There have been a number of **security incidents** locally. One restaurant was broken into in Via Park V and a cash register stolen and there was an attempted break-in to a Chinese restaurant in Via Park III.

Nationally, the recent general election **solved nothing**. The PSOE party may now try to form a government with the far-left Unidos Podemos party, but they will still need the support of the minority parties, such as the separatists in Catalonia and the Basque Country, to gain an absolute majority. Otherwise their budget will be limited to the same amount as during the PP last tenure in Congress. As this was then an austerity budget, it will again leave the regions with insufficient funding.


The rise of the **far-right Vox party** in Spain is undoubtedly the single biggest change politically.



The **illegal occupation** of property is on the rise in Spain with 12,214 reported during 2018, that's 33 cases a day. Although the law has been changed to help the owners, it is still a lengthy and costly business to remove the squatters. The most affected province is Barcelona, which with a total of 17,465 cases during the last six years. Repossessed or holiday properties appear to be the target of the squatters, those who leave their property unoccupied for several months being the favourite target. A large increase in cases has also been reported in the city of Alicante. The illegal squatters will often sell the fixtures and fittings of the property. It takes an average of **four to five months** to evict the squatters, which is totally unsatisfactory.

As anticipated in the opinion polls, the **Spanish general election held on November 10 was inconclusive** and did not provide a ruling majority for any party. The acting PM and head of the PSOE socialist party, Pedro Sanchez, gambled on another general election – Spain's fourth in four years – to increase his majority and lead to stable government. Far from increasing it, he lost three seats and 800,000 votes, bringing the total of his deputies in Congress to 120. 176 seats are required to attain a majority in Congress.

The other large left-wing party, Unidos Podemos, secured 35 seats, down seven seats from the earlier general election last April.

The conservative right-wing party Partido Popular – who got a hiding in the April election - increased their seats from 66 seats to 87, now the second largest party.

But the big changes coming from the election was the emergence of Vox, a newish (founded in December 2013) right-wing populist party and the decimation of Spain's only liberal party, Ciudadanos (Citizens). Vox went from 24 seats in April to 52 now, while Ciudadanos went down from 57 seats to just 10, after losing over two and a half million votes since April! Vox are now the third largest party in the country.

But one of the factors that have played most in favour of Vox is that their support to the governments of PP and Citizens in autonomous communities such as Andalusia, Murcia or Madrid banished the fear of the influence of Vox, since it did not involve any move towards their extreme right policies in these regions.

Once again the general election solved nothing in the case of national stability, only highlighting Spain's continuing Left V Right divide with the removal now of the liberal middle political ground.

Acting PM Sanchez will now attempt to form a left-wing government with the help of the far-left party Unidos Podemos, but they will need substantial help from the other smaller parties, particularly the Basque and Catalan nationalist parties to achieve a governing majority. Considering the imprisoned Catalan nationalists this is unlikely. **16 different political parties won seats** in the election. This will lead to what the Spanish call a **Frankenstein government**, and should this fail, it will be another general election in spring 2020! Sometimes democracy can be a pain in the ass!

The owner of British Airways, IAG, has agreed to buy Air Europa for €1bn (£860m) in an attempt **to make Madrid a key aviation hub** that will challenge rivals such as London's Heathrow and Charles De Gaulle in Paris. The acquisition of Spain's third-largest airline is expected to take place in the second half of next year and comes after IAG bought the Irish carrier Aer Lingus in 2015.

The Training Fund fraud hearings in Andalucia continue to move excruciatingly slowly through the courts both the largest frauds in Spain. One of the common issues in the training fraud was that funds from Madrid were meant to be spent on training courses for the unemployed in the region were diverted. The money was never spent on training courses but used by the giant trade union UGT and the socialist regional government for 'other purposes' generally to pay union wages, bonuses, brothel charges and favoured funding projects. During late October it was revealed that the then socialist regional government hid in a drawer a claim ordering the UGT union to repay €18 million in training funding. Since then it has emerged that the UGT actually have to repay €40 million but the then PSOE government left the files in 'administrative limbo' which allows the UGT not to have to return the money. The total amount believed to be fraudulently diverted in the training fund scam alone is believed to exceed €120 million.

Meanwhile, the trial on the massive ERE fraud, has at last come to a head with several jail sentences after a ten year investigation. You can find more on this on page 14. Some of the top politicians there in recent times are now facing long jail sentences.

José Luis Acuña, a marine environmentalist at the University of Oviedo, warns of the impact on sea life of **rising sea temperatures** around the peninsula.. "In the Cantabrian (Northern Spain), where there are more and more days when the temperature is above 20°C, seaweed forests have virtually disappeared in the last 10 years," he says, adding that rising water temperatures are problematic for migratory animals, such as Mediterranean turtles. Another consequence of **warmer sea water** is the arrival of invasive species. "It is possible that populations that do better in warm water will begin to move in. In the Cantabrian we are starting to see fish that are typically from the south," he says. The problem is particularly serious in the Mediterranean areas where there are at least **775 invasive species**, according to recent studies.

A Spanish married couple in La Linea de la Concepcion near Gibraltar have been arrested after allegedly using electric scooters to deliver cocaine around the Campo de Gibraltar. Policia Nacional arrested the pair after a search on their home in La Linea de la Concepcion revealed more than one kilogramme of cocaine and around €5,000 in cash. Known as 'tele-coca' (after Telepizza), the couple would travel to a users' home after receiving an order by telephone. The mode of transport included electric scooters and bicycles. Drop offs were made in busy streets as well as private homes, police said.

"Only 7,000? What a pity. They should have been many more." David Roig, a member of the candidacy for Unidos Podemos who attended the last municipal elections in the Valencian town of Meliana, expressed himself in these terms in response to a report by ABC information on the 7,000 clerics executed by the Left during the Civil War in Spain. The persecution by the Second Republic of the Spanish clergy until 1936 and during the Civil War cost the lives of 4,184 priests, 2,365 friars and 283 nuns.

According to data from the NAR (National Association of Realtors), 35% of home sales in the US are closed without any meaningful discount extracted from the vendor. The same cannot be said of Spain, where an estimated 90% of vendors give ground on price before the sale is closed.

Research of the Spanish market by an outfit called the Spanish International Realty Alliance (SIRA) in collaboration with the NAR, finds that a large majority of vendors in Spain admit to having negotiated a significant discount with the buyers. **Talking of inflated asking prices, "It's almost standard practise,"** explains Francisco Fernández, a director of SIRA, quoted in the Spanish press. "Vendors take it for granted that they will get a counter offer and start off with an asking price that leaves them room for manoeuvre, **in some cases as much as 20% higher."**

Catalan separatists continue to cause chaos with road blockages in the region, the most serious being on the AP7 motorway linking northeastern Spain and southern France. Organised by activist group Democratic Tsunami, it was just the latest operation in an ongoing campaign of protest that began in mid-October when Spain's top court jailed nine separatist leaders over a failed 2017 independence bid. Traffic routes were blocked for more than 48 hours, with many cars and trucks stuck overnight. The demonstration caused chaos on an artery which is particularly important for cross-border freight transport and is used by some 20,000 lorries per day. Although the activists erected barricades which were torched and the police were stoned, only one person was arrested in Spain, the French police arresting more than 20 +. Fresh fruit and vegetable suppliers in Murcia fear a grave loss of earnings after 3,000 lorries from the region had been stuck at the French border following Catalan separatist demonstrations. Each driver is estimated to be losing between €350-500 a day for their respective businesses with other businesses also suffering. At the time of writing the disruptions have been going on for a month and the public's patience has begun to wane. One business manager commented, 'It's a revolution, but a nickel-and-dime one, because Catalonia actually has one of the best living standards in the world. Residents are sick of it. Fortunately the roadblocks are always short, because these revolutionaries are the kind who like to be home in time for a warm meal and a soft bed,' he noted. 'I'd never seen a revolution where the oppressors are the working class from Sant Adrià and the oppressed are the elites.'

According to an official poll by the Catalan regional government, **48.8% of citizens now reject secession from Spain**, compared to 41.9% in favour.

The Civil Guard has dismantled a criminal network led by Albanians, dedicated to passing **immigrants clandestinely** from Spanish ports. Spanish lorry drivers, particularly those from Murcia who carry fruit and veg' to the UK are particularly concerned about the number of 'stowaways' on the lorries and many drivers prefer not to do the route.

The National Police have dismantled the largest marijuana plantation to date in Aragon, with 16,000 plants and a



weight of about 3,500 kilos. Six Albanians were arrested and also charged with 10 robberies in different bars and gas stations in the

province of Huesca. According to the police, to reach the plantation, which was in the middle of a large forest, it was necessary to drive half an hour in off-road vehicles, and another half an hour walk through open paths in the forest.

An analysis of the data in the recent Spanish general election shows that most people in Torrevieja voted for the socialist PSOE, whereas the majority in the municipality of Orihuela voted for the right-wing PP. On the Orihuela Costa itself, most voted for the far-right Vox party. In the whole region of Murcia, more voted for Vox than any other party.

Vox were also the most voted for party in Crevillent, Pilar de la Horadada, Jacarilla, Molina de Segura and San Javier. Vox received 3,640,063 votes nationally - 15.09% of the total vote and are now the third largest party in the country. (More about the Vox party and their aims in future issues.)

Orihuela has **bought 740 new refuse containers** and bins, the first since 2008. As many as 450 were damaged in the September storms. The new bins cost more than €200,000 and will be distributed throughout the municipality.

And speaking of Orihuela, I see that the current mayor of the municipality, Emilio Bascunana, photo, is under preliminary investigation for the alleged crime of



misappropriation of funds from 2007 to 2013. It is alleged that during those years he was paid €50,000 a year by the then PP regional government as a medical advisor to the health department offices in Alicante. That department is now run by

the Socialist party-led coalition, who state that he never attended the place of work in Alicante. If the allegations are confirmed by the health department, the prosecutor will then start an extensive investigation. Mr Bascunana denies the charge. Here in Orihuela Costa we are only too aware that Bascunana is yet another mayor of Orihuela that has done f*ck all for the coastal residents except keep the beaches clean, while the bulk of the revenue gained from the coast is spent in the city of Orihuela.

After seven years of investigation, yes seven, the court case into the alleged fraudulent tender process for the multimillion cleaning and rubbish contract for Orihuela. The trial only started nine months ago and there are 34 defendants - seven councillors and 26 businessmen. The anti-corruption prosecutor insist that there is overwhelming evidence that **two former mayors of the municipality** - Jose Medina and Monica Lorente - rigged the contract. Prison sentences requested by the prosecution range from 37 year for the businessman Sr Fenoll, to 12 years for former mayor Medina and eight years for former mayor Sra Lorente. The verdict is likely early next year.

Opposition party Cambiemos Orihuela pointed out that the former town hall lawyer who did the bulk of the case was fired without any reason by Mayor Bascunana and alleged that the mayor 'chooses to protect corruption rather than expose it defending his political godfathers.'


16 fish farms operating in Alicante this year will produce more than 5,000 tons of fish, 10% more than in 2018, and supply fishmongers and markets scattered throughout the country and in Italy.

In just three month this summer, over **9,000** mattresses have been dumped in Torrevieja. Now that's an average of a hundred a day! Some days up to 300 have been found and this for a registered population of just 85,000!

Local police have warned about the 'massive' **poisoning of cats** in specific areas of Los Montesinos. Police have not released the numbers but have advised dog owners to keep their dogs on a lead, less they too consume the poisoned food.

The wheels of justice in Spain turn very slowly if at all! On October 30, a woman was sentenced to two years in prison for exploiting women for prostitution and drugging them, most of them illegal immigrants, in a villa that ran in Torrevieja, which was advertised as 'Torrevieja VIP 24H'. Problem is the original arrest was made 11 years ago! Two other defendants in the case absconded. It seems the 'working girls' in the villa were kept in 'precarious conditions, subjecting them to rigorous and exhaustive controls and work schedules, in a way that prevented them from leaving for more than two hours a day, appropriating a large part of the money paid by customers and imposing fines on the women for any infringement of the rules imposed on them.' The police also found drugs and cash in the villa. The prison sentence was suspended, conditional on not committing a crime again, and the woman will have to pay a small fine for not entering prison.

Several weeks ago **my mate got arrested** by airport police in Alicante after getting very abusive about the luggage delays. He's still waiting for his case to come up.



The ERE Fraud.

For almost as long as I have been doing the Dream Scene, I have been reporting on the ERE scandal in Andalucia.

The ERE case is the Spanish acronym for a masslayoff plan (expediente de regulación de empleo, or ERE), relates to significant amounts of money meant to assist redundant workers being spent elsewhere.

The scandal broke in 2010 when El Mundo reported that 'miners' were paid hefty redundancy payments in Andalucia, but these 'miners' had never worked in a mine!

Prosecutors estimated that, over a decade, members of the Andalusian socialist administration diverted **680 million euros** in public funds. They say it was discreetly passed on to people and businesses, often with close ties to the Socialist party, some of whom were not affected by layoffs -- which the funds were intended to compensate. The court said there was an "absolute lack of control" in the management of the funds. The following judicial investigation took nine years with 507 people under scrutiny by a series of

Among them two former socialist presidents of the region, José Antonio Griñán and Manuel Chaves, both received jail sentences of six years each and been bared from public office for nine years. You would think it should be a lifetime ban! One of 19 who received an eight year jail sentence was the former Employment minister Javier Guerrero, who helped set up the scheme

which embezzled the money from 2000 to 2009.



CODERE BETTING MACHINE NOW IN!

Okay, as my friends know, I am not a big fan of mobile phones. I do have one but leave it turned off for several weeks. Nevertheless, I dare say most of our readers have one and should find this article from WIRED helpful.

Keep your phone near 50 per cent charge

Charging is the most complex aspect of looking after your phone's battery, and it's useful to have a basic understanding of how the process works.

A phone battery is made up of two layers, one of graphite and the other of lithium cobalt oxide. Energy releases when lithium ions move from the graphite layer to the lithium cobalt oxide layer. Charging up a battery shifts the lithium ions back the other way, preparing the process to start again.

What this tells us is that the real sweet spot for a battery is a 50% charge – when half of the battery's moveable lithium ions are in the lithium cobalt oxide layer and the other half in the graphite layer. This equilibrium puts the least amount of strain on the lithium ions that power your battery, and basically extends the number of charge cycles it can take before degrading. Therefore it's best to keep your your battery between 20 and 80%, and regularly top up with partial charges.

Don't leave your phone on charge overnight

This isn't, as is sometimes claimed, because you're overloading the battery with excess power, but instead because of a mechanism called a 'trickle charge'. This stops the charge when it reaches 100%, and only starts it up again when it falls a bit below 100 (ie your battery won't just stay charged at 100). This is bad for the reasons outlined above — it's another strain you don't want to be putting on those precious lithium ions.

Finally, definitely don't use an unofficial charger – these may not have safety settings that prevent the charger delivering more current to the battery when its full, again damaging those ions. While some chargers will be fine, it really isn't worth the gamble.

Buying a battery case (from a reputable company) is also a good option – this is basically a case that slots onto the back of your phone and contains its own battery, extending the life of yours.

Play around with your phone's settings

First things first, activate your phone's low power mode — this is found under settings of both your iPhone and Android. (On Android, it's called "battery saver mode".) This mode modifies your phone's notification settings, screen brightness and CPU usage, optimising it to reduce energy consumption. Turn off battery intensive features like Bluetooth, Wi-Fi and GPS. These waste battery trying find and connect to Wi-Fi or data networks — not turning these off on a speeding train is particularly grievous. However, when your at home, switch over from 4G to Wifi — the latter has been shown to be 40 per cent less wasteful of battery.

You can also turn on airplane mode outside the airplane if you're not using your smartphone for anything that involves connectivity. If you have airplane mode on and the screen off, the device will only use 5 per cent of its usual energy consumption, compared to 15 per cent when simply placed in idle.

Turning off your LED notification light, keyboard sound, vibration and haptic feedback are all beneficial to battery life. (These are accessed in your phone's sound settings). Finally, delete unused accounts from your phone's memory – these can drain battery too.

Adjust your phone's brightness

It's worth accessing your phone's display settings — manually reducing brightness to suit your surroundings is a fast way to saving battery.

If your phone has one, turn off its adaptive brightness setting – the screen's brightness will change depending on the light around you, something you want to have control of during a battery pinch.

Also, reduce the amount of time you have to leave your phone on for it to go to sleep – the quicker it darkens the screen, the less battery it will be using.

If your smartphone has an OLED display, switching to dark mode or applying coloured wallpapers will also help you save battery life. If you have a traditional LCD display, this won't make a difference unfortunately – OLED pixels generate their own light, so when they're black they don't drain power. LCD screens are instead lit from the edges – it doesn't matter what colour the image is, it will draw the same power.

Keep an eye on your apps

Apps can also be a serious battery strain – under your phone's settings, go into the battery menu. You can see here which apps are draining your battery, turn on "background restriction", "battery optimisation" or fully uninstall those you do not need. Turning off unnecessary notifications will also stop these apps waking your screen. The top battery draining apps are all video streaming apps: Snapchat, Netflix and YouTube, which makes sense, since streaming video is incredibly battery intensive. However, Facebook's App is also a famously big battery drainer – make sure you turn off its notifications, and restrict battery usage and background data.


Finally, always download updates to both your apps and your operating system – these will often optimise battery life.

Stay away from heat

Don't get your battery hot, as high temperatures stress the battery and make it lose capacity. Android Authority reports that: "A cell kept between 25-30 degrees Celsius (77 – 86 degrees Fahrenheit) should retain around 80% of its capacity after the first year even when cycling from empty to full charge."



"Relax," the document concluded, "you have the rest of your life."

The options did not give Mr. Pedersen, who is serving life sentences for murders, much peace, but they did make him chuckle.

A South Korean mortuary is offering people the chance to experience their own "living funerals". The Hyowon

Healing Centre invites members of the public to dress in shrouds, write their last testaments and lie in closed coffins for around ten minutes. More 25,000 than



people have made use of the free service. According to the centre's head, Jeong Yong-mun, the aim is to help them appreciate their lives and reconnect with estranged friends and relatives before it's too late. "We don't have for ever – that's why I think this service is so important. We can apologise and reconcile sooner, and live the rest of our lives happily."

A conductor proved his composure by not missing a beat when his trousers fell down mid-performance. Chinese maestro Muhai Tang was conducting the orchestra of La Scala in Milan at a concert to mark the 70th anniversary of the People's Republic of China recently, when his boxer shorts made an unscheduled

appearance during a powerful brass fanfare. Tang has a

Dream Hills Project Group Update

In order to begin the process Owners were asked via the AGM minutes to contribute suggestions to the project email address. Owners were also asked to contribute via the DreamScene and the Dream Hills Urb. Facebook Group. The Group have received a number of suggestions and ideas from Owners and have discussed them with both the long-term project plan (Voted as a 4 year project at the AGM) and with the short term objective that has been funded for this year.




The Vicar

The Christmas Lottery Launderers

Winning tickets are sought out by crooks looking to avoid paying tax on their ill-gotten gains (This article appeared in El Pais way back in 2015, but it still holds true.)

In the hours after the winning numbers in Spain's massive El Gordo Christmas lottery are drawn every December 22, discreetly dressed men and women carrying suitcases stashed with bank notes fan out across the country headed for bars, lottery outlets, and banks before the fortunate owners of the prized tickets cash them in. Acting on behalf of wealthy clients, their mission is to buy their winning tickets: they pay cash, ask no questions, and offer a generous bonus on top. It's a very simple way to help reduce their clients' tax bill.

"Everybody knows that the Christmas lottery has always been used to launder money," says veteran tax inspector José María Peláez Marcos, adding that it is almost impossible for the authorities to detect this kind of fraud.

"Lottery tickets are untraceable, so unless we are present when they are bought [...] it is pretty much impossible to establish who originally purchased them," he says.

According to Spain's OCU consumer rights organization, winning lottery tickets can be sold on for up to 20 percent more than their value. But the association warns that the seller of a winning lottery ticket will then have the problem of explaining to their bank and the tax authorities how they came into so much money, and may end up being fined.

The odds of buying one of the big winning numbers are one in 100,000 – the amount of El Gordo ticket numbers available – so it's little wonder that the authorities are suspicious when well-known figures such as Carlos Fabra*, photo, the former head of the Popular Party-run



provincial government of Castellón, are photographed holding a winning ticket for the umpteenth time. Fabra, who was jailed for corruption in 2014, won the lottery nine times in 10 years. Gosh! How lucky!

In 2011, another Popular Party (PP) politician, Enrique Crespo, the former mayor of the small town of Manises, in Valencia province, was seen on television toasting his good fortune with his colleagues after winning second prize in the Christmas lottery, although he was unable to say just how many tickets he had. It turned out that the

local PP had bought 850 décimos – or tenth shares in a ticket – with the winning number.

Crespo, who was being investigated for corruption at the time, was summoned by a local magistrate that very day and given 24 hours to explain how many winning tickets he had bought. Crespo admitted he had purchased just one. "The judge was smart and fast," says tax inspector Peláez, noting that this case was very much the exception. Public prosecutors later asked for Crespo to serve a three-year prison term for having allegedly hidden 99 other tenths of the winning number, equivalent to €12.3 million.

But Spain's Christmas lottery is not always the best way to launder money, says Peláez. "You have to bear in mind the amount," he notes. In El Gordo, the maximum prize for a décimo is €400,000. "It's doubtful that this is going to solve the money-laundering problems of somebody involved in criminal activities," says Peláez, adding that it is a more attractive system for somebody who has the equivalent of three or four décimos, which is to say less than €2 million.

"If you want to buy 20 décimos, you have to buy them from a number of different people, and this increases the risk of somebody finding out what you are up to," continues Pérez, pointing out that when it comes to large amounts of money, most people looking to avoid paying tax use other means, such as keeping their money in offshore accounts. But for "those who have a bag full of money at home earned from illegal commissions and bribes, the Christmas lottery is still the simplest way to launder money."

The OCU website warns lottery winners against selling their winning tickets, even when offered generous incentives. The main problem is proving the origin of the money to your bank. If the tax office becomes involved, it can impose heavy fines.

The organization illustrates the dangers with an example: a person with an average annual income of $\in 30,000$ who wins $\in 400,000$ on the Christmas lottery and sells their winning ticket for $\in 450,000$ could face a fine of more than $\in 200,000$.

*Although Fabra received a four-year jail sentence, he only served 16 months. Although businessmen testified that they had paid Fabra millions for political favours, the court felt that the case for bribery was unproven and Fabra was only jailed for defrauding the Treasury of €700,000 in taxes.

What are the measurements of the perfect husband?

82-20-45. That's 82 years old, €20 million in the bank and a 45- degree fever.

How should you reply to a bloke who says: 'Hey, you're just my type.'

'I think you must be mistaken - I have a pulse!'

BRITISH bride-to-be Rachel Doran, waved off her hubby to beand his 30 pals as they headed to Leeds airport on what they thought would be the stag do of a life time in Spain.

However when Chris Mahone and his mates left their local pub in Cumbria and arrived to the airport, they were told there were no flights or hotel bookings under their names.

They soon discovered that Doran (photo), 32, had instead pocketed the £11,160 kitty destined for the three-day trip to Ibiza and had forged a Jet2.com booking form, duping the group into thinking they had everything booked.

The stag trip, on September 6 2017, was scheduled just 10 days before the couple were due to tie the knot.

According to Leeds Live, Doran pleaded guilty on Tuesday to theft and fraud by forging the flight details.

Carlisle Crown Court heard how each of the pals had chipped in £360 each to pay for the trip.

The court heard how Doran suffered three miscarriages in the period leading up to the stag do, and that this may have affected her mental health and behaviour.

She was handed a 15-month jail sentence, suspended for two years.

Factory worker Doran, who now has a new partner, was also sentenced to 240 hours unpaid community work and 20 rehabilitation activity days.

She must also pay £3,600 compensation to be shared between the stag party.

Judge Nicholas Barker told her: "On the face of it you have acted in a deceitful and callous way. You must have known the theft would be found out and the world would come falling down around you.

"You did all this at a time you were preparing for your marriage."

Mahone's lawyer Gerard Rogerson previously told the court how the pair had known each other since school and that he had proposed on September 13 2015.

The group arrived at the airport at 5am when they discovered

the gutting news.

Rogerson said: "It was then it dawned on Mr Mahone what was going on and he realised no bookings were made.

"Paperwork was produced including a Jet2 confirmation form. When it was looked at it became clear it was a fake document."

The court then heard how when

Mahone tried to ring Doran, she did not pick up the phone.

When she rang back later saying she wanted to talk, he told her he wanted 'nothing to do with her'.

Rogerson added: "He then received a text message stating, erroneously, she was pregnant."

Mahone told the court: "The whole experience has left me embarrassed. I trusted her, I loved her at the time and put all of my trust in her. I've lost confidence, I find it difficult to talk to women because I'm scared of getting hurt.

"I feel sorry Rachel took others' hard-earned money too."

Kim Whittlestone, representing Doran, detailed how she had tragically suffered three miscarriages in just 14 months.

"The impact on her mental health was significant," Whittlestone said.

"It's clear they did have an impact on her state of mind. One can only assume as a result of these pressures she behaved in the way she did."

"This is a devastating case for all involved."

Spanish Prescription Sheets.

If you are benefiting from the Spanish health system, you will shortly notice a change to the normal dating information on your prescription sheet.

Until now if a doctor had prescribed some medicines for you and they appeared on your list with a particular date, if you didn't go to the chemist and take out that particular drug within 10 days of that date, it expired.

From now on, specified dates to collect the drugs do not now appear on the prescription covering sheet. This means that chronic drugs do not expire and you can go to the chemist/pharmacy and draw a fresh supply of a drug, when you only have a handful of them left.

It is fair to say that this new system is causing confusion, not only with older patients but also with the doctors themselves. The local pharmacist staff appear to be the fount of knowledge on this, so speak to them. I did but am still no clearer!

Problems booking an appointment with your doctor in Spain?

If you have an SIP card, go to the pharmacy half-way down the Los Altos hill and they will do it for you.

However, it is very easy for you to do it online also.

On this website you can choose day, date and time for your appointment, subject of course to availability.


