. Five others received lesser jail sentences and disqualification with four of those sentenced to pay a total of €150,000. Ferrando is awaiting another trial, scheduled in October, for alleged irregularities in the organization of another event, the Fair of Divine Senses (la Feria de los Sentidos Divinos). The Anti-Corruption Prosecutor's Office is seeking a two-year prison sentence and seven years of disqualification for the former president of the PP of Orihuela for alleged irregularities in the collection of about 97,825 euros.

Not really a local story but worth a chuckle. A

Several of the solemn Easter parades have been cancelled because of the heavy rainfall.




#### The Ranch

# High Rates of Driving Test Failure in Alicante.

Passing the test for a driving licence in Alicante is not easy. Of the more than 39,000 tests undertaken during 2017, 56% of the applicants failed. This trend was repeated in previous years. An association of 52 driving schools in the province believe that in neighbouring provinces, such as Murcia, Albacete or Valencia, the driving tests are simpler. This has led to students from this province going to these areas for practice and tests where the pass rates for students are higher than the failure rates.

The driving school association also complains that the examiners do not release any data about failures and are often rude to young students.

They also complain that in the examination centres, students have to wait for hours sometimes before being tested and there are no toilets or seating in the waiting areas. They also complain that examiners do not carry out any tests during August!

Examiners complain about the lack of staff, saying that each examiner is expected to test 13 applicants daily.

#### Chemsex and the spread of VD.

The practice of "Chemsex" is usually between men who have sex with other men, in sessions of several hours or days and with multiple partners. Liaisons are in private homes or in certain locations, such as saunas. Experts agree that new technologies have also had a lot to do with their success, through online searching for partners and a "globalization" through the network of certain sexual practices. "Chemsex" is also associated with the consumption of a very specific type of drugs, "which entail a lower perception of the risk of having sex without any protection," says Mar Vera, a doctor from the Sandoval health centre.

To achieve this there are three main drugs: methadone, methamphetamine and liquid ecstasy. They are drugs that are often taken compulsively, with an average of six doses during a period of nine hours. These drugs stimulate the senses, intensify pleasure and allow long sex sessions. In addition, they reduce judgment, reducing the likelihood of condom use.

In the last year in the province of Alicante alone, 347 cases of gonorrhoea, 228 of syphilis and 352 of chlamydia have been diagnosed. This represents a remarkable increase in cases with respect to the year 2017. The lower use of condoms is behind this worrying trend, which also affects younger and younger men and women. With regard to HIV infections, there have been 135 cases diagnosed in the last year. This figure that remains stable.

The alarm has also been placed on the delay in detecting these diseases, which are on many occasions, highly contagious. "In 28% of the cases, the diagnosis comes when the disease is already at an advanced stage," explains Pep Coll, from the Germans Tris i Pujol University Hospital in Badalona. In the case of HIV, "it has been proven that if the person takes the corresponding treatment, they do not transmit the disease, neither to their partners nor to their children" reported one specialist.





#### TV STREAMING-LATEST

It is interesting to see that Disney have now introduced their own streaming service - Disney+. Although now only available in the States for around \$7 a month, it should soon be available in Europe.

Disney+ will be the home for all theatrical movies released by Disney. It will also eventually be the home for its classic film library (still living in other places under current deals). These will include Star Wars, Marvel, the Avengers and the X-Men series; Pixar films such as Toy Story and Finding Nemo; and its own animated output, including Frozen and The Lion King, and TV hits such as The Simpsons.

Nevertheless, they may find it hard to compete with the established streaming services. Netflix is the king of these with 140 million subscribers worldwide. Amazon and HBO are also worldwide players but with far fewer subscribers. We have all three but find that Netflix has a far larger content on offer in both movies and TV than the others. Netflix is expected to spend as much as \$15bn on making and licensing film and TV shows this year.

Netflix and HBO cost approx' €8 in subscription per month. The Amazon service is available to Prime customers.

There are other smaller streamers such as HULU, Warner Media, Comcast's and NBC Universal. Apple is also now entering the market but has little information to offer at present on what it plans to do.

If you don't fancy either of the above and you have a strong broadband signal, it may be worth considering purchasing a suitable Android box or IPTV system.

#### Living Alone.

According to the National Statistics Institute (INE), there are more than two million people over the age of 65 living alone in Spain. That's almost half the 4.7 million single-person households in the country. Of those two million, more than 850,000 are over the age of 80, and the vast majority are women (662,000).

#### **Proton Beam Therapy**

Spain is joining a global race to adopt proton beam therapy, a form of cancer treatment hailed as a less-aggressive alternative to conventional X-ray radiation. Two private hospitals are due to open centres in Madrid, where children and patients with rare tumours will especially benefit from a treatment with fewer side effects than X-rays.

#### New Flights.

#### Alicante-Elche Airport.

Ryanair has announced its programming for the next winter of 2019 at the **Alicante-Elche** airport, which includes seven new routes to Berlin Tegel, Cork, Haugesund (Norway), London Southend, Marseille, Porto and Toulouse. With all this, the company expects to transport more than 4.9 million passengers a year at the airport in Alicante, which represents a traffic growth of 14%.

The seven new routes are to Berlin Tegel (3 weekly flights), Cork (2 weekly flights), the Norwegian city of Haugesund (2 weekly flights), London Southend (5 weekly flights), Marseille (2 weekly flights), Porto (2 flights) weekly flights) and Toulouse (2 weekly flights). Frequencies will be expanded with Edinburgh, Gothenburg, Leeds Bradford, Liverpool, Manchester and Poznan (Poland). In total a total of 54 routes will be covered.

#### Corvera Airport.

Corvera opened with a whimper earlier this year. A total of 22 destinations will be available during the spring-summer season from the new airport. The season started on March 31 and finishes at the end of October.

Most of the flights are operated by the so-called low-cost airlines.

Ryanair has flights to Birmingham, Bournmouth, East Midlands, Glasgow-Prestwick, Leeds-Bradford, Luton, Manchester, Dublin and Palma de Mallorca.

EasyJet flys to Bristol, Southend and Gatwick. TUI to Brussels-Charleroi and Antwerp-Deurne; Norwegian to Oslo, Bergen, Stavenger, and Trondheim; Volotea to Oviedo and Smartwings to Prague.



Plastic-bag bans are proliferating across the globe, raising debates at offices, kitchen tables, and store check-out lines. What should we replace them with?

Let's rip this band-aid off right away: There's no easy answer, but at the very least, it's clear we need to end the phenomenon of corporate cotton-tote giveaways.

Most life-cycle assessments of different types of bags have come to the same conclusion: When it comes to climate change and other environmental problems like air pollution and water depletion, plastic is actually "greener" than cotton totes or paper bags, which cost a lot more in terms of resources and pollution to produce. But when it comes to the problem of swirling gyres of forever-materials slowly filling our oceans, plastic is worse.

It seems we can't have it both ways.

A cotton bag must be reused 7,000 times for its environmental performance to equal that of a plastic bag that is used only once, according to a 2018 assessment by Denmark's government. More bad news: Organic cotton

is actually far worse than conventional cotton when it comes to overall environmental impact—requiring 20,000 reuses to match a plastic bag.

That's based on the assumption that organic cotton has a 30% lower yield rate on average than conventional cotton, and therefore uses 30% more resources (like water) to grow the same amount. Even adjusting for less fertilizer use for organic cotton (and therefore less eutrophication caused by growing it), conventional cotton came out on top.

At the end of the day, you're not going to solve climate change with your grocery bag, whatever it's made of. But taken together, how markets as a whole choose to consume and use their bags may have a big impact. The simplest advice to an individual person seems to be this: Whatever you have in your house now—be it a pile of cotton totes, or a jumble of plastic bags—don't throw them out. Use them until they fall apart, then again as garbage bags once you can't use them for other purposes anymore. And whatever you do, try not to buy new ones.

#### Hey Man, Got Any Shit?

The first scientific study of cannabis resin sold on the streets of Madrid reveals that the vast majority contains traces of bacteria from human faeces, and poses a serious health risk to those who smoke it. "Overall, our results showed that most (88.3%) of the hashish samples were not suitable for consumption," concluded the study reported in the journal Forensic Science International. "Hence, illegal street vending of hashish constitutes a public health issue."

The forensic study of 90 samples of cannabis resin sourced from dealers on the street in different neighbourhoods across Madrid, from Majadonda to Alcobendas, was conducted by a team at Complutense University.

When buying from dealers off the street, the drug typically came in two forms: acorns and ingots.

Although foreign elements were found in both, with regards to microbiological contamination, 93 percent of the acorns were contaminated with E. coli compared with 29.4% of the ingots. Photo.

Escherichia coli (E. coli) bacteria normally live in the intestines of healthy people and animals.



Most varieties of E. coli are cause relatively short spells

But a few particularly nasty strains, such as E. coli O157:H7, can cause severe abdominal cramps, bloody diarrhoea and vomiting.

Moreover, the study found that 10% of samples contained aspergillus, a type of mold that is usually harmless but can trigger serious infections if those with weakened immune systems, underlying lung disease or asthma, inhale their spores.

The contamination is due to how the drug is smuggled into Spain. The resin is rolled into small balls(acorns), wrapped in cellophane and swallowed. When the smugglers arrive in Spain, they take laxatives to expel the acorns and that's what goes on sale. 40% of the sample acorns smelled of faeces and hashish is manipulated by the hands constantly and the filters of the joints are hollow, so when you inhale smoke you will also inhale other particles!

The report concludes that the average amount of faecal bacteria in each gram of resin is 500 times higher than the maximum limit set by the US legislation for marijuana or by the European regulation for fruit and tea.



Contact card (in both English and Spanish) providing valuable information of where support may be available.


This full-page card comes already folded to the size of a credit card and therefore fits very easily into a purse or gents wallet. On one side of the card details of charities are listed together with other useful telephone numbers, including hospitals, police etc. On the reverse, there is space for the holder to put as much personal information as they wish. There are boxes for medical conditions, contact information in the event of an accident, allergies, medication and much more – even details of any pets that may be at home alone! President of the charity, Michele Masson, told us "getting this new card off the ground has taken a significant amount of organizing plus of course gaining sponsorship which we were fortunate to receive from Arocasequier, Torrevieja. The card is aimed to provide, for example, emergency services details should the holder be taken to A & E and unable to communicate. We have gained permission to have the cards available at GP surgeries in the area, chemists, town halls and many other outlets have already started to take them in to offer to clients. Certain areas of the police are now aware of the leaflets including the N332 group who have also kindly agreed to circulate them in their talks around the area. We also aim to speak shortly with the ambulance service, again to raise awareness. This way we can ensure that we have the best chance of people knowing about the card should someone be involved in an accident or perhaps simply found wandering the streets".

100,000 of the leaflets have been printed and Michele advised that these are available from the charity's San Miguel Centre if anyone would like to go along to collect one, or if they would like to take a supply to distribute to

#### **How to Reduce the Risk of Cognitive Decline with Age**

Research into how we can keep our brains healthy as we age has gained momentum in recent years. There is now an increased focus on the changes that we can makes to our health and lifestyle, which may prevent dementia. Here are some things that research has shown reduce a person's risk of cognitive decline with age.

#### SAV

Our latest study shows that having more sex is associated with better cognitive function.

We recruited 28 men and 45 women, aged between 50 and 83, to take part in our study. We found that those who had sex weekly scored on average 2% higher on some cognitive tests than those who had sex monthly, and 4% higher than those who never had sex. These results were shown on tests of verbal fluency (such as naming as many animals as possible in one minute) and visio-spatial abilities (drawing familiar objects from memory or copying complex pictures). The association could be the result of the heightened levels of intimacy and companionship inherent in sexual relationships (that is, an increase in social contact), or there could be a purely biological explanation - where regular surges in arousal and release of sex-related hormones (such as oxytocin and dopamine) could be affecting brain function. Of course, as with the age-old nature/nurture debate, our answer could lie in a combination of the social and biological impact of sexual activity.

#### Sleep

Many studies show that getting enough sleep is important for preventing cognitive decline. A study of cognitively healthy people aged 65 and over showed that daytime napping is associated with a lower risk of cognitive decline at two-year and ten-year follow-ups. Conversely, excessive daytime sleepiness and getting less than six-and-a-half hours of sleep at night are associated with an increased risk of cognitive decline at ten-year follow-up.

A more recent study showed that longer sleep duration and poorer sleep quality are both associated with poorer memory in men and women aged 65 and older. These studies all support the advice that we should be getting around eight hours of sleep a night. Sleep disturbance in early adulthood is associated with poorer cognitive function in later life, which just goes to shows how sleep can affect our brain health across the lifespan.

#### Active leisure

New studies show that increased participation in social, mental and physical activities is linked to a slower rate of cognitive decline in older adults. This research shows a "dose-response" relationship, where the more activities we do, the slower the rate of decline becomes.

The following activities are good examples of the types of mental, social and physical leisure activities that are good for your brain:

- Mental: puzzles, games and quizzes, reading or even adding up your shopping bill in your head as you go around the supermarket.
- Social: visiting friends and family, regular phone or email conversations with people, going to the cinema or doing some volunteer work.
- Physical: gardening, housework, walking for around 30 minutes a day, or doing chair-based or sitting exercises.

#### Gender equality

Studies have found that women may be at reduced risk of

cognitive decline, simply because of the activities they choose. There is little that we can do to change our gender, without drastic surgery of course — but we can be aware of the gender stereotypes — and expectations that are all around us, which can affect the activities we engage in. In a study of Australian



older adults, there were notable gender differences in the leisure activities that people took part in. For example, women were more likely to engage in social activities, reading and volunteer work, all of which are known to slow cognitive decline. The way that cultures or societies perceive gender roles can affect people's expectations of themselves and others. If this changes the lifestyle and leisure activities that men and women engage in, then it could well have an effect on cognitive abilities in later life.

#### Get an early (in life) start

When it comes to doing things to prevent cognitive decline, it's never too early to start. Some studies show that interventions in older adults have little effect – but that could be because the participants are already suffering from cognitive decline. Studies mapping the rate of cognitive decline in older participants who do not yet have dementia or cognitive impairment, however, show promising results. We all experience cognitive decline as we age. This is a

We all experience cognitive decline as we age. This is a natural process and occurs at different rates for everybody, much like declines in physical abilities with age. But it's time we started addressing this much earlier in life, rather than waiting till middle age or older. It's time for us to take a lifelong approach to keeping our brains healthy as we age.

#### The Longer Hot Summers.

Those of us who have been living in Spain for some time will now be aware of the longer hot summers and some seasonal shift with flowers blooming in December and January.

A new study by the national weather agency AEMET and the Ministry for Ecological Transition shows that climate change has come to Spain, and its effects are mainly noticeable in the higher temperatures. The summer season now lasts almost five weeks longer on average than it used to in the early 1980's. And it is also hotter.

Both institutions have offered data from the Open Data Climático project, which collects evidence of the impact of global warming on Spain in the last 40 years. There has been an accumulation of very warm years in the last decade, and an increase in so-called "tropical nights," or nights with a minimum temperature of 20°C. According to the Madrid-Retiro weather station, in the 1970's the summer used to begin on July 15 and end on September 16. These days, it starts on June 11 and ends on September 22.

The report also analyzed the temperature of surface water in the Mediterranean, and concluded that it has been rising by 0.34°C every decade since the early 1980's. This in

turn is causing the sea level to rise. Since 1993, the global sea level has been rising 3.4mm a year. An increasingly warm Mediterranean has an impact on coastal regions, with a rise in tropical nights. Hotter nights make it difficult

to sleep, which in turn has an impact on health. The first heatwayes of the year are coming earlier and catching us surprise. higher temperatures are bad also for cardiovascular and respiratory diseases. especially in older people. The heat also increases visits to the

doctor by people with kidney problems and those with neurodegenerative diseases such as Parkinson's. It likewise causes a rise in premature babies and low weight at birth. The heat is also linked to approximately 1,200 deaths a year in Spain.



But it was finally the arthritis surgery known for being "excruciating", which she actually breezed through, that led to Cameron being spotted as immune to pain and stress. Cameron, 71, has a

previously unknown double mutation to her DNA that scientists believe plays a major role in pain signalling, mood and memory. "I thought it was just me. I didn't know anything strange was going on until I was 65," says Cameron. The discovery has boosted hopes of new treatments for chronic pain affecting millions of people globally. For Cameron, one downside is the mutation makes her forgetful: "I don't get the alarm system everyone else gets."

'Not dead, not coming back' – The British man who tried to flee Australia on a jetski to escape serious drugs charges left a note on the steering wheel of his four-wheel-drive saying: 'If I'm not back by Wednesday, I'm not

dead, but I'm not coming back." David James Jackson (photo), 57, was reported to police in Cape York at the farthest tip of Queensland after local people spotted him setting out on a jetski loaded up with supplies, extra fuel and what looked like a crossbow. He made



The Hollywood actor Nicolas Cage has officially filed an annulment from his wife of just four days. Cage and makeup artist Erika Koike applied for a wedding license on 23 March and were wed the very same day in Las Vegas, Nevada. By Wednesday, the actor applied for an annulment. This is his shortest marriage yet, topping his 2002 marriage to Lisa Marie Presley, which lasted 108 days before they split.

A Russian perfume maker has apologised for selling a fragrance called Sexual Harassment. "You need to admit your mistakes. I want to do so," said Nikolay Eremin in an emotional Instagram post. #### WATER AND THE LACK OF IT!

Although we have received a considerable amount of rainfall during the Easter period, there is no doubt that the south eastern part of Spain has been experiencing drought conditions now for a prolonged period. It is also fair to say that this will not ease in the future but will soon get much worse, mirroring the desert conditions in parts of the south of Spain. Water transfers from large rivers and desal' plants may help in the future but at what cost?

The Minister for the Ecological Transition, Teresa Rivera, has just announced a project for the interconnection of all the desalination plants in Almería, Murcia and Alicante. This will be to ensure the distribution of water and almost doubling of production until 700 hm<sup>3</sup> is reached in the year 2022. It will be executed by the Segura Hydrographic Confederation, with a cost of 250 million euros. An additional 150 kilometres of pipes are planned. At present, this additional expenditure has not yet been approved. Also, the energy cost of the production of desalinated water, is almost quadruple that of the river transfers of Tajo-Segura. Each cubic metre of the water transfers from the Tago-Segura costs 1.1 Kw / hour of electricity. However, in the case of desalinated water, the energy consumption is between 3.8 kw / hour and 4.7 kw / hour per cubic metre. Many academics believe that the cost of desalinated water is very high and believe that

desalination is not the best answer to fight climate change as its energy costs are so high.

Do also remember the water is used as a political weapon in Spain. It was the socialist government in Madrid that approved the building of the Torrevieja desalination plant.

However, the then PP administration denied pipeline access through the town for a considerable time after the plant was built. The PP prefers water transfers while the Socialists prefer desalination plants.

Farmers and irrigators have up till recently being paying 30 cents per cubic metre of desalinated water. This was just about affordable to the end users. Now however, after months, if not years of pressure from the EU (the EU financed the greater part of the construction costs of the desal' plants), the state company Acuamed has informed farmers in the province that mid-April the desalinated water they will receive now from the Torrevieja plant, together with the future one they will have access to after the interconnection of all the plants, will be distributed at a price of 0.62 euros per cubic meter, as it will no longer be subsidized. This despite a drought decree still being in Even a 10 cent rise to 40 cents would be catastrophic for many farmers, and would disrupt and reduce production of broccoli, artichokes and citrus fruits, greatly and increase the cost of drinking water.


We weighed in early at 14.30 so that it would give us time to clean up and get up to the Lime Bar for the results and a


#### Did the Earth Move for You?

Cool down, Gladys, I'm talking about earthquakes!

Whether you are just a regular visitor, resident or property owner in the Costa Blanca, you should be well aware that this area is an active earthquake zone.

The province of Alicante is the area of the Iberian Peninsula that has the highest level of danger in terms of seismic risk. On average the province experiences an earthquake once every four days.

The darker coloured circle areas in the graphic on the left highlight the locations which in the past suffered the worst or highest rated quakes in the province. You will note that Torrevieja and Orihuela Costa are in one of the areas which experienced the maximum intensities.



In March 1829, the greatest earthquake recorded in this province in the modern era reached a magnitude between 6.3 and 6.6, with the epicentre in Torrevieja. It claimed 386 lives, 47 churches and four bridges. In the region of the Vega Baja, 2,965 houses were destroyed and another 2,396 badly damaged.

Alicante suffers between 90 and 100 earthquakes every year, of an average intensity of 2, so nothing too dramatic here, .....yet! (More info' on quakes locally and their cause in future issues.)

Airport Bus Timetable.

This service will provide eight return trips between Alicante-Elche Airport and Torrevieja central bus depot. It will operate every day of the year and without any stops.

Torrevieja to Airport: 7:00 - 9:00 - 10:00\* - 11:00 - 12:00\* - 13:00 - 15:00 - 16:00\* - 17:00 - 18:00\* - 19:00 - 21:00

Airport toTorrevieja: 8:00 - 10:00 - 11:00\* - 12:00 - 13:00\* - 14:00 - 16:00 - 17:00\* - 18:00 - 19:00\* - 20:00 - 22:00 (I hear that the summer timings are now year round.)
(\*) - From 1st April to 31th October

Price: €6.92. Children under 4 years travel for free but ID may be requested.

Pensioners can get a 30% discount but only if they are registered as permanent residents in the Valencian Community.

You may need to show proof of age ID plus Residencia, NIE or DNI. A bit of a palaver really.

Prior booking is not required. Sometimes the bus fills up quickly with people and you have to wait more than 2 hours for the next bus.
