Bienvenido a todos and welcome to the September, 2019 edition. Issue No.146

The latest set of data regarding the residential property market to come from Spain's notaries was published in early August and reports a sharp year-on-year decrease of 18.9% in sales figures and a corresponding fall of 16.2% in mortgage activity to June 2019 across the country as a whole. This would appear to confirm the figures from previous months noting that the level of activity in the property market during recent months is probably stabilising after a long period of significant growth. Prices of re-sales rose by an average of 5% over the last 12 months. However with almost half a million new unoccupied properties on the sales register, the outlook can't be great!

Ryanair cabin crew in Spain are threatening to strike for 10 days in September over the airline's plans to shut down bases in Gran Canaria, Tenerife and Girona. The unions lodged a notice of their plans for industrial action on September 1, 2, 6, 8, 13, 15, 20, 22, 27 and 28. The Irish low-cost carrier operates 13 bases in Spain, all of which would be affected by the stoppages. These stoppages have yet to be confirmed, but the unions believe some stoppages are inevitable.

There have been a number of **Listeria outbreaks** in Andalucia and Alicante. The outbreak in Andalucia is particularly concerning. It was detected on August 15 with around 200 people infected. A total of 53 people remain hospitalized, 23 of them pregnant women and one woman

over 90 has died. (La Mecha cooked pork products have been withdrawn.) According to the Ministry of Health there have been 22 cases in Alicante during the last year and the more recent nine cases are unrelated to the Andalucian case. The foods in which listeria can be found are mainly meats, pates, raw eggs, smoked fish, seafood, raw vegetables and unpasteurized milks and cheeses. During 2017, there were 2,480 cases of listeriosis in humans in the EU, with 227 deaths in 16 member states, implying a high mortality rate. In Spain, for the same year, there were 284 confirmed cases of the bacteria. In the UK, six people died from the virus already this year after eating contaminated hospital food.





Regular readers will be aware of the occasional lunacy emanating from the **Catalan** region regarding separatism and the **'positive discrimination'** to promote the language and its 'doctored ' history. An audit has revealed that a self-styled 'Catalan NGO', La Platform per la Llengua, receives wages of half a million euros annually for its 19 employees.

This is the entity that "observed incognito" children and teachers in 50 Catalan schools and playgrounds to see if they spoke in Catalan. They also developed a mobile application to encourage users to report on the social networks businesses (bars, restaurants and shops) who use Spanish rather than Catalan. Annually they promote a Kid's Fiesta for Play and Leisure. However banners promoting for the release of the 'political' prisoners tried for the illegal referendum proliferated during the event. Still in Catalonia, the Barcelona authorities admit the **city is suffering from a "security crisis."** There have been seven violent deaths in the space of 40 days, caused by fights and shootouts. There were also three stabbings in a little over 24 hours. So far this year, 11 people have been violently killed in the Catalan capital, a figure that already surpasses the mark for all of last year (10). Statistics show a 9% global rise in crime in Barcelona so far this year. Batlle, a former director general of the Catalan police force, the Mossos d'Esquadra, said that the rising crime rate in Barcelona should be addressed in a "serene and responsible" manner. He recommended "intensifying security policies" but also working on "social policies." And when the police start talking 'bolux' you know you are in trouble!

Since the beginning of 2019, 13 people have been killed violently in Barcelona. Two months after a high-ranking official in the South Korean government died after having been the victim of a violent robbery in Barcelona. Then on the evening of Sunday, August 18, Afghanistan's ambassador to Spain was violently robbed by a group of youths in Barcelona. The incident took place near the central Metro station Jaume I, in Ciutat Vella, when five young people attacked the diplomat to steal his luxury watch. (Maybe safer in Kabul, but I doubt it!) Attacks and robberies of tourists there are on the increase. Last year the city witnessed 299 daily robberies, or 12 every hour! The figures for 2019 will undoubtedly exceed those, murders already exceeding last year's figures.

A 53-year-old Columbian man has been detained while caught 'upskirting' in Madrid. The perve had disguised his cellphone in the pocket of his rucksack and posted 555 videos of his 'upskirting' online in porn sites. The footage, which includes that of a couple of minors, has enabled the investigators to identify 29 of the victims in just five days, as some of their faces were also recorded. Supermarkets and the Metro were this guy's favourite studios!

ELECTRIC SCOOTERS.

One can't but notice the arrival of the electric scooters on the local roads - one extra hazard!

On August 13, a 90-year-old woman called Bertha, was taking a morning stroll with her walker through the pedestrianized section of the Rambla del Carme, in the Catalan town of Esplugues de Llobregat. As she was heading back home, she was hit from behind by an electric scooter carrying two people. Berta fell and hit her head against the pavement. She suffered internal bleeding and died later in Moisès Broggi Hospital. According to the public prosecutor, the 19-year-old young man was looking at his cellphone when he ran into the 90-year-old. (What is it with cellphones and the Spanish? If you are out driving locally, you are bound to see a pedestrian crossing the road while checking their mobile phone. I think maybe the cellphone should appear in their national flag!)

The public prosecutor advises that the man committed "minor recklessness." This is an intermediary category between a minor and serious crime and will probably result in a fine. A private prosecution was launched by Bertha's nephews, but as Berta was a widow and did not have any children, this practically rules out the possibility of awarding damages to her relatives.

According to the Spanish media, this is the first case of a pedestrian fatality caused by one of these scooters, worldwide.

The Spanish traffic authority (DGT) believe that there are 100,000 of this type of scooter and Segways in Spain. The DGT drew up a draft royal decree to unite criteria and guides for municipalities so that they could pass their own standards and rules. This was ready in July, but the lack of government in Spain means that it hasn't been approved yet and any helpful legislation is still a long way off.

Electric scooters aren't that eco-friendly. Manufacturing, transporting, and maintaining them produces plenty of emissions.

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

As no one party gained a sufficient majority in the local elections in Orihuela, the municipal responsibilities will now be divided up between a PP and Ciudadanos coalition. It is likely that Ciudadanos will now have responsibility for Urbanism and Territory, Human Resources, Culture and Youth, Infrastructure, Works and Services, Beaches, Education and Public Safety. The PP will manage the remainder. The individuals who will have the responsibility in these various areas have not been assigned yet, at least not publicly. They have, however, managed to award themselves a salary increase of between 5 and 10%.

The top-dog (PP mayor of the municipality - Bascunana) will get an annual basic salary of €61,537, while the deputy mayor will receive €48,350. Other new annual salaries for the politicians will range from €46,152 to €28,000 for parttimers. Additional attendance allowances are also payable and added to these figures.

But one must admire the audacity and brazenness of the new PP administration in nearby Pilar de la Horadada. Here they have awarded themselves massive annual increases. Here, the newly elected mayor, José María Pérez Sánchez -



€44,800 a year for full time work, six will cash in €36,000 annually for 30 hours a week and one will get €7,000 for 6 hours a week. The overall wages of the paid PP politicians there have increased by 100% and this in an area of only around 22,000 registered. The mayor will continue to run his other businesses while holding office, considering it of "marginal importance"! In 2018, Spanish TV channel Cuatro carried out an investigation into allegations of cronyism in the then PSOE-run town hall, which at the time had 355 civil servants!

Unfortunately we are all only too aware of **the lack and neglect of the facilities in the coastal areas** by the three main political parties in Orihuela. This came to light once again during early August when the council obtained a new steam cleaning machine based on feedback from the coastal residents during March 2018. And where was the new machine placed......Orihuela city, of course!

The foreign population registered in the municipality is 24,308 with only 4,216 registered to vote. In the last election only 2,637 of these voted. We now face yet another four years of neglect in the coastal areas, largely due of the laziness in the bulk of the expats.

A 40-year old woman from the north of Spain was



badly bitten by a fish at the beach of El Rebolla, between Guaredamar and Santa Pola on August 7. This was the third such incident in the area within six weeks. On this occasion the bite was quite severe, as it severed one of her tendons to the foot, photo. The culprit here is thought to be **the Bluefish**, with around 35 very sharp triangular saw-teeth. Although a fierce predator of smaller fish, they are known to have cut through fishermen's nets and hooks without much difficulty. Although the fish can grow up to a metre, they normally swim in deep water but will normally only approach the shoreline during the summer months to feed on smaller fish.

This is a little bit of good news, but then again the IBI has been increased by 41% over the last seven years. The council also announced that they had a \in 12.5 million surplus. Now wouldn't it be some really good news if they spent part or all of that on the coast? Unlikely!

Testing for Alzheimer's

A blood test that can detect signs of Alzheimer's as much as 20 years before the disease begins to have a debilitating effect has been developed by researchers in the US.

Scientists at the Washington University School of Medicine in St Louis in Missouri believe the test can identify changes in the brain suggestive of Alzheimer's with 94% accuracy, while being much cheaper and simpler than a PET brain scan.

The results of the study, which was published in the journal Neurology recently, represent a potential breakthrough in the fight against the disease.

"Right now we screen people for clinical trials with brain scans, which is time-consuming and expensive, and enrolling participants takes years," said the senior author, Randall Bateman, a leading professor of neurology.

But with a blood test, we could potentially screen thousands of people a month. That means we can more efficiently enrol participants in clinical trials, which will help us find treatments faster, and could have an enormous impact on the cost of the disease as well as the human suffering that goes with it."

The researchers said they had found a way to measure levels of the protein amyloid beta, a key indicator of Alzheimer's, in the blood. They can then use such levels to predict whether the protein has accumulated in the brain.

That analysis could then be combined with two other major Alzheimer's risk factors – age and the presence of the genetic variant APOE4 – to accurately identify the relevant changes in the brain.

The researchers said the clumps of protein begin to form in the brain up to two decades before the onset of the characteristic memory loss, suggesting the tests could be used to predict Alzheimer's years in advance.

However, the benefits of such testing would not be seen to their fullest extent until treatments to halt the disease are developed.

In January 2018, a team of scientists revealed their work on a test that used mass spectrometry techniques to identify patients with a rogue peptide in their blood plasma, indicating a buildup of beta-amyloid in the brain.

The latest study looked at 158 people aged older than 50. All but 10 of the participants in the new study were cognitively normal and each provided at least one blood sample and underwent one PET brain scan.

The researchers found that the blood tests gave the same results as the PET scans 88% of the time, which was not satisfactory. In order to improve the accuracy, the scientists began incorporating the other risk factors, increasing the accuracy to more than 90%. (The Guardian)

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

The ultimate No-Deal Brexit checklist for Brits in Spain

We don't yet know what will happen when the October 31st Brexit deadline arrives. But whatever the scenario, it's best to be prepared.

Maybe Britain will crash out of the EU and chaos will ensue. Maybe, Brexit will be cancelled all together. No one knows.

The good news is that Spain is prepared for a No Deal scenario and has made contingency plans to outline the rights of Britons resident in Spain. These were brought into law in a Royal Decree in March and guarantee that Brits legally here on Brexit date will be offered new permanent residency papers.

I outline below an abridged 12-point checklist to help you prepare for what comes next. Links to the complete text will be listed at the bottom of this article.

1. Make sure that you're legally resident in your host country.

This is the ONE thing that all Brits living in Spain should make sure they do and has been repeated incessantly by British Embassy and consular staff in the run up to Brexit. This will provide evidence the date of your arrival in your host country and provides proof that you were legally resident on October 31st 2019, when Britain exits the EU. This will streamline the process when it comes to applying for whatever residency arrangement is decided after Brexit, whether there is a Withdrawal Agreement or dreaded No Deal.

2. Register with Hacienda

Make sure that you've submitted income and other tax returns if you've been there long enough to do so (even if all your income comes from the UK).

3. Check your healthcare

Make sure that you are registered with Spanish social security and that you have a health card. Your rights may change if there is a no-deal Brexit and the Spanish and UK authorities have vowed to strike a reciprocal agreement so will easier to prove that you were entitled to it if you are already in the system.

If you have health insurance, keep it updated and see if you can guarantee your current rate will be maintained for at least the next year. Premiums might well go up for Brits after Brexit.

4. Exchange your British driving licence for a Spanish one.

If you're still using a UK driving licence, apply to change it for a Spanish one as soon as possible because on October 31st 2019 the EU rules under which UK licences are recognised in the EU27 will lapse if there is no deal.

5. Check your passport.

You'll need to comply with different rules to enter and travel around the Schengen area post Brexit although we don't yet know what they might be. Make suree your passport has got plenty of time left, at least more than six months

6. Get the paperwork ready!

Now we all know the Spanish bureaucrats love of paper. Make a dossier as if you're applying for a proof of residence or permanent residence document. Include utility bills, tax documents, statements, wage slips (if paid in Spain) etc, etc. These will help to prove how long you have lived in Spain, hopefully!

7. Prepare financially.

Take a cool and serious look at your income and sterling assets and see what another significant drop in the sterling/euro rate would do to your lifestyle here. If you are still getting your British bank to transfer from pounds to euros for you, you need to wise up as it is costing you at least five cents in every euro you send over. More on this in the future.

10. Top up your medication before October 31st 2019.

Self explanatory in case of delays and bureaucratic hurdles.

11. Get your professional qualifications recognised now.

The European Commission has said that, whatever the outcome of the negotiations, Brexit does not affect decisions made pre-Brexit by EU27 countries recognising UK qualifications under the general EU directive on the recognition of professional qualifications (Directive 2005/36/EC).

12. Make sure that you're in your host country on 31st October 2019.

Ideally it would be best to be in your host country on those dates but if not possible, try to be somewhere in the Schengen zone.

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

Middle-aged adults who sit for more than nine hours a day double their risk of early death

Middle-aged adults who sit for more than nine hours a day are doubling their risk of early death, but walking briskly for 24 minutes can help extend life, a study suggests. Previous research has repeatedly suggested that sedentary behaviour is bad and physical activity is good for health. But a team from the University of Leicester and Norwegian School of Sport Sciences in Oslo wanted to determine how indolent behaviour impacts early death, and analysed eight large studies. During the 5.8 year follow-up 5.9% of the 36,000 people in the studies had died. Deaths fell steeply as the total amount of physical activity increased to a plateau of about 300 minutes (five hours) per day of light-intensity physical activity - such as walking - or about 24 minutes per day moderate intensity physical activity, like jogging, tennis or heavy gardening. However the risk of dying more than doubled for people who spent more than nine and half hours sitting.

Professor Tom Yates, a professor of physical activity, sedentary behaviour and health at the University of Leicester and a co-author of the study, said: "These results are fantastic. It has previously been widely assumed that more is better in terms of physical activity for health. "However, this study suggests health may be optimised with just 24 minutes per day of brisk walking or other forms of moderate-intensity physical activity. Another important finding was that spending 9.5 hours or more each day sedentary - which essentially means sitting was associated with a statistically significant increased risk of death, with each hour more above this threshold increasing the risk of death further. This highlights the importance of avoiding spending most of the day sitting, as well undertaking purposeful physical activity." Examples of light intensity activity includes walking slowly or light tasks such as cooking or washing dishes. Moderate activity includes brisk walking, vacuuming or mowing the lawn, while vigorous activity includes jogging, carrying heavy loads or digging. They found that higher levels of physical activity lowered the risk of death. Dr Charlotte Edwardson, an associate professor in physical activity, sedentary behaviour and health at the University of Leicester and a coauthor of the study, said: "These findings really reinforce the saying 'Doing something is better than doing nothing'.

"They show that physical activity of any intensity lowers the risk of death, so if you're someone who doesn't achieve the recommended levels of moderate intensity physical activity, then doing more light activity, for example, pottering around more at work or at home and just generally being on your feet more, will still be beneficial. "Our results provide important data for informing public health recommendations, and suggest that the public health message might simply be "sit less, move more and more often"."

The results were published in the BMJ. (The Telegraph)

DISASTER!

One could argue that there have been two disasters taking place in Spain this summer. Firstly, the very hot and dry weather has increased the risk and occurrence of forest fires and secondly, fatalities from drowning locally are on the increase.

Although much of Spain has been at risk from the fires, Gran Canaria has been badly hit with a large swathe of the island destroyed by the flames. Aside from 6,000 of the residents being evacuated from their homes, the natural flora and fauna has been destroyed in a large section of the island, environmentalists believing that it will take as much as 20 years to restore it.

From January to August 2018, eight people died from drowning in our province, Alicante. This year the figure for the seven and a half months up to mid-August was 17, more than twice the figure for the similar period last year. This is not acceptable. Although lifeguards have carried out more than 500 rescues on the beaches, the hot weather and crowded beaches encouraged particularly older bathers to swim outside of lifeguard attendance hours, i.e. early mornings and late evenings. Bathers are also searching for small and quieter coves which are, of course, unsupervised. Our local coastline is particularly notorious for strong currents. 71% of those drowned so far this year have been 55 years old or older.

One of the saddest tragedies has been the drowning of a three-year-old from an unsupervised urbanisation pool in Orihuela Costa.

This, he claimed, was the money needed to pay his informants and locate hitmen who could carry out the operation. And of course the ladies paid him. According to figures from the EU's statistic agency Eurostat, based on 2017 data, 8.8% of women in the country were over 40 when they gave birth to their first child. A number of experts point out that more than half the women who are not mothers would have liked to have had children but a prolonged wait due to the lack of secure employment, difficulty finding an affordable place to live and a lack of state subsidies, has worked against them.

Other women simply prefer to be older mothers, a cultural shift based on the desire for greater economic and professional stability.



On August 18, The Sunday Times reported that it had obtained a copy of the Operation Yellowhammer report in full, which outlines for the British Cabinet the "most likely aftershocks" which would follow a No-deal Brexit on October 31, 2019. But I have included below the section which deals with Brits in Europe.

Brits in Europe

i) UK nationals will lose their EU citizenship and can expect to lose associated rights and access to services over time, or be required to access them on a different basis. All member states have now published legislative proposals, but not all have passed legislation to secure all rights for UK nationals.

There is a mixed picture across member states in terms of the level of generosity and detail in the legislation. In some member states, UK nationals need to take action now. Complex administrative procedures within member states, language barriers and uncertainty regarding the UK political situation are contributing to some UK nationals being slow to take action. Demands for help on Her Majesty's government will increase significantly, including an increase in consular inquiries and more complex and time-consuming consular assistance cases for vulnerable UK nationals.

Cross-government support, including continued close engagement and clear communications from UK government departments and the departmental agencies, will be needed to help manage the demand.

- ii) An EU member state would continue to pay a pension it currently pays to a UK national living in the EU.
- iii) The commission and individual member states do not agree to extend the current healthcare arrangements for UK state pensioners and tourists beyond October 31, 2019, and refuse offers by the UK to fund treatments. Member states take no further action to guarantee healthcare for UK nationals and treat them in the same way as the other "third country" nationals. UK pensioners, workers, travellers and students will need to access healthcare in different ways, depending on the country. Healthcare systems may require people to demonstrate residency and current or previous employment, to enter a social insurance scheme or to purchase private insurance. Member states should treat people with urgent needs but may require them to pay after the fact. There is a risk of disruption for patients, and a minority could face substantial costs.

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Inheritance Tax (IHT) in Spain

Due to the landmark ruling of the European Court of Justice of 3rd September 2014, ALL non-residents, including those with residence outside the European Union and the EEA, are entitled to lenient regional tax reliefs in equal footing as residents.

Regional IHT reliefs in Spain for the most part suppress or even negate inheritance tax (as opposed to the national tax reliefs which do not and are found wanting), with the now centre-right government in region of Andalucia being the most generous with regional gift and inheritance allowances up to one million euros!

Before anyone cracks open the champagne, I need to throw in a damper. For this change to operate affecting ALL non-residents (the world over), Spain's Inheritance Act from 1987 must first be amended. And in so far it has not. So right now, you need to be resident in the EU or in the EEA to benefit from regional tax reliefs on inheriting or being awarded a gift in Spain. (You should now be aware that after Brexit, the UK may be excluded from these areas.)

No one should realistically expect these changes within the short-term; they will likely take several years. This is because EU non-residents cannot vote, the tax office will push back on losing a lucrative source of taxation and a hard-left wing government is not ideologically aligned to implement tax reliefs which would almost completely negate inheritance tax.

With the new change in government in Spain, this will be done presumably at some point in the future. But I stress right now it is not the law.

In the meantime, to benefit in Spain from the ultra-high regional tax reliefs on inheritance & gift tax, you must be EU or EEA resident as this is what our laws demand, at present. For those affected by Brexit, these changes may not come in time. Brexit will be long done and dusted by the time lawmakers amend existing tax laws to adapt them to this key ECJ ruling.

On this website you can choose day, date and time for your appointment, subject of course to availability.
