Welcome to the August edition of the newsletter. Although the Costa is experiencing a massive influx of tourists and holiday-makers, many expats choose this month to return to their native land and escape the August During July, we experienced three heatwaves heat. within 15 days and daily highs now within the 30's are common, leading to saturation of the hospital emergency Melanomas are on the increase in the UK, centres. largely due to the popularity of continental holidays and ignorance of the damaging power of the sun. There are still too many people who are trying to 'rush a tan' ending up looking like a cherry, with their skin badly damaged by sunburn. Use plenty of high-factor protection, particularly for the children and reapply regularly.

Summer is a good time to witness the **shooting stars** here. Some of the best displays can be from the Delta Acuáridas, in the constellation of Aquarius, and the Lágrimas de San Lorenzo, which is expected to extend from mid-July to around August 12. The best viewings will be well away from artificial light and at about 3 or 4am. The Tears of Saint Lorenzo meteor showers are at their peak during the period August 11 to 13, with around 100 meteors an hour.

The **Brexit and political shambles** in the UK continues. The only mildly comforting bit of news was during July when Alberto Costa, a Conservative MP who is

fighting to secure post-Brexit rights for EU citizens in the UK and UK citizens in the EU, led a delegation to meet the EU's chief negotiator, Michel Barnier. Costa said: "He made very clear that the European commission has at its very top of the political agenda the protection of citizens' rights and it will continue to do everything it can to protect the rights of those 5 million citizens even in the absence of a withdrawal agreement."

In Spain the political uncertainty continues at the time of writing. If the Socialists cannot form a government by the last weekend in July, another General Election will have to be called, the fourth in four years! More inside.



In the two buildings in Alicante where the arrests took place, the police found several laptops, a number of smartphones, 9,000 euros in cash, several precision scales and drugs: hashish and marijuana.

The reason is obvious, people who run this scam are getting paid by this 'broker' for referring new depositing clients. I have seen their (very impressive) marketing spiel on Facebook. The story about Kryptonex is completely made up. They even go to the lengths to make a fake 'Coindesk' news page to make it look real. Their fake page is called Coinvest. More or less i all text and links on the fake website will direct you straight back to the Kryptonex scam website in order to try and make you "invest" money.

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
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Two young British lads, aged 21 and 22, died while



taking a selfie at Punta Prima. They reportedly fell down a 12-metre cliff there onto the concrete base. One died at the scene while the other died later after being taken by helicopter to Alicante General Hospital. The accident occurred at around 7:30pm on July 3rd. 49 people have died from selfie-related deaths around the world since 2014. The average age of the victim was 22 and 75% were men.

A 66-year-old Russian man was knocked down and killed while **cycling on the N-332** in Torrevieja. Unfortunately the



driver of the car, a 33-year-old British man, left the accident scene, reporting shortly afterwards to the Policia Local in Rojales. The driver was not detained but is charged with reckless homicide and

abandoning the scene of an accident.

The **los Locos beach in Torrevieja** is to receive 300,000 cubic metres of sand over the next 10 years in a project to maintain the beach there. The introduction of the new sand will begin in 2020 with 30,000 cubic metres. The council will also spend four million euros in repairing and renewing the beach promenade there which has been badly damaged. The project was originally planned in 2011! No rush then!



While the traffic on the N-332 continues to be horrendous through Torrevieja (43,000 vehicles a day!) - largely due to the inability of the local council and others to get their act together for several years - the council have now generously awarded themselves a 10% increase. Councillors who now head departments will receive a payment of €3,500 per month. The ruling PP will also appoint 19 advisors, all of whom will be paid. The two heads of the opposition parties, PSOE & Vox, will each receive a payment of €3,100 monthly. The opposition parties will all also receive a lump sum monthly to distribute according to their own wishes. Various attendance allowances are also payable to councillors. These range between €175 to €250 per attendance. Now there will be lots and lots of meetings but this does not mean that they can't and will still fuck things up! The councillors who head departments will also receive a credit card for 'entertainment' and other 'necessary' expenditure.

In the **Orihuela municipality**, the position is a little different. Although the PP were the most voted-for party, unlike in Torrevieja they do not have an overall majority. Accordingly, if they want any of the councillors or their advisors to be paid they will need the support of one of the opposition parties. This is unlikely to be achieved unless some councillors from the opposition receive head of department jobs in the new municipal government, i.e. You scratch my back and I'll scratch yours!

A 70-year-old man drowned at the La Glea beach in Campoamor on Sunday, July 7 at 14:50. Attempts to resuscitate him failed. This was the first of what will be a number of drownings of older folks off our coast this summer. Whether the causes are strong currents such aS rip-tides, shock from cold water or just exhaustion, the results are unfortunately all too common.

After two years of processing, the PP Mayor of Pilar de Horadada, has suspended the application for the construction of a mosque for the Muslim community in The mayor gave the reason as the municipality. "municipal services can be put to work looking for a global solution in which the Muslim community and the rest of neighbours live' i.e. shelved! We experienced two very light showers during the second week of July. Unfortunately the light rain also brought what the Spanish call 'African dust'. Water vapour accumulating in the lower parts of the atmosphere is condensed in the form of drops that blend with the Saharan desert dust in suspension dropping with the fine rain. Unfortunately the dust covered cars, washing lines and anything in the open. Over the two days car washes made a fortune!



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#### **More Local News:**

Bathing on three beaches in La Marina, Elche, were closed

The Hospital de Sant Joan in Alicante has opened a new facility there to cater for patients with eating disorders. 40% of the patient intake in the specialist facility are minors and the the younger age of patients with serious problems of **anorexia** has been alarming. Equally shocking was the recent admission of an 11-year-old with the condition.

Two earthquakes were recorded in our area over three days in July. A small quake of magnitude 1.8 was recorded in the area of Los Montesinos on July 11 at 23:41. A much stronger **quake** of around 3.2 shook Jacarilla at 23:12 on July 13. Quakes of a magnitude of less than 2 are not usually noticed by humans although animals are more susceptible.

**Do not tie your dogs to walls/railings** when you shop in supermarkets. Some dogs are taken by dog-fighting gangs to be used for training their fighting dogs. More aggressive dogs are taken for profit, as an aggressive dog on the black market can cost 600 euros, but owners and organizers can be paid up to 3,000 euros following a profitable fight.

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### Driving in Spain - Watch Out For......

Articles 17 and 18 of the Spanish driving code which states "The driver of a vehicle is obliged to maintain freedom of movement, clear field of vision and full attention, to guarantee the driver's own safety plus the occupants in the car and other road users." Now whereas certain activities are not expressly forbidden by law, it is at the discretion of the police officer as to whether in doing them, the driver is posing a danger on a road. For example:

**Footwear:** If you are driving wearing flip-flops, stilettos, barefoot or other footwear deemed unsuitable by the policed, you risk a €200 fine and two points on your licence.

**Playing Loud Music:** Driving with the volume up so high that you might not be aware of sirens could also earn you a fine. So too is driving with music blasting out when in an urban area or close to a hospital, possibly a school as well.

Eating, drinking or lighting a cigarette: These also carry a penalty as you are risking distraction. You could be fined  $\in 200$  and receive 2 points on your licence. Tossing a cigarette butt out a vehicle's window is illegal, punishable with a minimum  $\in 200$  fine and the loss of four points off one's driver's license.

Hanging your arm out of the window: Driving with your arm hanging out of the window, gesticulating out the window without cause or even sticking your elbow out could result in a fine of up to €80!

No shirt!: Driving without a shirt on could also result in a fine of €200. This is because in the case of an accident injury could be sustained through skin contact with the airbag or seat belt, for example.

**Sat-Nav:** Having a sat-nav attached to the interior of your windscreen could be considered a distraction if it affects visibility of the road ahead. Keep it off the windscreen or face a fine.

Unjustified use of the horn: This might surprise regular drivers in Spain, but beeping the horn without good reason can apparently land you with a fine of  $\in 80$ . Justified use of the horn includes alerting someone to avoid an accident. It isn't considered justified to beep at your neighbour to attract his attention so you can wave at him. Nor is it justified to sound the horn if the driver in front is slow pulling away on a green light - but tell that to every single Spanish driver!

**Drive through a traffic light on amber:** The guidelines state that if you can come to a stop in time on an amber light without risking someone running into the back of you, then you should stop, or face a £80 fine.

**Feet on the dashboard:** The driver could be liable for a fine even if the front seat passenger sits back with their feet on the dashboard.

**Others:** Pets must be properly secured and any objects should be secured so that they don't move in case of a sudden stop.

When at a petrol station: Smoking, talking on a mobile phone, leaving the lights or the radio on while filling up could also land you in trouble with the fuzz!



### **U.K. Welfare Benefit Information**

Attendance Allowance is a benefit for people aged over 65 and who may need extra help to stay independent at home, due to an illness or disability.

You could get: £58.70 or £87.65 a week if you need help both in the day and at night.

Completing the lengthy form, you need to show that you need help at home or someone to keep an eye on you. This can include help such as getting out of bed, help to wash and dress.

You don't need to have carers to help you but the money can help pay towards this.

The benefit is not means tested and does not affect your state pension or other income.

Torrevieja Town Hall has introduced an initiative to reduce illegal and careless dumping of rubbish, garden or otherwise. Although citizens are invited to telephone the local police when they witness these offences, by the time the police arrive,

the offenders are usually gone. Torrevieja now have an email address - porunatorreviejalimpia@gmail.com - and a telephone number - 966 702 390 - and are encouraging people to report the offenders, preferably backed up with a photo, showing car registration number if possible. Debris and plant remains from Torrevieja are often deposited in Los Montesinos, Rojales and Orihuela Costa. Carmen Gómez, the councillor responsible for urban cleanliness, stressed, 'We will never reveal who has reported it, because it may be a neighbour, ......but the offender will never know who took the photo and made the complaint.' Fines for the offenders range from 100 to €750. (Now don't blame me if you get



beaten-up by an irate landscape gardener!) The City Hall has now announced a shock cleaning program until the end of August, costing €117,000 per month.

#### The Dream Scene - a Selfie!

The Dream Scene began distribution in March 2007. It started as a four-page monthly purely for the Dream Hills urbanisation only, but within a matter of a few months it became popular with people from outside this immediate area and the circulation was expanded further afield. It is now a 40-page newsletter of which 1,200 copies are printed and distributed each month. About another 150 are sent out by email and the website www.dreamhills.orihuelacosta.eu (controlled by Stefan Pokroppa). He also kindly publishes the archives, which are viewed by an unknown number. I calculate that on average, each printed copy is read by at least two people, as they are passed around. The Dream Scene is run as a hobby - albeit a timeconsuming one - and is not a business. It is the adverts that pay for the printing, which costs a minimum of €500 per month, and ads are essential to its survival and distribution. The advertising rate are minimal and have **not changed** since March 2007 - most of the ads cost €5 a month (some €3!) with a full page at €20. Charity adverts included pay little or nothing. The plan is to break-even at best and fortunately many subscribers are very kind with their donations. I do turn away some adverts for a number of

I thought about putting the newsletter just online, but I know that this would not suit many readers, and would by its nature be less effective for the advertisers.

It is important that the advertisers see that their products, skills or services promoted to as wide an audience as possible. The monthly printed edition is now circulated to selected outlets in Via Park V, Via Park III, lower Los Altos, Los Balcones, Punta Marina, La Florida (if there are any spare copies), Los Montesinos, Entre Naranjas, San Miguel (Help Vega Baja), & Help at Home at Cabo Roig and Playa Flamenca. There are also a number of home deliveries locally, which I try to keep to a minimum. I could easily increase the circulation by as much as 50%, but this would mean a significant increase in the cost of adverts: small can be beautiful!

The great majority of advertisers pay their bills. Sometimes bars/cafes will close down without notice and that may result in the loss of a month or two's payment. But then this is nothing compared to what the bar/cafe owner may be losing on closure, so one can empathise.

The largest single debt the newsletter has ever carried was for €360, which has now been paid in full.

Special thanks to The Dream Scene Team: Tid who checks the final copy every month and sees me appear occasionally from the spare room (office!); Cartoonist Angela, Sue who chases up payment and changes to many of the local adverts; Media Costa Blanca for the printing, Alby, Dave, John & Alan, who help deliver, and of course the advertisers and subscribers.






#### Don't Pee in the Pool!

It's recently been reported that scientists have managed to create a test to measure how much urine is in a swimming pool. It seems that peeing in the pool has become commonplace, and even high-profile swimmers have admitted to doing it during rigorous training sessions, arguing that the chlorine "kills it". Not only is this untrue, but the chemical reaction that occurs between your pee and the chlorine creates a chemical that has been linked to asthma and other respiratory issues.

Nitrogen trichloride, also known as trichloramine, is made when the urea in your pee reacts with chlorine – the disinfectant widely used in swimming pool water. Nitrogen trichloride is largely made by accident in pools these days, but this compound was originally made for interest in 1812 by Pierre Louis DuLong.

DuLong made the chemical by bubbling chlorine gas through a solution of ammonium chloride. But, despite his success, DuLong's joy at having made it was probably short-lived – he hadn't counted on the fact that it would be explosive – the chemical exploded without warning and cost him an eye and a finger. It's extremely sensitive and will explode even under gentle shock or when exposed to sunlight.

Scientists Sir Humphry Davy and Michael Faraday also fell victim to the substance when they repeated DuLong's work shortly after. An explosion also caused Davy to lose the use of an eye temporarily



and Faraday did permanent damage to his fingers.

Luckily for professional swimmers, only pure nitrogen trichloride is explosive, and so the fact that it is mixed with water and other substances in a swimming pool should be reassuring. However, research suggests that nitrogen trichloride, among other products formed when you pee in chlorinated water, such as chloramine and dichloramine, is linked to eye and upper airway irritation.

It's rather ironic that the chlorine that is used to kill bacteria and protect the health of swimmers, is linked to the creation of toxic chemicals. But also that the aroma that people associate with a clean pool, is actually the stench of nitrogen trichloride and an indicator of plenty of pee.

### 34 Human Trafficking in Alicante.

Alicante Province is one of the hot-spots in Spain for human trafficking. Luis Jiménez De Mingo, the head of the Central Anti-trafficking Brigade, shed some light on this major problem. He outlines five cases of human trafficking: Sexual exploitation, theft, forced marriages, forced labour and begging. Romania and Nigeria are the countries which supply the largest number of traffickers and victims. Romanian criminal organizations are the worst trafficking offenders in Spain, he says. They carry out robberies, forced marriages, crimes against sexual exploitation, begging and forced labour in the fields. The Nigerian Mafia, he explained, are more focused on sexual exploitation. Women are lured to Spain with promises of hotel and other work and then forced into prostitution,



often
intimidating
them with
voodoo and
threatening to
harm their
families if they
do not repay
the travelling

debt.

One of the problems in investigating these cases is the reluctance of the victims to testify against their exploiters. Even so, the National Police have conducted 98 operations against trafficking in the province during the last three years. Of these, 86 were for sexual exploitation.

The police now have a strategy of blocking accounts, intervening goods, closing clubs and seizing vehicles before any arrests. This avoids the disappearance of money and allows the dismantling of the trafficking network. Luis stressed the importance of police cooperation at an international level, with Europol and Interpol, to ensure the chopping off of the criminal organization in the country of origin, in addition to the arrests which can be carried out in Spain.

#### Weird & Wonderful!

Summer is obviously the peak time for fiestas in Spain. The world knows about the Pamplona Bull Run, but there are many other fiestas celebrating the unusual and plain weirdness.

One of the most unusual is Fiesta de Santa Marta de Ribarteme, (the patron saint of resurrection).held on July



29. This takes place in the small town of As Neves (The Snows) in Galicia, close to the border with Portugal. In late July every year, thousands of people visit

the town to witness and take paret in the pilgrimage. People who have passed-through a near death experience during the previous 12 months, either carry a coffin or are carried in a coffin by family and friends. As in many pilgrimages, there is a mix of solemnity and celebration.

In the town of Castrillo de Murcia, near Burgos, for more than four centuries the townsfolk have been

the most unusual
way. Here, men
dressed in yellow
and red
costumes
represent the
devil and they



leap over babies of less than a year old, to rid them of 'original sin'. The baby jumping part of the festivities is the culmination of celebrations but the fiesta also involves the 'devils' running through the streets while youths of the town shout insults at them, while the 'devils' chase and try to whip them.


#### Moors & Christians Fiesta - Orihuela City.



### Prescriptions Are Now Needed on Certain Kinds of Common Medication.

It is common practice in Spain for people suffering headaches or other minor complaints to purchase medications such as Ibuprofen and Paracetamol over the counter at their local pharmacy. But this is about to become far more difficult due to decisions made by the Spanish Society of Community Pharmacies.

The sale of these products without prescription has been reported as a possible breach of the Law for Guarantees and the Rational Use of Medications due to the "judicial uncertainty" surrounding the practice, and as a result a prescription will be needed to acquire Paracetamol, Ibuprofeno and Omeprazol in future. The restriction applies to boxes of Ibuprofeno 600 mg and Paracetamol 1-gram pills, as well as to Omeprazol and some anti-histamine syrups. However, Ibuprofeno 400 mg and Paracetamol 500 and 650 mg pills are not affected, at least for the time being. In theory this restriction came into force in February of this year, but it is now to be applied rigidly, and dispensing chemists found to be failing to abide by the rules will be subject to fines of between 3,000 and 6,000 euros.

Torrevieja to Airport: 7:00 - 9:00 - 10:00\* - 11:00 - 12:00\* - 13:00 - 15:00 - 16:00\* - 17:00 - 18:00\* - 19:00 - 21:00

Airport toTorrevieja: 8:00 - 10:00 - 11:00\* - 12:00 - 13:00\* - 14:00 - 16:00 - 17:00\* - 18:00 - 19:00\* - 20:00 - 22:00 (I hear that the summer timings are now year round.)
(\*) - From 1st April to 31th October

Price: €6.92. Children under 4 years travel for free but ID may be requested.

Pensioners can get a 30% discount but only if they are registered as permanent residents in the Valencian Community.

You may need to show proof of age ID plus Residencia, NIE or DNI. A bit of a palaver really.

Prior booking is not required. Sometimes the bus fills up quickly with people and you have to wait more than 2 hours for the next bus.

Many of us who have been over here for some years will only be too aware of the many, many hours of seemingly endless queues while waiting to register for Padron, Residencia, SUMA - in fact most things. The bureaucracy in Spain teaches us all patience.

On this website you can choose day, date and time for your appointment, subject of course to availability.

And don't forget your local municipality will also have at least an extra two days of holidays, dependent on the local patron saint days, although most stores will ignore these.

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
#### The Compensation.
