It is fair to say that it has been an eventful month here in Spain. While the Covid-19 rates in Madrid, Catalonia and a handful of other regions have been ballooning, the massive influx of Spaniards from the regions to the coastal areas of Spain during late July and the whole of August, have brought an unwelcome and worrying increase in the virus cases locally. A recent medical survey in the Vega Baja area revealed that after a recent random testing **40% of those who tested positive** for the virus had come from outside the region. As I write this on August 22, the province of Alicante as experienced 143 positives in the last 24 hours, whereas the region of Valencia has had 483 during the same periods.

Two freebie newspapers or advertisers, the Euro Weekly News and the Costa Blanca People caused **some consternation locally** with some unconfirmed reports. The former reported that Spain was planning to introduce a three-phased lockdown during September and had discussed the introduction with the UK's PM, Boris Johnson.

The latter reported that all bars which did not provide food, i.e. ones without a kitchen, would be closed within 24 hours for a period of 21 days. Both claims were found to be untrue. Whereas Spain is unlikely to introduce another lockdown – which **would be disastrous** for an already shattered economy – there is no doubt that when the Spaniards and others return to their own areas in September, some form of local

Appointments with local GP's in some areas can now **take up to 20 days!** Going online at Yo Salud, it is much easier to update prescriptions etc., by emailing your Spanish GP direct.

The noise from a **pile-driving machine** preparing groundworks for a new Aldi supermarket close to Dream Hills 2 managed to drive everybody nuts for a couple of weeks. Thankfully it is now stopped.


A four-year-old boy of Belgian nationality, **drowned** in a swimming pool in Quesada on the evening of August 8. It seems the family and relatives were distracted and left the child on his own. Then a two-year-old boy drowned in the Sonia urbanisation pool in La Zenia on August 9. The French family of seven had just returned from the beach when the child went missing. Unfortunately this type of tragedy is repeated all too often, not only in Spain but worldwide.

Orihuela has at last stepped on the accelerator in terms of the granting of **construction licenses**. After years with unbearable blockades when many applications were waiting up to a year. The reorganization and the increase in staff with the incorporation of auxiliaries and the consolidation of some interns (including several architects) in the Urbanism area is paying off. On August 3, the green light was given to the construction of 237 homes, all in Orihuela Costa where real estate activity is concentrated in the municipality. Licenses for the construction of 11 swimming pools on Panticosa and Lago Sanabria streets locally were also granted.

About 8,000 tons of ammonium nitrate, the fertilizer that destroyed part of Beirut, enters through the port of Alicante each year from where it is immediately moved to a company located in the Babel neighbourhood industrial estate. They distribute it as fertilizer for the agriculture in the Community and in neighbouring Murcia and Castilla-La Mancha, among other destinations. The unloading from the ships is supervised by firefighters. However, the conditions for its unloading and transport pass because the material has the certificate of non-detonability and because the percentage of nitrate does not exceed 30%. The higher the concentration, the greater the risk of burning and detonation. Easy accessibility to this type of fertilizer makes it a favourite with terrorist organisations worldwide.

A baby of only nine months has been admitted to the Marina Salud Hospital in Dénia, after being **intoxicated with cocaine and cannabis** during an adult birthday party in a rented chalet in Calp. The little one is now out of danger, but the Department of Equality and Inclusive Policies has requested that the child not return to the family at present. It was reported that the baby put the remains of tobacco and cigarettes left on the floor in his mouth. I think this is unlikely. The baby had significant amounts of cocaine and cannabis in his body, so the doctors decided to leave him hospitalised.

Tobacconists on the Costa Blanca say they've **had a bad year for sales** as travel restrictions have slashed their main customer base, which



could force some of them to close. The province's tobacconists invoice 55 million euros less than in the first half of 2019.....does not believe that smokers have quit during this

period, at least not in any significant proportion . It does note, however, that there has been a small percentage of substitution of cigarettes and combustion products by vapers and other tobacco systems. There are many tobacconists on the coast that depend 95% on tourism, " explains Sergio Sánchez, secretary general of the Alicante Association of Tobacconists. "If this situation continues, many will have to sell the license, " he adds.

A 41-year-old woman was arrested on the morning of August 17 at her apartment on Régulo Street, **La Florida, for allegedly stabbing** a 65-year-old man who was with her at the time. She then called SAMU reporting that the man had a heart attack. The man was dead upon their arrival but the knife wounds they later reported as superficial.

#### **MORE LOCAL NEWS**

As was expected, the pandemic has taken its effect on the property market sales. Nationally, for the month of June, **property sales fell** by 34.3% compared to the same month last year. For the Valencia region, the fall was 43.9% but the decrease in sales in the Alicante Province was 45.6%, from 3,105 during June 2019 to 1,688 during June 2020. Obviously, the economic effects of the lockdown, lack of flights and absence of foreign buyers were the main contributors.

A fire started in an abandoned warehouse on the



road connecting Almoradi and Dolores at 4:45am on the morning of Sat' August 8. Problem also was there was a **large marijuana plantation** inside and some dodgy wiring caused the lot to ....go up in smoke! The three emergency firefighting

units which attended appeared to be, well..... quite happy with it all!

A short circuit started a fire in a house during the

early hours, one August morning in Murcia. The two older residents, a 72-year-old man and a 65-year-old woman, were woken by the **barking of their dog** (photo), and managed to vacate the house together with their children and grandchildren. After being treated for smoke inhalation, everybody was able to return to the house. The dog's name is Desil. Hero!



The Alicante Province demands **14 new courts** to avoid the current saturation of outstanding court cases which are in their thousands. This is most unlikely to happen. It would mean introducing a certain level of efficiency to the legal system!

The Guardia Civil have **seized almost 12 tons of sea bream and seabass** from a well-known fish farm in Guardamar del Segura. The origion of the fish was labelled as Spanish when it was Turkish! The expiration dates were also changed. The fish were located in a warehouse and three supermarkets.

The decision of the Valencian Ministry of Equality and Inclusive Policies to eliminate the PCR test for admissions in nursing homes has unleashed a wave of criticism from doctors, workers and family members, who consider that with this measure, which in their opinion is based on an attempt to reduce costs, increases the risk of coronavirus infections. Fortunately, the national government in Madrid have just heard this and have immediately overruled the left-wing regional government's stupid decision. Now, in social health centres or nursing homes, it will be mandatory to carry out PCR on new admissions with a maximum delay of 72 hours and on employees returning from absences or vacation periods. When you think of the hundreds of millions of euros now being ploughed in to the Valencian region, their earlier action was dumb, miserly and dangerous.

**Eight nursing homes** in the province of Alicante were hit by the virus during just the first week of August. Its rapidity was alarming. Visits and exits to and from the homes have been banned. There are also cases of coronavirus in eight other residences in the province of Valencia.

A brothel in the Costa Blanca has been closed down as at least four people there had contracted Covid-19. There has been a problem trying to contact the clients -some of whom are married - as there is a reluctance to come forward. And the name of the town - Cox, I kid you not!

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#### The Growing Menace of Squatting in Spain!

In the August issue, I included a short paragraph concerning the national problem of squatting in Spain. However, it is interesting that, at least in the Balearics, there is some improvement in the situation. In the city of Palma, there were 190 cases of illegal occupation in the city dawdling in the courts. One owner caught the squatter throwing his belongings and furniture onto the street but could do nothing, nor could the police, until the matter went through a judicial maze!

In another case an octogenarian woman had left her home for a few days for health reasons, returned to find it occupied by a stranger. The stranger said he had a contract and would not allow the woman in! The poor woman had to file a complaint and was waiting a year for a decision. This particular case led the Chief Prosecutor of the Balearic's to issue a new pioneering instruction to the police. This gave the police legal coverage for the immediate and judicial eviction of an illegally occupied house as long as the crime is blatant. Only if there is doubt that a crime has been committed should a judge be consulted. This is still not a watertight response as many squatters say they have a contract albeit a dodgy one from the mafias who take the houses and insert a tenant who pays them rent. Contracts are also handwritten on the fly at the same time that the Police knocked on the door of the home. The inclusion of minors in the squats also complicates matters.

Now, why is this practice not extended to other regions and the police authorised accordingly? Basically, because they couldn't be arrsed!

Many of you will be aware that the three-time Wimbledon tennis champion Boris Becker has been



declared bankrupt by a London court. His palatial mansion in Mallorca, photo, including pool and tennis court was seized by the court.

While the mansion was empty, it was occupied by four Germans who stayed there for two years. When they were eventually evicted, they were ordered to pay a fine of just €480, which was never paid!

Squatters in Spain are indulged by the law, which seems to take more care of them than owners. Squatters also now have friends in high places. Ada Colau, the Mayoress of Barcelona, is a former squatter activist, and the hard-left Vice President of Spain, Pablo Iglesias has made a big show of sitting down with squatter activist groups to discuss housing policy. Though the Spanish Right recently proposed changing the law to clamp down on squatters, as things stand they are treated softly by Spanish law, and except for the Balearics, that's unlikely to change whilst the hard-left are in power.

Take a look at this detached property in Alicante, on the 'golden mile' of Playa de San Juan. During the early winter of 2018,

Ivaylo, Pavlina and their two children broke into and occupied the house. They then hooked up to the water and electricity from the street. As it was winter, the owner had returned back to Madrid and only became aware when the neighbours informed him. Two other couples moved in to the squatted house for the summer.



When the police called the squatters produced a spurious rental contract, saying that they had paid rent of  $\notin 12,500$ . However, there were no bank accounts evident. Meanwhile, as the courts dragged on, the owner had to pay  $\notin 1,151$  each year for the IBI tax as well as not being allowed to enter his property!

After two years the squatters were only now turfed-out this July and fined a total of  $\notin$  540 -  $\notin$  270 each! But they can't pay this as they are insolvent.

Dolly Parton One of the far and occasionally **looney Left** parties of Spain, Podemos, is to get a new HQ in Madrid at a cost of two million euros. No problem paying for that as the **public subsidies** the party receives amount to 7.2 million euros. The agent, who organised the sale/purchase received a commission of €72,000, is the aunt of the party head, Pablo Iglesias. Gosh! What a coincidence! The political party has, in the past, received substantial funding from, of all places, Venezuela!

Dramatic situations have been experienced during recent days on numerous beaches in the province of Alicante. As confirmed by the Red Cross, a total of **79 people have reached the Alicante coast in six boats** from North Africa in just twelve hours. Members of the Civil Guard and Local Police intercepted the vessels in Benidorm, La Vila Joijosa, Santa Pola, Teulada, Calp and Alicante. Among all of them were six minors and one of them was a ninemonth-old baby. According to the care provided by the NGO, all the people were in good health and claimed to be of Algerian nationality.

There have been **several other boatloads** arriving and intercepted throughout the Costas. One boatload of around 17 people were intercepted off our local coastline, seven of which were tested positive for Covid-19. The seasonal good weather has encouraged many to make the trip from North Africa. One of the illegal immigrants has described his journey, its costs and consequences. This is detailed on **Page 32** of this issue and is worth reading. The Health Dept detected high levels of Covid-19 in the wastewater of 28 areas of Madrid. The information collected through samplings in the sewer networks and treatment plants will now be linked to the appearance of infections in those locations.

In the Chinese city of Shenzhen, traces of coronavirus have been found in samples of a batch of frozen chicken wings **imported from Brazil**, local press reported. Consequently, all related personnel who may have touched the product in question have also had to undergo tests, which so far have been negative. In the Chinese city of Wuhu, they found traces of coronavirus in the packaging of shrimp imported **from Ecuador**, while in the port city of the province of Shandong, in the east of the country, remains were detected in the packaging of frozen fish.

#### **Don't Forget the Mosquitos!**

As we are all - or should be - taking the recommended precautions when dealing with the Covid-19 outbreaks, it is easy to forget about the mosquito menace. Unfortunately, the warmer climates attract not only tourists but also a host of unwelcome pests. The Tiger mosquito is now flourishing in the warmer parts of Spain and a bite from one of these little devils is often much more than just an itchy nuisance.

Whereas malaria outbreaks do not appear at this stage to be a problem in Spain, both El Pais and El Mundo have been carrying disturbing reports of a new menace in Andalucia. The West Nile virus, which is transmitted via mosquito bites, has led to an outbreak of viral meningoencephalitis in Seville, in Spain's most southern region. This is a condition that simultaneously resembles meningitis and encephalitis. As I write this on August 22, a total of 39 people have been infected with the Nile virus, of which eight are in the Intensive Care Unit. Two, aged 85 and 77, have since died. The total number of cases associated with this virus in the province of Seville, between probable and confirmed, is 39, while 19 are fully confirmed as carriers of the disease.

The West Nile virus can also affect birds, horses, and other mammals. During the month of August, the Andalucian Junta has detected four cases of Nile fever in horses, two in the province of Huelva, one in Jerez de la Frontera



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#### ABANDONED PETS ON THE INCREASE AGAIN

The number of abandonment's of pets has increased during the final period of confinement due to the Covid-19 pandemic and represents an increase of 25% compared to the same dates last year, according to data from the Royal Canine Society of Spain (RSCE).

The beginning of the 'new normal', coinciding with the beginning of summer, has caused an increase in abandonments, since many households cannot or will not assume the cost of caring for a pet or the responsibility that comes with maintaining the welfare of an animal.

In Spain **around 138,000 pets are abandoned annually** and, although dogs and cats represent the majority, it should be remembered that every year the number of abandonment's of rodents, birds, turtles and even fish, which are left in gardens and in ponds in major cities, according to data from the Affinity Foundation.

Certainly, the number of abandoned pets in the coastal areas increases each year by the end of August, when the out-of-town holidaymakers return to their own homes elsewhere in Spain.

If you are prescribed your pills and medicines by a GP, these will always be the generic and cheaper version but no less effective.

Unfortunately, if you will be buying the tablets yourself, unless you state "generic", many pharmacies will sell you the more expensive ones - particularly if you are a tourist or non-Spanish. In the case of many common drugs such as Omeprazal, Paracetamol, Ibuprofen etc.,

these are often at least twice or three times more expensive than the generic ones, with fewer in the packet. Despite all the smiles and white coats, remember that pharmacies are businesses like any other and if you have the misfortune to be served by one of the business owners, look them straight in the eye and state "generic"!

#### FLU

The influenza vaccination campaign in the Valencian Community (ours) will be advanced to the month of October, as confirmed by information in Public Health sources, who have still not yet given a definite start date. This decision is in any case an advance compared to last 2019, since then it began on November 4, when no one yet knew what the Covid was, which is the main cause for this advance. The aim is to avoid confusing one disease with the other and to reduce the number of hospitalisations. Public health professionals have one clear message: Get your flu vaccine, and get it early. In most countries they're expecting an increased demand for flu vaccines because of the pandemic. Both diseases impact the respiratory tract, so a person who contracts a relatively mild case of Covid-19 could then wind up in the hospital if they catch the flu shortly after, even if normally they'd be able to fight off the flu at home. Getting your flu shot early also helps vaccine administrators avoid bottlenecks of high demand for the flu vaccine while they're also giving Covid-19 vaccines when they become available-which is realistically some time next year at the very earliest.

BREXIT Update: People currently in receipt of welfare benefits will continue to receive these for life irrespective of the outcome of BREXIT negotiations at the end of 2020.

#### Its possible that after 31st December 2020 new benefit applications will not be allowed.

Attendance Allowance is a benefit for people in receipt of a UK state pension and who may need extra help to stay independent at home, due to an illness or disability.

You could get: £58.70 or £87.65 a week if you need help both in the day and at night.

Completing the lengthy form, you need to show that you need help at home or someone to keep an eye on you. This can include help such as getting out of bed, help to wash and dress.

#### New High Court ruling will force the Spanish Tax Authorities to be better behaved

Many long term residents in this country will be well aware of the power and ruthlessness of the Spanish Hacienda. They can take late payment fines etc., from your bank account and other payment tricks without any prior permissions or approvals. Fortunately, a recent court case has eased some of their aggressive behaviours a little.

In late July this year, the Spanish High Courts passed judgement on a case preventing the Spanish Tax Authorities (Hacienda Pública) from taking action against people and companies before any ruling has been handed down, in cases where an appeal has been filed. Previous to this judgement (number 586/2020), handed down on May 28th, Hacienda used to start the execution process against people deemed debtors by Hacienda, even if court proceedings were still ongoing to establish if the Tax Authorities were right or not.

The only way to stop them grabbing your assets before a court ruling in their favour was to apply for a stay of execution at the time of lodging an appeal; in other words, if you didn't want your assets to be seized by the Spanish Tax Authorities, you had to ask them not to seize them in advance. But this meant Hacienda would be violating a important constitutional right, as per the Spanish Constitution (article 24). The reason Hacienda could get away with this sneaky trick is because of a Spanish practise

known as Silencio Administrativo, or 'Administrative Silence', which denotes a public authority's failure to respond to a request, petition or appeal, resulting in a passive decision in itself: positive or negative. The original intention of Silencio Administrativo was to prevent things from collapsing into stagnation on account of inaction by some level of the public administration. However, it seems that Hacienda has been considering this "no ruling" as a "go-ahead" for debt execution. So, for example, if hacienda thought you owed them money for undeclared rental income, before this ruling, they would go ahead and pursue you on the basis of Administrative Silence, without waiting for a firm judgement of any appeals process.

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Now, however, potential debtors can breathe a sigh of relief, because it has been decided that Hacienda cannot act against them until a final ruling is on the table. In cases where they have the right to appeal, they are now entitled to a firm ruling on appeal before Hacienda can start handing out fines, and seizing assets. So, from now on, potential debtors must considered innocent until found guilty, as stated in the above-mentioned article 24 of the Spanish Constitution. And, to my knowledge, no penalty is allowed to be imposed on innocent individuals.

#### Just an Observation.....

There is some science showing that past exposure to common-cold coronaviruses might be playing a protective role for some people during the Covid-19 pandemic.. This is a big claim — and I should caution that it is not fully resolved — but several studies are now showing that 20 to 50% tof people who had never been exposed to the novel coronavirus have immune cells — known as memory T cells — in their body that react to this new virus. The speculation is that this is due to prior exposure to common-cold coronaviruses. We still don't know why some people fare better than others, or why a few spread the disease to many while others do not spread it at all, but these findings might hold some answers to those questions. We know so little about this terrible virus.

Last month we looked at the reg's for taking a pet from the UK to the EU after Jan' 1, 2021, if the UK becomes an unlisted

But going the other way should be easier, because the UK has stated that for the moment it will continue to accept Pet Passports. Your Pet Passport and microchip information will be

checked at the border. Tapeworm requirements for dogs will not change from the current system.

Good news for people who are resident in an EU country, as their waiting time for travel after the rabies test is slightly shorter - instead of waiting three months after a successful test they only need to wait 30 days, as long as the test is carried out in an EU country.

If you don't have the correct paperwork your pet could be put into quarantine for up to four months or they might be refused entry if you travelled by sea, and you will be held responsible for any fees or charges.

The above rules apply for all unlisted countries, which the UK will become automatically if an arrangement it not reached before December 31st. If the UK does gain listed status, the restrictions are lighter and the waiting times after rabies tests are generally shorter.



#### 32 Madrid's Unclaimed Bodies

The Community of Madrid has been holding onto the bodies of 59 who died of Covid-19 in



the municipality of Madrid during April this year.

Unfortunately, **no** one has claimed any of the bodies yet. The Community has now put aside €134,000 for the burials. Rather than placing all the

unclaimed bodies in one plot, it has been decided to allocate a niche for each cadaver, photo. The bodies will be held in the niches for a period of 10 years to allow relatives to claim them.

#### British Emigrants on the up!

The number of British nationals emigrating to other EU countries has risen by 30% since the Brexit referendum, with half making their decision to leave in the first three months after the vote, research has found.

Analysis of data from the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) and Eurostat shows that migration from Britain to EU states averaged 56,832 people a year in 2008-15, growing to 73,642 a year in 2016-18.

While the withdrawal agreement signed in January enshrines the residency, work and social rights of EU citizens in the UK and Britons in the rest of the bloc, it failed to guarantee the free movement rights of British migrants, restricting future employment and residency prospects in other member states.

The biggest jump in migration **was to Spain**, where an estimated 380,000 British nationals live. Registration has not been essential in the country so many have lived there without being included in official Spanish immigration data, with an average of just 2,300 a year registering as migrating to the country between 2008 and 2015. After the referendum, this jumped fivefold, with 21,250 registrations in the two years between 2016 and 2018.

#### Human Trafficking - Orihuela

A 28-year-old Moroccan man walked into a police station in Orihuela. He complained that he had been beaten and kicked by a people trafficking gang. Police took the man to hospital for treatment and as his story unfolded, many details of human trafficking to Spain from North Africa came to light.

The youngest of five siblings he decided to go to Europe to be able to send money to his family. While in Morocco, he met a man who was involved in irregularly transferring people from Morocco to Spain. The trip would be made by boat and they offered to take him to Spain for a total price of €5,000. Half of the amount had to be paid before making the trip, while the other €2,500 would be paid as soon as he could work in Spain. Then in September last year, he was contacted and told the trip would begin shortly and was instructed to go to the El Oudaya river area, in Morocco. He was not to bring any documentation or mobile phone on the trip. He appeared at the indicated point with the agreed money and was given a telephone number in Spain with which he had to contact so that they could pick him up after reaching the peninsula. He travelled to Spain together with 20 other people in a wooden boat with a small outboard motor. Three people with little nautical knowledge piloted the boat with the help of a compass and their intention was to also stay in Spain. The lack of skill of the pilots caused them to get lost and it took more than three days to reach the Cadiz coast! When they reached the coast the police were waiting for them. They were taken to a police station and later released. He phoned the contact number provided in Morocco and a van arrived to pick up him and another and take them to Orihuela. He was reminded on the trip that he still owed  $\notin 2,500$ . While in Orihuela he managed to pay a further €500, but in June this year he was approached by members of the gang who demanded payment of the remaining €2,000. As he couldn't pay right then, they beat him up, took what money he had and stole his mobile phone as well. Police arrested three Moroccans who were charged and later released and good luck in finding them for the court case!

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
