Bienvenido a todos and welcome to the July, 2019 edition. Issue No.144

Finally we can welcome the summer, but as usual the season also brings with it a number of pests - and I'm not just talking about the more annoying of the Madrilenos!

There is now a province-wide high alert for the Tiger mosquito (Aedes albopictus), an invasive species. Unfortunately this pest has now colonised two thirds of the Valencian community. It can transmit numerous diseases including West Nile virus, encephalitis and dengue fever. This biting insect is also the primary vector for Chikungunya, a virus similar to dengue fever. Unfortunately a tourist from Iceland on holidays at the San Juan beach in Alicante in recent weeks returned to his homeland after contracting Chikungunya here. This is the first case ever detected in Spain. This causes an illness with an acute febrile phase that lasts from two to five days, followed by a period of pain in the joints of the extremities. Pain that may persist weeks, months or can be even years in 12% of cases!

To date, there is **no specific treatment for the virus**, but there are medications that can be used to reduce symptoms. Rest and fluids can also be useful; children and people older than 65 years are at a more sensitive risk from the virus for which there is no effective antidote. All medical staff are on alert. You can do your bit to limit the spread of the pest by emptying any stagnant or surface water in plant pots, tubs, or even glasses. And do go to the medics if you have a painful and inflamed bite.

Torrevieja introduced **surveillance cameras** in streets in 2010. Unfortunately, the lack of a maintenance program meant that many cameras and part of the system did not work. Almost a million euros has now been spent on improving the system with 90% of the 200 cameras now linked to a recording system. 75 of these are traffic cameras. Higher quality and more stable images together with licence plate recognition is now operating.

Alicante-Elche Airport is to open a new embarkation and passenger control area on July 1, which will increase by 25% the travelling capacity to board flights. 24 new automatic doors with automatic readers of boarding cards, together with specific doors for families with children and for those with reduced mobility also planned.

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
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As expected, the recent Spanish General Election did not clarify anything. Although the socialist PSOE were the most voted for party, they are well short of an overall majority. Once again it is Pacts! Pacts! Pacts! The far-left anti-austerity party Unidas Podemos say that they want to govern with the PSOE and want ministerial appointments, something acting PM Sanchez is not prepared to do. Either both parties' numbers still do not attain an overall way. majority.

Acting PM Sanchez asked the PP and Ciudadanos to abstain so that he can become PM officially. As Sanchez was responsible for the ousting of the previous PP president, he is unlikely to achieve this. This could mean another General Election within a year, the fourth within five years!

It is much the same story in many of the regions and municipalities. Party A will say to Party B, we will let you govern in city or district 5 if you allow us to rule in district 6. Three parties - PP, Ciudadanos & Vox banded together to oust the left-wing mayor of the city of Madrid, Manuela Carmena. In a deal done with far-right Vox to ensure the majority, the PP there have agreed that gender violence be rebranded as "intra-family violence," all mentions of gay pride celebrations and "LGTBI diversity" are gone, and Carmena's signature project Madrid Central - a low-emissions area in the city centre - is singled out for probable cancellation.

The Spanish Supreme Court has denied the leader of the Catalan Republican Left (ERC), Oriol Junqueras, permission to leave prison to attend a ceremony at the National Electoral Commission (JEC) on Monday, June 17, where he would be sworn in as a member of European



parliament (MEP). The former deputy premier of Catalonia, who is separatist leaders one of nine currently being held in preventive custody in Soto del Real prison in Madrid for their role in the 2017 Catalan independence drive, won a seat in the European Parliament at the May 26 vote. According to the court, if Junqueras, photo, were

granted permission to attend the JEC session in Madrid, he would also have to be allowed to attend the swearing-in ceremony at the European Parliament in Brussels on July 2. The hearings ended on June 12 and a verdict is expected within four months. Junqueras faces up to 25 years in prison was established by King Edward III of England in 1348 if found guilty of rebellion and misuse of public funds for his to recognize courage and loyalty. The General Hospital in Alicante will close 100 beds for the summer, despite longer waiting list and the massive influx of tourists. When staff go on holidays they are not replaced. As also happened last year this usually leads to a massive build-up of work in September. Also, in summer evenings, the Ministry of health will close the health centres in the area of Alicante, in line with recent vears. This means that health centres open at 8 a.m. and will close at 3 p.m. in July and August. All this despite the population of Alicante tripling in the summer!

Netflix, the streaming giant, has opened its first European production centre outside Madrid, where it aims to make between four and six TV series a year - -afigure that will rise to between 10 and 12 productions that will be filmed across the length and breadth of the country. Netflix Spain contains a huge amount of movies and TV series in English and at around €8 a month it is well worth it. You need a reasonable broadband signal.

On June 19, Ana Lucía da Silva, a Chilian and mother of five became the 1,000 gender violence fatality in Spain since official records began in 2003. Her partner, 45-year-old Salvador Ramírez is the prime suspect. Ramírez already had a murder conviction for killing his then-wife, Amanda del Carmen Cabeza, in Algeciras (Cádiz), when he was 27 and she was 22. He was sentenced to 17 years in prison and set to be released in 2020. But according to sources in the government subdelegation, he was granted Grade 3 prison status - the least restrictive - in October 2017, and conditional release in February 2018. Da Silva's family is hoping to launch a GoFundMe campaign to raise €5,700 to repatriate her body to Brazil. The City Council of Córdoba have stated that it is possible to bury her in the city for free in case the family does not have resources.

Queen Elizabeth II of England invested King Felipe as a knight of the Order of the Garter on June 17, the highest distinction granted by the British Monarchy. The solemn ceremony was held at Windsor Castle, where Don Felipe was accompanied by Doña Letizia, the Spanish Queen. According to the protocol, Don Felipe covered himself with a coat of ermine and velvet and wore a velvet hat with an ostrich feather. The Order of the Garter, which also includes King Don Juan Carlos, is the oldest and most important in the United Kingdom. It

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Orihuela City Council is planning to introduce a **new larger rubbish collection and parking area** close to the existing one in Entre Golf and near housing! A new drug which is a synthetic form of cannabis is gaining popularity among the youth in Alicante. Known popularly as Spice, Jocker, Zombie or K2, it is ten times more powerful and more addictive than marijuana. The fact it triggers a rapid effect on the consumer and is only detectable in a urine sample during the first five hours of intake makes it attractive to some. As it is undetectable in drug tests is another aspect that has increased its popularity among teens.



Synthetic cannabis is a psychoactive that can multiply by 50% the effects of the tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) that contains the Cannabis satival. It is produced in chemical laboratories in Asian countries but it was initially

developed in scientific centres to use the properties of cannabinoids in the manufacture of drugs that help, for example, to alleviate the effects of chemotherapy and some degenerative diseases. 



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Show Me the Money!

A number of first and second division footballers have been arrested in Spain over suspicions of forming a criminal organisation dedicated to match fixing, according to Spanish reports.

Spanish newspaper El Pais reported on Tuesday, May 28, that Leeds United forward Samuel Saiz is one of those individuals detained, having spent the season on loan with La Liga side Getafe.

However, Spanish radio station COPE claims that while Saiz is being investigated, he has not been formally arrested by police.

Asked about the report, a spokeswoman for the Spanish police confirmed that there was an open investigation though did not give any details.

According to El Pais, several current footballers were detained by Spanish officials on May 28, which included on-loan Leeds player

Saiz. The report also claims that former Real Madrid defender Raul Bravo has been allegedly identified as being at the head of the criminal organisation.



Other players to have been arrested includes Deportivo La Coruna's Inigo Lopez Monatana, recently-retired Borja Fernandez and former striker Carlos Aranda. Agustrin Lasaosa, president of relegated La Liga side Huesca, and Juan Carlos Galindo Lanuza, head of the club's medical team, have also been detained.

Police raided the Huesca training base early on Tuesday and all of those detained have been accused of being part of the alleged criminal organisation, corruption and money laundering.

The raid started at 8:30am local time, with Spanish state broadcaster TVE claiming that 11 individuals had been arrested.

A spokesman for Spain's National Police said: "I can confirm a police operation against match-fixing is ongoing. I cannot confirm any of the names of the detainees that are circulating in the Spanish press at this moment in time. That is because the operation is still ongoing."

How Much?

TAXI DRIVERS!

Love them or hate them, taxi drivers can become unstuck with unpaid fares. But sometimes.....

25 cups of coffee a day? No problem!

Coffee lovers who drink up to 25 cups a day can rest assured the drink is not bad for their heart, scientists say.


Some previous studies have suggested that coffee stiffens arteries, putting pressure on the heart and increasing the likelihood of a heart attack or stroke, with drinkers warned to cut down their consumption.

But a new study of more than 8,000 people across the UK found that drinking five cups a day, and even up to 25, was no worse for the arteries than drinking less than a cup a day.

The research, part-funded by the British Heart Foundation (BHF), is being presented at the British Cardiovascular Society conference in Manchester.

Experts from Queen Mary University of London (QMUL) divided 8,412 people into three groups for the study.

The first group was of those who drink less than one cup



of coffee a day, the second was of those who drink between one and three cups a day, and the third was those who drink more than three.

Some people in the latter group drank up to 25 cups a day, although the average number for people in this group was five cups a day.

Researchers found that even those drinking up to 25 cups of coffee a day were no more likely to have stiffening of arteries than those who drank less than one cup a day.

All the participants in the latest study underwent MRI heart scans and infrared pulse wave tests, and the results held true even after factors such as age, weight and smoking status were taken into account.

Dr Kenneth Fung, from QMUL, said: "Despite the huge popularity of coffee worldwide, different reports could put people off from enjoying it.

"Whilst we can't prove a causal link in this study, our research indicates coffee isn't as bad for the arteries as previous studies would suggest."

Prof Metin Avkiran, associate medical director at the BHF, said the study "rules out one of the potential detrimental effects of coffee on our arteries".

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CORRUPTION IN THE MEDICAL SECTOR

Fresenius Medical Care, a German based medical equipment company, has been fined \$231 million by the U.S. Justice Department. The company specialises in the production of medical supplies, primarily to facilitate or aid renal dialysis. It has a network of more than 3,900 dialysis clinics in North America, Europe, Latin America, Asia-Pacific and Africa. The company has been accused of paying off health and government officials in various countries to retain business there. Nearly \$85 million is to



be paid in exchange for the justice department not pressing criminal charges, while the other \$147 million will

go to settle civil charges for the Securities and Exchange Commission. The company's misconduct has allegedly affected 13 countries and netted it some \$140 million illegally. In addition to Morocco, Angola and Saudi Arabia, the company also paid bribes in Spain, the Justice Department said. Between 2007 and 2015, nephrologists from public health centres in Valencia, Almería and Barcelona, among others, took millions of euros from the company. In exchange, the company wanted advance information about tender specifications, to have patients referred to their own clinics, or for hospitals to use FMC's more expensive products.

Although there was an agreement to leave doctor's names unmentioned, an investigation by El Pais revealed two, the former head of the nephrology department at Torrecárdenas Hospital in Almería and the head of the nephrology department at the General Hospital of Valencia. In other cases, "FMC Spain made improper payments and provided benefits to six publicly employed doctors at a Spanish state-owned hospital. FMC Spain acquired a clinic owned by the doctors and then paid them 5% of all subsequent sales. In total, FMC paid the doctors over \$3 million." As for the alleged consulting work, "payment ranged from \$16,000 to approximately \$187,000 per vear."

The investigation began in 2012 thanks to a whistleblower who threatened company officials to go to the US authorities.

Still a Glut in New Homes!

The glut in (unsold) new homes in Spain exploded in just four years, from 195,184 in 2005 to peak at 649,780 in 2009, an increase of 454,596 or 233%. The new build inventory that has such big implications for the Spanish housing market, banking system, and economy. All those homes tie up a lot of capital that reduces bank lending to others increasing risks in all sorts of ways. The new homes glut is still 70% of what it was at its peak in 2009. The latest figures just published for 2018, reveal that the Spanish new homes glut shrank by just 4% last year, from 476,938 to 459,876, a decline of just 17,000 new homes sold. It is of course much easier to build new properties during a boom than it is to sell them during or after a By autonomous region, the glut is biggest in crash! Andalusia (15% of the total), the Valencian Community (19%), and Catalonia (16%). There is also a sizeable glut in Madrid (9%) and Castilla-La Mancha (9%).

Homes that haven't found a buyer in a decade will probably never find one. In the long run it would be cheaper just to knock them down now. But think of the size of the resultant bank debt!

The Hard Facts!

Ever since one could buy Viagra 'over-the-counter,' there has been a tidal-wave of 'todger-enhancers' available on the mail-order market. For the following information I am grateful to the newsletter's dedicated psychologist (and amateur gynaecologist), Dr. 'Dirty' Dingus O'Donoghue, who has just completed his fifth re-hab program at the Murcian Hospital of St. Jude (Patron of Lost Causes).

The Spanish Agency for Medicines and Health Products (La Agencia Española de Medicamentos y Productos Sanitarios) has ordered the withdrawal of six food supplements distributed by the company MARCO CORDONE-Spain,

which contain sildenafil, the active ingredient in Viagra, also with tadalafil, but have not declared them on the ingredients on the label! The six in question have been named: Bioacvit capsules, Bioacvit Extra



Forte Capsules, Torexan Capsules, Devit Forte Capsules, Devit Solo Piante Capsules and Bull Extreme Capsules.

Okay, this could no doubt lead to some embarrassing situations but an even bigger problem could be the interaction of these active ingredients with other medications and physiological conditions.

Sildenafil and tadalafil are indicated to restore impaired erectile function by increasing blood flow of the penis by the selective inhibition of phosphodiesterase 5 (PDE-5). But PDE-5 inhibitors are contraindicated in patients with acute myocardial infarction, unstable angina, stress angina, heart failure, uncontrolled arrhythmias, hypotension (blood pressure <90/50 mmHg), uncontrolled hypertension, history of ischemic stroke cerebral (ischemic stroke), in patients with severe hepatic impairment and in people with a history of non-arteritic anterior ischemic optic neuropathy or with hereditary degenerative disorders of the retina. Woodroffe was defeated by Nash in the men's final, while Lisa "Twinkletoes" Shenton claimed this year's women's crown.

Police in western Germany say divine intervention saved

a speeding driver from getting a ticket, after a pigeon photobombed a traffic enforcement camera at just the right moment. Perhaps inspired by this week's Ascension Day national



Christian holiday, Viersen police said "the Holy Ghost must have had a plan" to help the driver. Just as the radar clocked the driver at 54 km/h (33.5 mph) in a 30km/h zone and the camera flashed, the pigeon flew in front of the car, obscuring the face of the driver with its spread wings and thereby concealing the necessary evidence of who was at the wheel. Police say "thanks to the feathered guardian angel," the driver was spared a 105 euro fine but should take it as "a sign from above" to slow down.

Lincoln Police in Nebraska arrested 26-year-old Markel

Towner for allegedly resisting arrest and providing a false name to officers, the department wrote on Facebook earlier during May. Police responding to a report of a domestic assault around 10:30 p.m. found the suspect, Towner, sitting in a parked vehicle outside the



home. They noted that Towner also had two warrants for his arrest. When they questioned Towner, he allegedly gave his name as Deangelo Towns. However, the officers say they noticed a lanyard around Towner's neck that read "Markel Towner." Towner is charged with resisting arrest, obstructing a government operation, false reporting, child neglect and third-degree domestic assault.

A British tourist who'd booked an Airbnb in Amsterdam turned up to find that his £100-a-night "clean home with a private bathroom" was a roadside shipping container.

Located near Amstel station, it had three mattresses on the floor and a Portaloo. Ben Speller said he had driven past the container



three times in a taxi while looking for his lodging, before realising that this was it. Airbnb refunded him for his stay and the cost of the hotel he eventually stayed in. But "to be fair", he said on Facebook, "I got my £100's worth in comedy value".

A French anaesthetist has been accused of deliberately triggering heart attacks in 24 patients, so that he could



heroically bring them back to life. Although most were indeed revived, nine of them died as a result of his alleged poisoning. Prosecutors started investigating Frédéric Péchier, 47, after a suspicious number of patients at two clinics where he worked suffered cardiac arrests during

routine operations. Péchier – who denies all the charges – is accused of injecting them with excessive quantities of potassium chloride. He is due to stand trial later this year, and if convicted faces a life term.

A former nurse has been convicted of murdering 85 patients at two hospitals in northern Germany and handed a

life sentence. Judge Sebastian Buehrmann described Niels Högel's killing spree as "incomprehensible". Högel, photo, who is already serving life for two murders, administered lethal doses of heart medication to people in his care between 1999 and 2005. He is believed to be the most prolific killer in Germany's modern



history. Similar to Péchier, Högel 'bumped them off' and then also heroically tried to resuscitate them.

THIS SUMMER, WATCH OUT FOR.....

The hot weather here on the Costa certainly has its benefits. Unfortunately it can also encourage and play host to a number of pests. The human ones you should really be well aware of by now, but in this particular column I will concentrate on a number of 'curve balls' provided by Mother Nature.

When you venture into the sea, it is always prudent to look out for jellyfish. This is their season locally and they can be in abundance due to the lack of their natural predators in the Med' together with a warm sea and favourable winds. One of the most dangerous is the Portuguese-Man-of-War, photo. Although their stinging tentacles can reach more than 100 feet in length, 30 feet is probably the



average. From distance they can look like a plastic bag floating in water. Although they are more at home in the Atlantic, Indian and Pacific Oceans, winds and warm currents bring them here. Life guards and coast guards do keep an watch for these but there are no jellyfish nets in our local


areas. I raise the warning now because there have been two sightings recently on Costa areas which bracket our beaches.

During early June an experienced strong swimmer was stung just 150 yards from the beach in Alicante. She described the pain as excruciating and it paralysed her. She had to be helped from the water and rather than wait for an ambulance she was taken to hospital by car. There she received continuous medication for 24 hours. This particular lady had been stung on numerous occasions previously by other jellyfish but this sting was horrific. The fatalities that usually occur are not from the sting but from the subsequent paralysis when people drown. This attack happened in Cala Cantalar, which is just a little north of Santa Pola.

Fortunately the other incidents involving these dangerous creatures were just sightings off the coast of nearby Mar Menor. Who knows where the winds will send them. But remember there will be other types of jellyfish in the sea and most of them sting anyway!

There are more than 1,700 species of spiders in Spain, four of which are potentially dangerous to humans. The Black Widow Spider, Mediterranean Tarantula, Brown Recluse Spider and Mediterranean Funnel Web Spider can all deliver a nasty bite and although very painful, are very rarely fatal to humans, but will ruin your day/month!

In this column I will refer mainly to the Brown Recluse.



between 10 and 20 millimetres; this is about the size of your thumbnail. These little blighters take refuge in corners and small wall cracks and can move very

fast. But for such a small insect, they carry a very big punch with venom that is reportedly 15 times more toxic than a cobra, and 10 times more potent than sulphuric acid.

During mid-May, 45-year-old Manuel Gil Pardo was walking his two dogs with his wife on some rough ground between Sax and Elda in Alicante when he felt a pinch on

his knee. He thought nothing of it at the time but his leg soon ballooned and he had a fever of over 40°C. He spent 10 days in hospital needing urgent surgery to remove necrotic tissue and expulse the venom. He says it still



hurts! Spider bits sometimes start off with a bulls-eye type of marking (photo right) and become very itchy.

In another case a woman living in Sax, near Elda, has been in and out of hospital for a month and a half following a violin spider bite on her right leg, photo below. The spider bit both Miranda Navarro Pla, 25, and her partner at their



home. She was treated for a month and a half and would not return home until her property was fumigated.

These are three of four known bites on the Costa Blanca this year - the Spanish public health body


has refuted the idea of a 'plague', however. (Does this sound a bit like the mayor in the movie Jaws?)

If, after washing a suspected bite with warm soapy water, applying ice, and taking ibuprofen, you find yourself having a more extreme reaction, including symptoms like rapid heart rate or difficulty breathing, get to the emergency room asap.

I have included these notes on spiders above as many readers of this newsletter are not permanent residents. As their Spanish homes will be empty for some considerable periods, guess who loves to set up home in cracks, vents and sheds?

Prescriptions Are Now Needed on Certain Kinds of Common Medication.

It is common practice in Spain for people suffering headaches or other minor complaints to purchase medications such as Ibuprofen and Paracetamol over the counter at their local pharmacy. But this is about to become far more difficult due to decisions made by the Spanish Society of Community Pharmacies.

The sale of these products without prescription has been reported as a possible breach of the Law for Guarantees and the Rational Use of Medications due to the "judicial uncertainty" surrounding the practice, and as a result a prescription will be needed to acquire Paracetamol, Ibuprofeno and Omeprazol in future. The restriction applies to boxes of Ibuprofeno 600 mg and Paracetamol 1-gram pills, as well as to Omeprazol and some anti-histamine syrups. However, Ibuprofeno 400 mg and Paracetamol 500 and 650 mg pills are not affected, at least for the time being. In theory this restriction came into force in February of this year, but it is now to be applied rigidly, and dispensing chemists found to be failing to abide by the rules will be subject to fines of between 3,000 and 6,000 euros.

This service will provide eight return trips between Alicante-Elche Airport and Torrevieja central bus depot. It will operate every day of the year and without any stops.

Torrevieja to Airport: 7:00 - 9:00 - 10:00* - 11:00 - 12:00* - 13:00 - 15:00 - 16:00* - 17:00 - 18:00* - 19:00 - 21:00

Airport toTorrevieja: 8:00 - 10:00 - 11:00* - 12:00 - 13:00* - 14:00 - 16:00 - 17:00* - 18:00 - 19:00* - 20:00 - 22:00 (I hear that the summer timings are now year round.) (*) - From 1st April to 31th October

Price: $\notin 6.92$. Children under 4 years travel for free but ID may be requested.

Pensioners can get a 30% discount but only if they are registered as permanent residents in the Valencian Community.

You may need to show proof of age ID plus Residencia, NIE or DNI. A bit of a palaver really.

Prior booking is not required. Sometimes the bus fills up quickly with people and you have to wait more than 2 hours for the next bus.

Many of us who have been over here for some years will only be too aware of the many, many hours of seemingly endless queues while waiting to register for Padron, Residencia, SUMA - in fact most things. The bureaucracy in Spain teaches us all patience.

Fortunately the local council have come up with a very welcome efficiency, where one can now register online for an appointment.

On this website you can choose day, date and time for your appointment, subject of course to availability.
